FEARGHAL HOGAN Q&A: 'I LOVE TRADING HORSES YOU CAN DREAM IN THIS GAME'

One of the youngest consignors in the business, Fearghal Hogan has enjoyed some brilliant pinhooking results under his own Churchland Stud banner and at just 33 years of age, he can boast something that the majority in this business can only ever aspire to achieve, through his joint-ownership of Group 1 winner Laws Of Indices.

The County Carlow native is refreshingly honest about the fact he found the going tough at the yearling sales in 2024, opens up about some of his biggest touches in the game and shares plans for recent stallion acquisition Inns Of Court (GB) in the first TDN Europe Q&A of the winter.

How do you reflect on the year?

I'll be completely straight with you, I only had an okay year-not as good as the past three or four years. I don't know what that was down to. I've only been consigning horses for four or five years now and, while we have sold some good horses, it is still hard to compete with the bigger outfits. Cont., p3

WATHNAN RACING BREAKING NEW GROUND IN BREEDING by Emma Berry

There can have been no ignoring the explosive entrance of the Emir of Qatar's Wathnan Racing to the European racing scene in particular over the last 18 months.

The 2023 Royal Ascot winners Courage Mon Ami (GB) (Frankel {GB}) and Gregory (GB) (Golden Horn {GB}) gave advance warning as to what was to unfold in the ensuing period, with their victories respectively in the G1 Gold Cup and G2 Queen's Vase coming on their first starts in the Wathnan silks after being bought privately from their owner-breeders, Anthony Oppenheimer and Philippa Cooper.

There have been plenty more high-profile purchases since then, notably Kind Of Blue (GB) (Blue Point {Ire}), who won the G1 Qipco Champions Sprint on his first run for Wathnan Racing, and Classic winner Fallen Angel (GB) (Too Darn Hot {GB}), who has made two starts for Wathnan since winning the Irish 1,000 Guineas in May.

There was a tightening in the market. It may not have looked like there was after Book 1 and 2 and even the Orby, but I know there was a tightening. When there is a bit of a correction to the market happening, it can be easier for the bloodstock agents to go back to the consignors that they've had success with in the past. That's something I found at the yearling sales this year. I also didn't have sire power. I brought nice horses to the sales but they were by horses that may not be the most fashionable. I'm a divil for doing that–buying the horse first and the page second. I had an Australia (GB) colt in Book 1 for example. I thought he was a belter–he is a first foal out of a black-type mare. But he only made 95,000gns and cost me €72,000 as a foal. I'd say if he was by something sexier, he'd have made a lot of money. When you are selling yearlings, sire power is a massive part of it.

You say that, but the one thing I took from Book 2 was the amount of different sires who had horses selling for 500,000gns or more. A colt by Territories (Ire), for example, made 750,000gns.

But Territories is a good sire. He's exactly the type of sire I'd like to buy a foal by. But you go and try to buy a nice Territories, it will cost you plenty of money. I'd buy one all day long.

I got out this year but didn't make any money. You see, I'd be kind of old-fashioned in my ways. I don't really buy sprinters. I prefer to buy back-end middle-distance types and I don't mind putting horses in training either. If they didn't run at two for me, it wouldn't be the end of the world at all. The real money in this game is for those mile-plus horses and, if you have patience, it can be rewarding.

What was it about setting up your own consignment and pinhooking that appealed to you in the first place?

I'd no experience working on a farm at home or anything like that. My parents ran a pub in Carlow town and I just started working on a farm close to home and it just took off from there. I spent time in England, worked here at Goffs with Andrew Nolan in the property department because I actually studied auctioneering and valuations in college. But the first few horses I bought, I got lucky and had a few touches. It took off from there.

What touches did you get?

A few cheap foals I bought went on and made decent money as yearlings. I was giving three or four grand for foals and getting 16 and 17 grand for them as yearlings. I thought it was easy, but of course it wasn't. I loved trading horses from the start and I still do. Cont.

Laws Of Indices | Goffs

It's probably hard to buy those cheaper foals these days with the way the whole game has gone.

No, those days are finished. Gone. You can't do that anymore. There's just no bottom to the market. I think the bottom of the market is completely gone.

It's so expensive to keep a horse in training that, with stagnant levels of prize-money, people probably don't want the fun horse anymore.

Most of my luck has come from horses in training. We had a filly in training with Willie McCreery called Come September (Ire) (Roderic O'Connor {Ire}) and she won first time out at Gowran Park and got sold afterwards. Shortly after that, we had a horse called Laws Of Indices (Ire) (Power {GB}), who Ken Condon trained to win a Group 1 for us. It's a funny business model but, for me, I think it's the best business model there is.

It's the ultimate test when you put them in training.

It's the ultimate test and you might go through five, six or seven horses before you get a good one but, when you do, it's brilliant. That's my favourite part of the game, having horses in training. Everyone thinks I'm mad. I don't breeze horses. Anything yearling I buy, I put them into training.

You're plucky. Every time I open up the calendar I see you down for owning bits and pieces of a new horse nearly every week!

I'm lucky in that I'm friendly with a few trainers. I was very lucky with Ken, Willie and I've a good few horses with John and George Murphy as well. They are top-class operators. Mark Fahey is another man I have a few horses with. He's a very shrewd man. He's probably still a bit underestimated actually.

Tell me a bit more about Laws Of Indices. That's some story.

Andrew Nolan and his wife Charlotte, Martin Walsh, Dermot Farrington and Viv Noone owned the horse with me. Charlotte was at the sales at Goffs one day and rang me to say she'd found one. I was working in England at the time and said that I'd take him no problem. I can't take any credit for finding him or anything like that. He won his maiden on his second start, went on to win the Railway Stakes, and then he went on to win the Group 1 Prix Jean Prat after that. We sold half of him to continue his career in Australia and he did well down there. He was the horse of a lifetime for me and got me going. Between him and Come September, they got me up and running. Now, I have gone through a good few of them since but I don't mind that because, when you do hit on one, you can get well paid. I love that you can buy a foal or a yearling for reasonable money in this game and, in a year's time, you don't know where you could be. You have a chance of making a lot of money for a relatively small investment and that's the bit I love about this game. You can dream.

You had some good touches in the ring last year.

