





NOBALS BACK TO WINNING WAYS IN KENNEDY ROAD, HONG KONG ON THE HORIZON

Having picked up the greatest victory of his career, thus far, in the 2023 GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, **Nobals** (Noble Mission {GB}) had yet to return to that peak this season, but found the winner's enclosure again in the GII Kennedy Road Stakes Saturday evening at Woodbine.

A 10-time winner in his career, most of them came against stakes or graded company over the course of four years. He'd made a name for himself early on as a quality synthetic horse, winning three stakes races in a row between Turfway and Woodbine in 2022, but found his best stride last year when swapping to the grass. After claiming the GII Twin Spires Turf Sprint Stakes in early May, he held that form through four more races including running GISW Cogburn (Not This Time) to three-quarter lengths in the GIII Troy Stakes that August in Saratoga. He culminated his 2023 by being crowned a Breeders' Cup champion.

Gone until late July this year, he ran fourth on his seasonal bow in Saratoga against optional claiming company before once again facing down Cogburn Sept. 7 in the GII Ainsworth Turf Sprint Stakes at Kentucky Downs. **Cont.**, **p3**



He breaks from the rail and cuts back to the distance of his second two starts back (to Breeders' Cup runner up Gaming {Game Winner}) in the GI Del Mar Futurity.

Running fourth there and last seen Oct. 5 at Keeneland running fifth in the GII Woodford Stakes, the betting public gave him a 3-1 chance to defeat 4-5 favorite **Patches O'Houlihan** (Reload), who was seeking the 12th win of his career and fifth in a row, here.

Outsprinted early by the public's choice, Nobals was never far from that frontrunner as he put up :21.80 and :44.24 early splits. Hounding him relentlessly as that one came off the fence, which briefly opened the door for the grey **Remuda** (More Than Ready) to try a rally from that spot, they drifted out further coming off the turn. Locking horns for the stretch battle, the pair left the field in their wake as they refused to give each other peace, but Nobals had just enough late to score by that three-quarter margin. It was over four lengths back to **War Bomber** (**Ire**) (War Front) in third.

Jockey E. T. Baird shared after the race that he learned about the trip to Canada just days ago, and the scramble ensued to get to Toronto.

"I rode him before, but I was actually caught off guard," said Baird. "Larry [Rivelli, trainer] had given me a call, I think maybe on Thursday, and told me I was going to Woodbine on Saturday. My passport expired, so I was all day yesterday at the passport agency in Chicago. I went in there at nine o'clock and made it home at eight o'clock at night."

Baird added that his mount's pre-race behavior provided a big confidence boost for his chances.

"The way he acted today, in the post parade and everything about him, was really professional. I had a really good feeling about him in the post parade. He was wanting to jump and move and seemed really bright and ready to go at it."

The next reported stop for the frequent flier gelding is Dec. 8 at Sha Tin Racecourse to compete in the HK\$26-million (\$3.35million) G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint.

Pedigree Notes:

A humble \$3,500 purchase out of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling sale, Nobals is out of a twice winning mare, Pearly Blue, who has produced five winners from six to reach racing age. His elder half-sister My First Pearl (First Samurai) is the only other sibling to earn black-type, which she claimed by way of running third in the Listed Saylorville Stakes. Their dam had a run of poor luck after foaling Nobals with only a yearling colt by Known Agenda born in five years. She visited Forte for 2025.


The second dam, GSW Western Ransom (Red Ransom), is herself out of a winning full-sister to GSW-Eng Raah Algharb (Gone West) and half-sister to GSW-Eng Pharian (Diesis {GB}). Another half-sister to that mare is Aletta Maria (Diesis {GB}), whose claim to fame was as the dam of MGISW Cetewayo (His Majesty), MGISW Dynaforce (Dynaformer), and GSW & GISP Bowman Mill (Kris S.). Some of her lesser known runners include MGSP De Aar (Gone West), MGSP Thabazimbi (Empire Maker), mulitple Group/Graded-placed Bryntirion (Bering {GB}) and G1 Prix Lupin-placed Fort Nottingham (Alleged).