Yes, George Murphy, Gary Dowling and myself sold a Galiway (GB) colt for 145,000gns at the Somerville Sale. We bought him for \le 27,000 as a foal. I'd a good result with a Saxon Warrior (Jpn) colt at the Orby this year as well. I gave \le 8,000 for him as a foal and got \le 50,000 as a yearling so that was decent going. But the Galiway was very special because it took place around the time of Gary's father's anniversary. There was a lot of emotion surrounding that and we were all delighted for Gary,

What yearlings did you buy to put into training this year?

I bought an Invincible Spirit (Ire) filly out of Gorane (Ire) (Dream Ahead) for 15,000gns and I thought she was good value. Gorane was quite a good filly for Henry de Bromhead and Clipper and I can remember her from my time spent down with Joe Foley at Ballyhane Stud. I bought into a Havana Grey (GB) as well and then there are a few yearlings who I didn't bring to the sales so there's five or six to look forward to there.

I didn't realise you worked at Ballyhane. You've crammed a lot in.

Michael and Ruth Foley, who ran the farm close to my home in Carlow, taught me a lot. Then Joe and Jane Foley were very good to me at Ballyhane as well. As I mentioned, Andrew Nolan was also good to me in Goffs. I used to work the yearling sales with Dermot Farrington and learned plenty doing that. He is a brilliant judge--one of the best in the game. When you go through some of his big-name purchases, they are actually quite cheap with respect to what they went on to achieve on the track. He's great fun to be around and was a great man to learn from. He looks at things differently to a lot of people and has huge success. That's one thing I learned from him, the ability to buy a good horse by sires who may have gone cold.

What drives you out of bed in the morning?

I just love horses and love working with them. But I suppose my favourite thing to do is go racing. The lads give me awful abuse but, I could go racing three or four days a week, especially in the summer when there's evening racing. I love it. I don't mind having a bet either. We've had a few touches at that down through the years as well. We backed a horse that Mark Fahey trained during Covid--66s, 33s, those sort of prices. That was some day.

How did you get to know Mark? He's clearly a very good

I was introduced to Mark through another good friend of mine, Richie Scahill. Richie had horses with Mark for years and had a lot of luck with him. Richie's father, Dessie, is obviously the legendary commentator, and he actually buys some foals with us every year. Dessie loves the game and it's great having him involved.

You have a lot of clients and consign horses on behalf of a lot of breeders. How are the smaller breeders reacting to the recent sales and have many of those breeders shared whatever plans they might have for the future?

A lot of smaller breeders will be pulling back. But the way the thing is gone, there are probably 10 sires that you'd like to use, but they are not affordable to the smaller breeder. The rest of the sires are probably okay but they're not commercial so some breeders have a bit of a dilemma to face. I have a few mares in partnership with friends but I just let them pick the sires.

I'd be looking at it with the view of trying to produce a racehorse whereas they might be more commercially minded. You'd probably go broke trying to do it my way as a breeder so that's why I let them decide the matings. There is a big difference between breeding a racehorse and a sales horse.

You've got a lot of friends in the industry. There are some great success stories of young people making a go of it, including yourself, in the bloodstock game.

It's a brilliant game. I'd be very close with George Murphy, who I already mentioned, and Jerry Horan as well. Actually, Jerry and I bought Inns Of Court during the summer of Tally-Ho Stud. We bought him on behalf of an Iranian client and we're not quite sure what we're going to do with him yet. We could stand him in France. I think he's an underrated sire and has a very good end to this season. Our client is very happy so hopefully he's something to look forward to.

Wathnan Racing, cont. from p1

The ambition is clear: to be associated with top-class racing prospects, whether acquired as horses in training, or at the breeze-ups or yearling sales. The next logical step is for Wathnan Racing to branch out as Wathnan Breeding, especially when one considers some of the fillies and mares either currently in training or recently retired or purchased.

Official word from the Wathnan camp is that the emphasis is very much on the racing for now, and that after all is where the real fun is to be had.

But amid the stallion announcements this week came the news that Isaac Shelby (GB), who had been the first runner for Wathnan Racing in Europe when running an agonisingly close

d in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains of 2023, would be standing as a stallion next year. The son of Night Of Thunder (Ire) will be at Newsells Park Stud, where Wathnan Racing also now boards some mares.

"He's a fine horse by a very special young stallion and we'll be very keen to see all his offspring when they come to market," said Richard Brown, Wathnan's racing manager, in a press release issued by Newsells Park Stud on Tuesday.

Along with Fallen Angel, Wathnan Racing is now listed as the owner of another two of Steve Parkin's good broodmare prospects, according to Weatherbys' recently published Return of Mares. Romantic Proposal (Ire), winner of the G1 Flying Five in the Clipper Logistic colours when trained by Eddie Lynam, and the dual Group 2 winner Dramatised (Ire) are both listed as having been covered by Wootton Bassett (GB) this year for Wathnan Racing.

The latter was mated for the first time earlier this year, while Romantic Proposal produced her first foal, a colt by Dubawi (Ire), in January, bred by Parkin's Branton Court Stud.

Among other potential broodmare prospects for Wathnan Racing are the G3 Fred Darling Stakes winner Remarquee (GB) (Kingman {GB}), whose two-year-old half-sister Revoir (GB) (Study Of Man {Ire}) recently made an eye-catching debut at Nottingham. Then there's Leovanni (Ire) (Kodi Bear {Ire}), who was one of four winners for Wathnan Racing at this year's Royal Ascot when landing the G2 Queen Mary Stakes.

Since Bolthole (Ire) (Free Eagle {Ire}) won the Listed Grand Prix de Bordeaux in May 2023 to become the operation's first stakes winner, a further 19 black-type victories have come Wathnan's way in Europe, headed by the aforementioned Group 1 winners Courage Mon Ami and Kind Of Blue, and including the Group 2-winning colts Shareholder (Not This Time) and Aesterius (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}). Another five stakes victories have come in America, where Subsanador (Arg) (Fortify) won the GI California Crown Stakes, while Hit Show (Candy Ride {Arg}) has won both his Grade II starts for Wathnan to date.

With such firepower to work with, it surely won't be long before we see some homebreds racing in the Wathnan silks. Whether or not we see a Wathnan stallion operation launching in the coming years is anyone's guess, but it does not require too much of a leap of faith to see the Emir following the example of some of his close family members in eventually retiring his top colts to stand under his own banner.

ANCIENT WISDOM PRIMED FOR MUNICH

Sunday's G1 Grosser Allianz Preis von Bayern, the final Group 1 event of the season in Europe, has attracted a field of 11. The 12-furlong heat marks the return of Charlie Appleby trainee Ancient Wisdom (Fr) (Dubawi {Ire}), who comes back off a win in July's G3 Bahrain Trophy at Newmarket. Last term's G1 Futurity Trophy hero finished a well-beaten eighth in Epsom's G1 Derby in his penultimate start.

"We had this race pencilled in for Ancient Wisdom for some time, hoping that the ground would be on the soft side," said Appleby. "It's a very competitive event and we are coming up against some solid older horses, so he needs to step forward from his Bahrain Trophy win. The ground is the key with him and he stays a mile-and-a-half well. He looks great and I can't fault his preparation."

The four-strong British raiding party also features G1 British Champions Fillies & Mares third **Tiffany** (**Ire**) (Farhh {GB}), G1 Oaks third **War Chimes** (Summer Front) and the latter's David Menuisier-trained stablemate **Panthera** (**Fr**) (Cracksman {GB}).

Last year's winning stable of Andre Fabre is represented by Godolphin's multiple Group 2-placed **Marquisat (Ire)** (Zarak {Fr}). "Marquisat is a consistent horse who has never disappointed us throughout his career," commented Godolphin's Louise Benard. "This end-of-season Group 1 fits well in his season and he should perform well."

The home defence includes last year's runner-up **Assistent** (**Ger**) (Sea The Moon {Ger}) and the dual Group 1-placed G2 Gran Premio del Jockey Club victor **Straight (Ger)** (**Zarak** {Fr}).

The field also includes this term's G2 Grand Prix de Deauville victrix **Quantanamera** (**Ger**) (Lope De Vega {Ire}), July's G1 Deutsches Derby third **Augustus** (**Ger**) (Soldier Hollow {GB}) and Gestut Ittlingen's ultra-consistent stayer **Lordano** (**Ger**) (Adlerflug {Ger}). The latter was 2 3/4 lengths adrift of Straight when third to GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero Rebel's Romance (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in September's G1 Preis von Europa at Cologne. Sarka Schutz trainee **Atoso** (**Ger**) (Guiliani {Ire}) completes the roll call.

GROUP 1 WINNER DUBAI MILE TO STAND AT COOLAGOWN STUD

Group 1 winner Dubai Mile (Ire) (Roaring Lion) will stand at Coolagown Stud in County Cork for 2025.

Trained by Mark and Charlie Johnston, Dubai Mile landed the Criterium de Saint-Cloud on his final start at two. He contested the 2,000 Guineas and the Derby at three before retiring initially to Manton Park.

Bred by Skymarc Farm, the son of Group 1-performing mare Beach Bunny (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}), who has proved herself as a high-class producer, will stand for €4,000 on a live foal basis for 2025.

Coolagown Stud's David Stack said, "I'm absolutely delighted to be standing Dubai Mile, a very special horse as one of the best colts by the much-missed Roaring Lion, on behalf of Ahmad Al Shaikh." Cont.

SON OF OAKS HEROINE QUALIFY SET FOR SAINT-CLOUD DEBUT

12.48 Saint-Cloud, Mdn, €50,000, unraced 2yo, c/g, 7 1/2fT Godolphin's CUALIFICAR (GB) (Lope De Vega {Ire}), is an Andre Fabre-trained son of G1 Oaks heroine Qualify (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) and thus kin to this year's G3 Jebel Ali Mile victor Swing Vote (GB) (Shamardal). Qualify, who was a 1.6-million guineas purchase at the 2015 Tattersalls December sale, is scheduled to go under the hammer at this month's Goffs November sale. Opposition to the April-foaled chestnut includes Haras Assiro's Dynamitic (GB) (Hello Youmzain {Fr}), who is a half-brother to this term's G1 Lockinge Stakes third Witch Hunter (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}).

Estrange, a 425,000gns Tattersalls October Book 1 graduate, posted a wide-margin win in her Aug. 25 debut at Goodwood before running seventh in Great Yarmouth's Sept. 18 Listed John Musker Fillies' Stakes last time and regained the winning thread in this second black-type outing.

Steadied towards the rear after an alert getaway, the 7-2 chance came under pressure to close approaching the quarter-mile marker and stayed on strongly in the closing stages to defeat Danielle for a career high.

"She didn't do a lot wrong at [Great] Yarmouth, the ground was probably quicker than she wants and she ran into a wall of horses two [furlongs] out," said winning rider James Doyle. "She's got the ability to switch off, which is key in this deep ground, so I put her to sleep early and was able to ride a race on her. I think there's plenty to come, she stays well and next year she'll have plenty of options. She's got a good engine."

Estrange is the third of five foals and one of three winners from as many runners produced by an unraced half-sister to G1 St Leger hero Logician (GB) (Frankel {GB}), multiple Graded stakes-winning GI E P Taylor Stakes runner-up Suffused (GB) (Champs Elysees {GB}) and the dam of dual GI Diana Stakes heroine Whitebeam (GB) (Caravaggio). The March-foaled grey is a half-sister to last year's G2 Park Hill Fillies' Stakes third Lmay (Ire) (Frankel {GB}), last month's Listed Silver Tankard Stakes third Basalt (Ire) (Pinatubo {Ire}) and a yearling colt by Lope De Vega (Ire).

SAVAGLEE MAKES IT THREE IN THE 2000 GUINEAS

Savaglee (NZ) (Savabeel) extended his winning streak to three in a row on Saturday, taking out the G1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas at Riccarton. Winner of the G3 Matamata Slipper S. as a 2-year-old, the now 3-year-old colt, trained by Pam Gerard, put 2.8l on Love Poem (Snitzel) to win the 1600-metre contest and make it six wins in 12 starts. Four of his wins have come this season, rising from a \$40,000 3-year-old handicap to capture two Group 2 wins on the way into Saturday's contest.

Trainer Pam Gerard struck out on her own in August, previously training in partnership with Mike Moroney for the last decade, and Savaglee has delivered four of her 14 wins so far this season. His Saturday win was also the third fastest running of the Group 1 race at 1:33.86, just 0.27s slower than Xtravagant (NZ) in 2015.