Trainer Mike McCarthy brings back the field's sole 'TDN Rising Star' as Bullard (Gun Runner) makes his second start since putting up an 84 Beyer Speed Figure in his six-furlong debut Sept. 1 where he closed to defeat **Kalea Bay** (Authentic). In fact, four of the six runners, Bullard included, will be stretching out to seven furlongs for the first time Sunday.

The aforementioned Kalea Bay, one of a pair of Bob Baffert runners in the field and the pricier of the two at \$700,000, ran into Citizen Bull has shown his own steady improvement over three starts, first behind Citizen Bull before losing the lead to Bullard in that Sept. 1 spot. The third time proved to the charm as he wired a field by 8 1/2 lengths at Santa Anita Sept. 28. He joins wildcard stablemate Madaket Road (Quality Road) who would make his first start in this spot Sunday. The \$650,000 FTSAUG purchase was also cross-entered in a maiden special weight race at Churchill Downs Saturday.

Completing the field are a pair of maidens, **Maximus** (Maximus Mischief) for Cesar DeAlba and Dr Ruben M (Vino Rosso) for Doug O'Neill. Both would appear to be part of an early pace set up as Maximus wired his maiden optional claimer by 9 1/4 lengths while Dr Ruben M broke through in his fourth start and cuts back from one mile where he lasted by three-quarters of a length.

WICKED DJANGO LIGHTS UP TOTEBOARD AS THE BIG UPSET IN AUTUMN STAKES

In a field packed with the King's Plate winner, several multiple graded placed runners, and horses with Grade I backclass, it was the longest shot on the board who claimed victory in the GII Autumn Stakes at Woodbine.

Having not see the winner's circle since this summer when he won against optional claiming company at this venue to start his season, Wicked Django (Wicked Strong) had been hitting the board consistently since then, but coming short to familiar faces, including MGSW Paramount Prince (Society's Chairman). He'd run third twice to that foe, in the GIII Dominion Day and the GIII Seagram Cup, and just missed the board in August in the GII King Edward Stakes. He came into this race off second and thirdplace efforts, Sept. 14 going long on the synthetic and Oct. 6 going long on the grass, respectively, before leaving the shedrow of Krista Cole. He was equipped with blinkers for the first time in his career here for his new trainer L. Rodney Barrow.

In no rush after the jump, the 24-1 longshot settled in seventh as Paramount Prince stepped forward to set the tempo, as was custom for him. Starting his advance after :23.60, :47.18, and 1:10.80 splits sailed by, he was rolling with a full head of stream from the grandstand side as the longtime leader began fading. Inhaling 2-1 favorite **Dresden Row** (Lord Nelson) and 8-1 shot **Stanley House** (Army Mule) as those tried to mount a response to his inside, Wicked Django kicked on willingly to win by 1 1/4 lengths.

"He broke just a tad slow, and I let him relax back there," said winning rider Kevin Nicholls. "I know they were going pretty solid up front, Paramount Prince and the others, and I just tried to make one steady run at them." Cont.

Nicholls added that the addition of blinkers seemed to make all the difference, and Barrow agreed.

"We got him about a month ago. The owner asked me to train him, and I said, 'Okay.' We thought the blinkers would help a lot."



CLAIMING CROWN JEWEL GOES TO LONG SHOT TWICE ELEVATED TO WINS BY DQ IN

Laughing Boy (Distorted Humor) got the last laugh-again-in the featured race on the 26th annual Claiming Crown program Saturday at Churchill Downs.

The 6-year-old, who hadn't raced since April, led Saturday's \$225,000 Jewel at nine furlongs for most of the trip and then again inside the sixteenth pole. But the no-quit grinder required a stewards' disqualification of the rival who had passed him at both the quarter pole and at the wire to elevate his second-across-the-wire finish to a by-decision victory.

That's the second time in three races that Laughing Boy has been the beneficiary of a DQ in a big race.

It also happened Mar. 24 in the \$150,000 Excelsior S. at Aqueduct when Laughing Boy ran second at 54-1 but got promoted to the win by the stewards..

On Saturday, with three horses stacked across the track at the furlong pole, the 10-1 Laughing Boy, closest to the inside, wasn't much bothered by the veering-in Surface to Air (Midshipman), who had forward momentum on the lead but shifted inward, tightening up on Welaka (Malibu Moon) in the middle and forcing that rival to check out of contention.

If anything, Laughing Boy seemed emboldened by the roughhousing. He fought back to regain the lead before losing it again in the final few jumps.

Surface to Air crossed the wire a half-length ahead of Laughing Boy in 1:50.47. Hurry Hurry (Accelerate) was third and Welaka ended up fourth. Surface to Air was placed fourth via DQ, behind the runner he fouled.

Laughing Boy was ridden by Samuel Camacho Jr. and is trained by David Jacobson, who also owns in partnership with Lawrence Roman.

Laughing Boy had been competing in stakes races his last three tries, but was eligible for the condition because he had started for a \$35,000 claiming tag within the past two years.

"This race wasn't originally on our plans but I saw he was eligible for it," Jacobson said. "I wasn't quite sure if I'd have him ready to go a mile and an eighth. He ran a great race. It's been the second time in three races he's been placed first. Sometimes in racing it's good to have some luck on your side."

The Claiming Crown, which began in 1999 as a way to showcase and reward horses who compete in the types of races that form the backbone of day-to-day American racing, is a partnership between the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association.

Its annual programs are conducted under starter-allowance conditions pegged to previous-race claiming prices. Conditions were fast and firm at Louisville for this year's edition, the first since 2021 that the grass races weren't snowed or rained out.

In the \$175,000 Emerald at 1/16 miles on the turf, Echo Lane (Treasure Beach {GB}) conceded an early lead, then applied gradual torque to crack the frontrunner and win by a diminishing half-length ahead of the onrushing favorite in 1:41.09.

Anthony Rogers owns the 3-year-old colt, who was most recently fourth at 24-1 odds in the GIII Virginia Derby, but had previously met the \$25,000 claiming requirement. Rohan Crichton trains, with jockey Luis Saez up.

In the \$150,000 Tiara for distaffers at 1 1/16 miles on the turf, Ghostly Gal (Ghostzapper) stalked from midpack and uncorked a gradual grind-down to prevail by a head at 4-1 odds in 1:41.73.

The 6-year-old hasn't spent much of her 6-for-15 career in claiming races. She's 2-for-3 in her only three starts for a tag, including a win at the \$25,000 level two starts back at Colonial Downs to attain eligibility for the Tiara. The winning owner/trainer/jockey connections are Tommy Town Thoroughbreds, Wayne Catalano and Vincent Cheminaud.

In the \$150,000 Canterbury Tom Metzen Memorial on the grass at 5 1/2 furlongs, Francisco Arrieta deftly sliced Voodoo Zip (City Zip) through top-of-stretch traffic to pop home at 33-1 odds, winning by 1 1/4 lengths in 1:03.24.

Owned and trained by Juan Cano, the 7-year-old gelding now has a 6-7-7 mark from 34 starts.

Horses at double-digit odds rounded out the top three in the \$125,000 Rapid Transit at seven furlongs. The stretch run featured multiple waves of closers and four horses still in it to win it at the sixteenth pole.

Chris Emigh stormed home first with Like a Saltshaker (Peace and Justice), who won by a head in 1:23.52. Emigh got a leg up on the 13-1 shot from his wife, the trainer Brittany Vanden Berg. The 6-year-old gelding now boasts a commanding 17-8-0 record from 38 lifetime starts, with nine of those wins since Vanden Berg dropped the \$10,000 claim slip on behalf of current owner Marisco Brothers back on May 14, 2023.

The \$100,000 Iron Horse Kent Sterling Memorial at 1 1/16 miles was wired by King of Hollywood (Palace Malice), a 5-year-old who once started against Grade I company (Haskell

S.) at age three but has subsequently changed hands via the claim box six times, including most recently for \$5,000 on June 1.