"He's been brilliant," Gerard told *racingnews.co.nz*. "I wasn't worried until about 10 minutes before the race, but then it all hit home. You start thinking, 'Have I done it right?'"

"But Sam's riding like a demon today. She was always very confident, and this is just a really good little horse that's gone from strength to strength this season. It was probably easy in the end, but it's never easy to watch."

"It's special to come back to my old hometown and win this race. I've run second a couple of times before, so this is fantastic."

She paid tribute to owners The Oaks Stud; "[They are] amazing, I'm so honoured that they've entrusted me with this horse, and he's done the job for them today. He's halfway to being a stallion now."

"It's always a huge honour to win a race like this," Rick Williams, The Oaks Stud general manager, said. "We've been lucky enough to be on the receiving end of (race sponsors) Al Basti Equiworld's generous sponsorship a couple of times now."

He was reciprocal with praise for Gerard, recalling Gerard's care of The Oaks Stud's G1 New Zealand 1000 Guineas winner Risque (NZ) (Darci Brahma {NZ}) when she was an assistant trainer at Te Akau Racing.

"As far as I'm concerned, Pam and The Oaks Stud are two-from-two together now," he said. "Sam Spratt is riding at the absolute peak of her powers as well. I really appreciate the way she's stuck with this horse and the relationship she's formed with him. He's just an exceptional colt, and I'm hoping we'll see a bit more of that in the future."

Bred by Waikato Stud, Savaglee was purchased by The Oaks Stud for NZ\$400,000 at the New Zealand National Yearling Sale last year. He is the best of three winners from Glee (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}), full sister to G3 Cuddle S. placegetter Symphonic, dam of dual Group 1 winner Orchestral (NZ) (Savabeel), and Listed-placed Tralee Chorus (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}), as well as three-quarter-sister to Spring (NZ) (O'Reilly {NZ}), dam of Champion 3YO in New Zealand Daffodil (NZ) (No Excuse Needed {GB}). From the same family is Atishu (NZ) (Savabeel), winner of Thursday's G1 Empire Rose S. Glee produced a full sister to Savaglee last year and returned to nine-time Champion NZ Sire Savabeel later in the spring.

Savaglee was the sixth Waikato Stud-bred winner of the G1 NZ 2000 Guineas--Noverre (NZ), Aegon (NZ) (Sacred Falls {NZ}), Madison County (NZ) (Pins), Embellish (NZ) and Sacred Falls (NZ) the others.

DOUBLE-DIGIT INCREASES AS BOOK 3 CONCLUDES AT KEENELAND NOVEMBER



Dreams are Made topped the Book 3 finale | Keeneland

by Jessica Martini

LEXINGTON, KY -The two-session Book 3 section of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock concluded Saturday, producing double-digit increases in average and median compared to its 2023 counterpart. Keeneland sold 499 horses through the ring during Book 3 for a gross of \$37,747,000. The section's average was \$75,645--up 20.98% from last year's Book 3--and the median was \$60,000, an increase of 20% from a year ago.

During the two Book 3 sessions in 2023, 494 horses sold through the ring for a total of \$30,888,000. The section average price was \$62,526 and the median was \$50,000.

Bill Betz made the highest bid of Saturday's session, going to \$280,000 to acquire **Dreams are Made** (Tapit) (hip 1799) in the name of his Avocet Bloodstock. The 8-year-old mare sold in foal to Gunite and was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency.

Brian Graves, general manager of Gainesway, which was active buying and selling mares Saturday, said he saw selectivity in the mare market.

"Mares in foal to fashionable stallions still sell pretty well," Graves said. "But if there are more than one or two foals out of her that you can't make a case for, it's not pretty."

McKinzie, whose first crop to hit the track this year includes Grade I winners Scottish Lassie and 'TDN Rising Star' Chancer McPatrick, was represented by the session's top three-priced weanlings, with colts selling for \$235,000, \$210,000, and \$195,000.

Graves purchased the session-topping weanling Saturday and admitted the foal market remained ultra-competitive as the Keeneland sale moved into Book 4.

"I think the foal market is savage," he said. "It's tough to get the ones you like bought, especially up in the top end. It's almost impossible. Every nice foal brings \$300,000 or \$400,000. Which is good for the market, but it is tough to get the ones you want to get your hands on."

During Book 3 this year, Keeneland sold 255 weanlings through the ring for a total of \$19,551,500 for an average of \$76,673 and a median of \$60,000. Colts by Jackie's Warrior and Twirling Candy shared the section's top price for a weanlings when selling Friday for \$250,000.

In 2023, a total of 190 Book 3 weanlings sold through the ring for a gross of \$12,143,500 and an average of \$63,913 and median of \$50,000. The top price was \$240,000 for a colt by Maxfield who was one of six weanlings to sell for \$200,000 or more during the section. There were 10 to reach that mark in 2024.

Through five sessions of the November sale, 1,055 horses have sold for \$163,353,500. The average of \$154,837 is up 5.86% from the same point of last year's sale, while the median of \$95,000 is up 18.75%. The cumulative buy-back rate stands at 25.02%. It was 27.39% at the same point a year ago.

The Keeneland November sale continues through Wednesday, with sessions beginning at 10 a.m.



'Biggest, Prettiest Bernardini:' Vucchella Sells for \$270k to Cove Springs

Richard and Connie Snyder's Cove Springs celebrated its first million-dollar sale when selling a half-sister to multiple Grade I winner Randomized (Nyquist) at Keeneland in September. The operation had lost Randomized's dam to a paddock accident, but the Snyders will be hoping they found a possible replacement after going to \$270,000 to acquire the 3-year-old broodmare prospect **Vucchella** (Bernardini) (hip 1685) from the Hill 'n' Dale at Xalapa consignment Saturday.

"She could be the biggest, prettiest Bernardini mare I have ever seen," Richard Snyder said after signing the ticket on the filly out back.

Bred in Ontario by Anderson Farms, Vucchella was purchased by X-Men Racing for \$230,000 at the 2022 Keeneland September sale. On the board in five of 10 starts, she won once and earned \$92,047.

Vucchella's unraced dam, Heartofthematter (Medaglia d'Oro), is a half-sister to multiple Grade I winner It's Tricky (Mineshaft), who is the dam of Enticed (Medaglia d'Oro).

Of the filly's final price tag, Snyder said, "It's twice as much as I thought she would be. But it's a horse sale. You can't walk away empty handed."

Earlier in the November sale, Cove Springs purchased **Mystique Saboteur** (Gun Runner) (hip 714) for \$90,000.

'Not a Lot of Faults:' McKinzie Weanlings Prove Popular Saturday at Keeneland

After a bang-up year with his first crop on the racetrack this year, weanlings by McKinzie were in demand in the Keeneland sales ring Saturday. The Gainesway stallion had the top three-priced weanlings during the session, with Brian Graves's En Fuego pinhooking partnership purchasing a colt (hip 1602) by the sire for \$235,000 from the War Horse Place consignment; Kinsman Farm going to \$210,000 for a colt (hip 1861) from the Eaton Sales consignment; and the Big Bear Bloodstock pinhooking partnership going to \$195,000 for a colt (hip 1795) from the Gainesway consignment.

Hip 1602 is out of Shirocca (Ire) (So You Think {NZ}), a half-sister to group winner Roman Turbo (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}). He was bred by Areion Thoroughbreds.


"I thought he was a select physical," said Graves, who also serves as Gainesway's General Manager. "He had everything you look for, a long neck, beautiful shoulder, nice hip and of course the athletic walk and correctness."

Through five session, 13 weanlings by McKinzie have sold at Keeneland for an average of \$152,077 and a median of \$180,000.

"We have seen a limited number of McKinzies come through and it looks like the market is really receptive to them," Graves said. "He had a good group here. It's part of what we like about McKinzie. He puts a good physical on the ground and something with not a lot of faults to it. It's good to see him carrying on and selling well. We just hope that he keeps rolling."

Capstone Thoroughbreds Hits Home Run with \$120k McKinzie Filly in Sales Debut

With a career in government and communications under her belt, Jennifer Durenberger decided to satisfy her curiosity about the Thoroughbred industry and signed up to work an auction for Taylor Made Sales Agency. What followed was "three years of wow," Durenberger said Saturday, a day after watching the first foal she and longtime friend Tracy Plummer had ever bred sell for six figures at the Keeneland November sale.

"I've always followed the races and I've always ridden, but not competitively or anything," Durenberger explained. "I worked in politics and media relations for years. But I think I was just at the age where, you know what, why not find out about it? I worked a sale for Taylor Made three years ago, just on a fluke."

The experience only served to pique her interest and she soon included Plummer, who had been her college roommate at the University of Alabama.

"We started talking about maybe buying a mare three years ago. I told [Tracy], 'You need to come up in and work a sale,'" Durenberger said.

The two business partners made their first acquisition when purchasing Mamma Kimbo (Discreet Cat) from Marie Jones. **Cont. p6**

"Mrs. Jones was culling her broodmare band, so in August of 2022, we were able to get Mamma Kimbo," Durenberger recalled. "We tried to get her pregnant that first year, but she didn't catch."

Despite the momentary setback, Capstone Thoroughbreds--a nod to their university days--was born and Durenberger and Plummer threw themselves into the new endeavor.

"Tracy and I are both detail oriented," Durenberger said. "We both worked in government and politics and are both very research- oriented. We did all this research about what mare we were going to buy in foal last November. We would sit up for hours. Our husbands would laugh at us when we went to visit them."

After the hours of research, the actual purchase of a mare at Keeneland last November was really more a spur-of-the-moment type of thing.

"In the back ring a year ago tomorrow, Jeff [Hayslett] and Mark [Taylor] came up to me at the reserve desk and said, 'You need to take a look at this Bernardini mare back here. With the way the market is today, we think she would be a great buy for you.'"

The mare was Lady Brett Ashley (Bernardini) and the then 4-year-old was carrying her first foal. The two women purchased the mare for \$32,000.

"She was in foal to McKinzie," Durenberger said. "And we had

wanted a McKinzie the year before, but didn't take the risk trying to breed Mamma Kimbo to her. Sure enough, sight unseen, we buy this Bernardini mare in foal to McKinzie."

The investment only looked better when Chancer McPatrick, a colt from McKinzie's first crop and also out of Bernardini mare, won the GI Hopeful Stakes and GI Champagne Stakes.

Lady Brett Ashley's first foal (hip 1478) went through the sales ring at Keeneland Friday and brought a final bid of \$120,000 from McMahon & Hill Bloodstock.

"We weren't sure, but there was a last-minute vetting,"
Durenberger said of expectations as the first foal she had bred
headed to the ring. "I told Tracy, 'My heart is beating out of my
chest,' and she said, 'What heart?"

In addition to its sales success Friday, the fledgling Capstone Thoroughbreds is celebrating its initial acquisition, the 15-year-old Mamma Kimbo, who is in foal to Arabian Lion and whose 2-year-old Dream On (Not This Time) was third in the Sept. 14 GI Summer Stakes and was fifth after setting the pace in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf.

Lady Brett Ashley is in foal to Vino Rosso.

"We keep our mares at Shawhan Place, so I would be remiss not to thank Courtney Schneider over there and the whole Shawhan team," Durenberger said. "I think we have surrounded ourselves with a good team."

Durenberger's place at Taylor Made, meanwhile, has gone from a fluke to a full-time position.

"I kept in touch with Katie [Taylor] and I said here is my background. I am not looking for anything full time, but if you ever have anything where you could use my help--it's more marketing communications, but I don't know, I would love to find out more about this business. So she offered me a part-time job. I assisted her in different projects. And then they offered me a full-time job doing contracts, nominations, entries. I wasn't thinking full time, but it's been a blessing because I've learned so much. It's a wonderful team."

Looking ahead, Durenberger admitted she and Plummer were keeping their eyes out for another broodmare to add to their band. And now they are working with a cushion, thanks to Lady Brett Ashley's first foal.

"It really is a blessing that that happened," Durenberger said.

"Now we can take it one step at a time next year. That covered our care for everybody and our stud fees for next year."

Integration's well-timed throttle management in the more than capable hands of jockey Flavien Prat worked to perfection as the 4-year-old swooped in late to take the featured GII Red Smith Stakes at Aqueduct on Saturday afternoon.

After a stellar start to his career in 2023, which saw the \$700,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sale buy graduate on debut by 6 1/2 lengths over the turf at Colonial Downs, then score in the GIII Virginia Derby and the GII Hill Prince Stakes at the Big A, Integration hit the board in the Maker's Mark Mile Stakes at Keeneland back in the spring. The Shug McGaughey trainee ran fourth in the Old Forester Bourbon Turf Classic Stakes on the Derby undercard.

The highlight this season for Integration was clearly a 6 1/2-length win in the Million Preview Stakes at Colonial in mid-July and he offered a runner-up finish to MGISW Nations Pride (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) over the same course in the GI Arlington Million Stakes Aug. 11. Lacking a late burst in the GII Kentucky Downs Turf Cup put the colt fourth after going off as the favorite at the uniquely configured Commonwealth track.

Relishing a chance at a turn back in distance from 12 furlongs and well-backed as the 6-5 choice here, Integration was quick out of the blocks, but he was soon taken in-hand by Prat as the 4-year-old settled mid-pack along the rail passing the grandstand for the first time. As Limited Liability and Rebel Red made the pace up the backstretch, Integration continued to wait for his cue before the far turn.

The pair of leaders got the jump on the field at the quarter pole and it looked as though this was going to be a two-horse race to the wire. However, Prat knew what he had under him, tipped ever-so-slightly to the three path and his mount rolled home ready for his close-up to get his picture taken. An inquiry between Limited Liability and Rebel Red resulted in no change in the running order.

"It's the end of the year and he's [Integration] been in training a good while, said trainer Shug McGaughey. "He [Flavien Prat] said he was kind of grinding the first part and then the last part he showed him another gear and finished up. So, I was pleased with him.

"I was kind of looking at the gray horse [Limited Liability] because he's mine, too. I thought, 'don't let the other one beat you.' But I could tell he [Prat] had horse; it was just a matter of if he kicked in."

Pedigree Notes:

Integration is out of Harmonize, who was no slouch herself on the grass as she collected the GI Del Mar Oaks, GII Glen Falls Stakes and GII JP Morgan Chase Jessamine Stakes during her racing career under Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott. In the breeding shed, the dam is responsible for unraced 2-year-old filly Castanet (Nyquist) and a yearling filly by Gun Runner, who Chester and Mary Broman took home for \$1.15-million during Keeneland September. Harmonize foaled a filly named Drumline March 31 and she was bred to Into Mischief for 2025.



Impressive winner of the GIII Gotham Stakes over the local main track to begin the season, 'TDN Rising Star' Deterministic has found his footing on the grass during the second half of the campaign and won for second time at the graded level over the surface, validating 7-4 favoritism in Saturday's GIII Hill Prince Stakes at Aqueduct.

Victorious in the GIII Virginia Derby ahead of a game runner-up effort in the GIII Jockey Club Derby Invitational Stakes over a mile and three furlongs last time, the \$625,000 Keeneland September yearling was away alertly from a low draw and dropped over to the rail to box-seat the nine-panel test as the rail-drawn Parx raider Bartlett (Not This Time) was left to his own devices up front. Traveling nicely in hand and switched off down the backstretch, Deterministic was given a nudge entering the turn, pushed away from the inside to deliver his challenge in the two-wide line in upper stretch, took command a furlong out and was always holding 2-1 second choice Cugino for a cozy success. Royal Majesty was third.



"He's never run a bad race on the turf," said winning trainer Christophe Clement. "He's a fun horse. He's won three graded stakes and it's not easy to win three graded stakes in the same year."

Unplaced and well-beaten in the GII Wood Memorial Stakes and GIII Peter Pan Stakes following his first-up win in the Gotham, Deterministic was narrowly second when making his turf debut in the GIII Manila Stakes here June 29 and was a gaining third to Carson's Run (Cupid) in the Aug. 11 GI Saratoga Derby Invitational. A neck best at even-money in New Kent Sept. 7, he just failed to reel in Carson's Run in the Jockey Club Derby.

Clement said he would resist the urge to try Deterministic in a race like the GI Pegasus World Cup Turf in early 2025.

"I don't like the Pegasus for 3-year-olds turning four," the Frenchman explained. "I like to take on older horses as the year goes on. He's been running all year long and he's been working since January, so I think he deserves a break. The smart thing to do is to give him a break and bring him back as a 4-year-old and have a complete campaign in New York next year."



Pedigree Notes:

Acquired by Michael Wallace as agent for St Elias Stables, Deterministic was the joint most-expensive of 58 yearlings by his successful sire sold in 2022. The dark bay is one of three winners from as many to race from his dam, a half-sister to the Grade Il-placed Duff One (Harlan's Holiday), while the bulk of the family's black-type occurs in the third dam.

The stakes-winning Amelia, a half-sister to Bertolini (Danzig), was responsible for seven winners, including the Japanese group-level winners Rabbit Run (Tapit) and Asukusa Genki (Stormy Atlantic); GSW & GISP Rainha Da Bateria (Broken Vow); GSW Assateague (Stormy Atlantic); GSW/GISP Kindergarden Kid



(Dynaformer); and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up He's Had Enough (Tapit). Deterministic's fifth dam is Courtly Dee (Never Bend), herself responsible for champion Althea (Alydar) and Aurora (Danzig), the dam of the influential Arch (Kris S.).

Giulio's Jewel's last-listed produce is the 2-year-old filly Morana (Frosted). Another of the mare's daughters, the unraced 5-year-old Seeking Mo Jewel (Nyquist), was sold for \$100,000 in foal to Maclean's Music at Keeneland November earlier this week.

While Masteroffoxhounds (War Front) and Hades (Awesome Slew) were off slowly, Wonderful Justice (GB) (Justify) left there cleanly and so, too, did Battle of Normandy, who settled kindly just off the flank of the pacesetter through moderate early fractions. Luan Machado sent Battle of Normandy into the lead with a bit more than a quarter-mile to travel, pinched a break in upper stretch and held firm as **Reckoning Force** (Air Force Blue) emerged from the pack to complete the exacta. Gigante (Not This Time) was a forward factor and found the line just ahead of lukewarm favorite **Cash Equity (Fr)** (Toronado {Ire}).

"He was so full of himself and just dragging me the entire time. I watched his last few races and you could see with the blinkers


he liked to be pretty close. He's a very impressive-moving colt. We weren't going too fast early so I was confident turning for home he'd still have a lot of energy left. He just took off when I asked him and finished up very well."

A maiden winner and twice placed in Grade III company from his first nine trips to the post, Battle of Normady entered Saturday's test in arguably the best form of his career. The twolength winner of a nine-furlong allowance at Aqueduct June 16, the \$500,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga graduate lasted in an 11-furlong contest over the Saratoga turf course July 14, defeating future Colonial Cup Stakes and GIII Singspiel Stakes winner Truly Quality (Quality Road). He completed a hat trick of victories when besting next-out GIII Knickerbocker Stakes hero Andthewinneris (Oscar Performance) back on Long Island in allowance company Sept. 20. Cont. p15

A sister to 2016 GIII Pucker Up Stakes victress Noble Beauty, the mare is responsible for Cugino, winner of this year's Audubon Stakes at Churchill and runner-up in Saturday's GIII Hill Prince Stakes at Aqueduct; and the stakes-placed Veronica Greene (Tapit). The family has starred this week at Keeneland, as the latter sold for \$725,000 in foal to Justify, while Adorable Miss fetched \$750,000 when offered in pregnant to Flightline.

Adorable Miss is also the dam of the 2-year-old gelding Long Acting (War of Will) and the yearling colt Essential Charm (Essential Quality).

Caitlinhergrtness broke well from the outside stall in a scratched-down field of 11 and did well to secure a prime position one off the inside and with cover on the back of longshot Ecstacy (Paynter) as Aha Moment (Nyquist) sped through from the inside alley to head them off into the first turn. Elysian Field was also away without incident and was content to drift back to sit in the latter third of the field under patient handling from Sahin Civaci.

Caitlinhergrtness was well-spotted down the backstretch, but was tugging for rein, and Rafael Hernandez took a bit of a gamble, allowing the favorite to stride into the lead with fully three furlongs to travel in the 10-furlong staying test. The sophomore filly looked all over a winner turning into the straight, but Civaci and Elysian Field caught the eye approaching the quarter pole, splitting horses under a full head of steam. Caitlinhergrtness began looking for the line, and Elysian Field collared her five off the inside with about 70 yards to go before edging clear.

Winner of the Woodbine Oaks ahead of her Plate effort, Elysian Field missed by a nose in the Oct. 1 Breeders' Stakes before being named the Sovereign Award winner of her generation. Just up in a nine-furlong allowance over this course July 13, the chestnut attended the pace in grassy GII Canadian Stakes Aug. 10 before dropping out to sixth and she bounced back in her latest with a runner-up effort to Fabulously Fab (Silent Name {Jpn}) in the GIII Ontario Matron Stakes Sept. 14.

Pedigree Notes:

The 53rd worldwide winner at the group/graded level for Darley America's hard-knocking Hard Spun and she is the 86th worldwide GSW out of a daughter of Canada's own Smart Strike.

Anderson Farms acquired Elysian Field's dam for \$100,000 in foal to Kantharos at the 2018 Keeneland January Sale, and she has produced two winners from three to race to date. Elysian is a daughter of Peter Blum product Initiation, victorious in the local Glorious Song Stakes in 2007, who half-dozen winners as a producer included SP Forward Thinker (Indian Charlie). The stakes-placed third dam, a sister to GSW Multiple Choice, dropped seven winners, including MSW Inspired (Unbridled's Song), the dam of Saudi SW and US graded-placed Carmel Road (Quality Road) and the family also includes MGISW National Treasure (Quality Road), SW & GSP Silver City (Unbridled's Song) and GISP 'TDN Rising Star' Pirate (Omaha Beach).

Elysian changed hands for \$35,000 at Keeneland November in 2021 and produced the filly Vegas Hottie (Collected) the following season. Also the dam of a yearling filly by Union Rags, Elysian did not foal this year and sold for \$55,000 carrying a full-sibling on a March cover to Elysian Field during the Fasig-Tipton October Digital Sale.

The drama began early and lasted throughout much of the running of the GIII Bessarabian Stakes at Woodbine Saturday. After a delayed start which saw the inside runner Dolce Sopresa (Maclean's Music) act up in the gate and wind up a late scratch, the entire field was backed out and reloaded. As the gates broke following a several minute delay, 38-1 shot Spansive (Karakontie {Jpn}) refused to start from an outer gate and the race went on without her.

Starting the best, Stormcast (Mitole), the gate-to-wire Bison City Stakes winner from two back, set off in a similar fashion here and opened up an uncontested lead up the backstretch. Never pressured through fractions of :23.60 and :46.62, the 3year-old filly facing older rivals had plenty left to offer and needed to call on that extra energy as a charging Love to Shop (Violence) ran at her in the final furlong but ultimately came up short. The race was marred by a fatal injury to Owen's Tour Guide (Tourist) who went down around the far turn with jockey Jose Campos. Campos was able to walk off under his own power. The remainder of Woodbine's card was called off following the race due to what track officials noted as being "in the best interest of equine safety."

Pedigree Notes:

One of eight stakes winners for Mitole, Stormcast is out of MSW/MGSP Scolara who has a perfect six-for-six record of runners to winners with now a second black-type performer to join SP Prize Fight (Tiznow). The dam is a half-sister to Quindici (Crafty Prospector) who foaled both G1SW Quiz Kid (Arg) (Forestry) and SW/GSP Quality Boone (Arg) (Daniel Boone {Brz}). Stormcast is her dam's last reported foal.

WOODBINE CANCELS FINAL TWO RACES, AUTUMN STAKES TO RUN NOV. 16

The final two races on Saturday's live racing program at Woodbine outside of Toronto, including the GIII Autumn Stakes, were cancelled "in the best interest of equine safety," according to a release from Woodbine Entertainment Group.

The decision was taken following consultation with the local Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, the Jockeys' Guild and the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario

The track successfully staged two of the three graded events carded for Saturday, the GIII Maple Leaf Stakes and the GIII Bessarabian Stakes. The Autumn Stakes will not be re-drawn and will take place next Saturday, Nov. 16.

CALIFORNIA HORSEMAN DON VALPREDO PASSES AWAY AT 85 by Bill Finley

Don Valpredo. a longtime breeder and owner based in California, passed away Oct. 31 while on vacation overseas. He was 85.

At one time or another, Valpredo was on the board of virtually every horse racing and breeding organization in California. From Bakersfield, California, he served as the chairman of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association from 2014 to 2016 and served three consecutive one-year terms from 1986 to 1988 and remained on the board of that organization at the time of his passing. Don Valpredo Passes Away cont.

Valpredo was inducted into the California Thoroughbred Hall of Fame. He was also among a group of fellow owners and breeders that created California Cup Day at Santa Anita. In his honor, the California Cup Sprint was renamed the Don Valpredo California Cup Sprint.

In 2014 he was tapped again to help run the CTBA and served another term as that group's president.

He also served as the commissioner of the California Horse Racing Board and had stints as a member of the Breeders' Cup board, and with the boards of the Thoroughbred Owners of California and the Jockey Club. He was inducted into the CTBA Hall of Fame in 2017

With his friend and business partner John Harris, he co-bred California Horse of the Year and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint runner up Soviet Problem. In 2019, he was inducted into the Bob Elias Kern County Sports Hall of Fame for helping build the sport in California for over forty years.

In his obituary posted on the website of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association, it was noted that, "while he will forever be the patriarch of many agricultural enterprises, which along with his proud and steadfast service, comprise much of his legacy, thoroughbred horses were Valpredo's true passion. Perhaps because they most closely resemble his untamable spirit, interminable grit and resolve, and/or perhaps as Valpredo once put it, simply because, "the first horse that I bred and raced so many years ago won her first race" ... and away he went, always putting more into the Thoroughbred world than he took out."

"I absolutely love the training industry and the breeding industry here," Valpredo told the TDN in January. "In fact, I'm sitting here today with the Stallion Register on my lap, trying to find the right mix for my broodmares."

He was also a veteran of the agricultural industry. He was the president of Ridge Ginning Co. and founding Partner of Kern Ridge Growers, Val-Mar Farms and related entities. He also served on the Western Growers Board of Directors from 2003-2014 and was a WG member since 1989. His company Country Sweet Produce specialized in sweet potatoes.

Valpredo is survived by his wife Sally; three children: Michael Valpredo, Natalia Fritz and Alexis Mosely and their spouses; and seven grandchildren.

In lieu of flowers, the Valpredo family is asking for donations to the National Future Farmers of America Foundation's Leadership Fund.

THE CHOSEN VRON ON TURN-OUT, **EXPECTED TO RETURN IN 2025**

Fan favorite **The Chosen Vron** (Vronsky), scratched from the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint last weekend, will be turned out for several months after an issue was detected in his ankle.

"We'll take it one step at a time," trainer J. Eric Kruljac said. "We'll give him four months off and then bring him back. I feel pretty good that he'll come back the same horse."

California's reigning Horse of the Year, the 6-year-old has won 19 of his 25 career trips to the post to date and, after finishing fifth in last year's Sprint, rattled off five consecutive victories this season, capped by a successful defense of his title in the GI Bing Crosby Stakes at Del Mar. He was upended by Raging Torrent (Maximus Mischief) in the GII Pat O'Brien Stakes and was on track for the six-furlong dash on Nov. 2.

Veterinarians placed The Chosen Vron on the vet's list 10 days before the Sprint, where he would have had to stay for two weeks. Cont. p19


"It's a little blemish, not even as big as an eraser on a pencil," Kruljac continued. "The races he ran in the Pat O'Brien and the Bing Crosby he had that probably going on then.

"He deserves a little rest," Kruljac said. "Three of the four partners live in close proximity (to Bonsall), so they can go out and visit him. The other guy, Bob Fetkin, lives in St. Pete Beach, Florida. He and his wife Sheila just lost their house in the hurricane. They were renting an apartment on the eighth floor of a high rise and a crane on a building adjacent from his apartment broke off and crashed into his apartment. They took it in stride and they're safe."

At the time of the scratching, Kruljac mentioned the possibility of racing in the Middle East over the winter.

"We may still do that," Kruljac said. "Whatever I voiced out loud probably didn't have a lot thought behind it. Just frustration. But everybody has to do what they have to do. Life in the big city."

EARHART SOARS TO 'TON RISING STAR' STATUS IN WOODBINE UNVEILING

When you spend €1,400,000 on a yearling to dissolve a partnership at Argana Deauville's August Yearling Sale, there are expectations. Safe to say, Earhart (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}) met those and then some to become a new 'TDN Rising Star' in her Saturday unveiling over the synthetic surface at Woodbine for co-breeder LNJ Foxwoods, who bought out partner Ecurie Des Monceaux at Argana, and trainer Josie Carroll. The grey daughter of leading French stallion Siyouni, slammed into the 6-5 favorite's role, never let this field have a shot. Breaking from the middle of the gate, she was in front from the opening strides and had things all her own way on the front end with longshot **Lastmambo in Paris** (Mineshaft) chasing in vain from second. Unpressured through fractions of :23.39 and :45.90, it was over before the leader had even passed the quarter pole as Earhart opened up a multi-length advantage, straightened for the wire and came home under wraps to win by as much as she pleased under a motionless Rafael Hernandez while She Loves (Cupid) closed in to be the best of the rest in second.

Earhart is the first foal out of French stakes winner Aviatress (Ire), who went the way of Solis/Litt (also the official listed buyer for Earhart) for €450,000 as an Arqana Yearling in 2017. The dam, a daughter of Ecurie des Monceaux's \$200,000 KEESEP buy Manerbe, is a half to another 'TDN Rising Star' in Gidu (Ire) (Frankel {GB}), who took a pair of stakes wins in North American for Zayat Stables while Marbre Rose (Ire) (Smart Strike) is another half-sibling who saw stakes and graded success in her racing career after coming from France. This is the extended family of GISW Zoftig (Cozzene) and her daughters, GISW Zo

Impressive (Hard Spun) and GISW Zaftig (Gone West). She is the 15th 'TDN Rising Star' for the Aga Khan's Siyouni, who was a 'Rising Star' himself. Aviatress's only other offspring is a yearling Dubawi (Ire) filly.

Upper Case made her stakes debut a winning one and reversed form with Mystic Pleasure, who had beaten her in an Oct. 13 allowance race at Keeneland by a half-length. She had last won in an Aug. 4 Ellis Park allowance sprint by 5 1/4 lengths.

Under Evin Roman, who was aboard her for the seventh straight time, the 9-2 third choice in a field of six was outpaced while saving ground early behind Accomplished Girl's demanding pace set in :21.71 and :44.66. 