With the gelding riding a two-race winning streak at Delaware Park into the Claiming Crown, jockey Jorge Gonzalez put King of Hollywood's big white blaze in front shortly after the start from post one. Leading under constant pressure, he swatted back several stout challenges on the far turn and in deep stretch before being saved by the wire for the neck victory at 14-1 odds in 1:44.29 for owner Estlae Garcia and trainer Daniel Siculietano.

In the \$100,000 Glass Slipper for fillies and mares at one mile, 2024's winningest Thoroughbred in terms of victories (11), Tennessee Moon (Ransom the Moon), had the lead at the top of the lane but got swallowed up by two challengers before 1.87-1 favorite Jubilant Joanie (Unified) barreled by them all to win by a well-timed neck under Reylu Gutierrez in 1:37.94.

Already having achieved sub-\$12,500 claiming eligibility for the Claiming Crown earlier in her career, the 4-year-old filly was claimed out of a win for \$20,000 two starts back by trainer Jeff Mullins, who shares ownership with partners Darren Carraway and Denise De Quevedo.

In the \$100,000 Ready's Rocket Express at six furlongs, 1.23-1 favorite Concrete Glory (Bodemeister) was hustled to the inside position in a three-way duel. Despite that expenditure of early energy, jockey Saez peeled off from the pack under a hand ride at the top of the lane and ran up the score late, winning by 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ lengths in 1:09.30 for owner Big Frank Stable and trainer Saffie Joseph Jr.

Concrete Glory had only once raced below the \$8,000 lifetime claiming eligibility cutoff for the Ready's Rocket, and he had been cuffing around starter-allowance and optional-claiming company at Gulfstream this year, with a 3-1-1 record from five starts. **Cont.**

Saez was subbing for Tyler Gaffalione, who was unseated from a 2-year-old shortly after the start of Saturday's (non-Claiming Crown) third race. Churchill's media team reported he had been transported the University of Louisville Hospital to evaluate hip and back pain.

Gaffalione's agent, Matt Muzikar, noted in an update Saturday afternoon that he would take off Sunday rides at Churchill Downs, but would return to riding next week, after all tests returned negative.

GUNS LOADED FIRES BACK AT SECOND ASKING IN 'RISING STAR' WIN AT CHURCHILL

Guns Loaded (Gun Runner), second behind GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity and GIII Street Sense Stakes fourth Dapper Moon (Malibu Moon) at Saratoga in August, fired back Saturday to become a new '**TDN Rising Star**' at Churchill Downs.

The 3-1 shot, who shortened from seven furlongs to six here for trainer Jose D'Angelo in his second try since bringing \$800,000 as a Keeneland September yearling last year, exploded from an outside gate and shot clear of drama to his inside as first-time starter **Shadow Coast** (West Coast) clipped heels in the opening jumps and dropped jockey Tyler Gaffalione. As the mostly inexperienced group sorted themselves out, Guns Loaded was already pushing the tempo up front under Luis Saez and had a comfortable cushion back to Castle Run (Daredevil) and **Brodeur** (Nyquist) on the run into the far turn. Only 6-5 race favorite Camp Hale (Mo Town) looked to have something left to challenge the leader with and came with a wide run past the quarter pole but was always chasing in vain as Guns Loaded refused to relinquish his advantage and rode the rail to a clear win. Shadow Coast was quickly apprehended by the outriders shortly after the incident while Gaffalione was transported to University of Louisville Hospital to evaluate hip and back pain. Gaffalione's agent Matt Muzikar noted in an update Saturday afternoon that he would take off Sunday rides but would return to riding next week after all negative tests.

The 16th 'Rising Star' for leading sire Gun Runner, Guns Loaded is the third foal and second winner for MGSP Sky My Sky who was a \$450,000 OBS April 2-year-old buy and placed in both the GIII Seaway Stakes and the GIII Old Forester Mint Julep

Handicap in her racing career. Second dam Dark Sky sold to Summer Wind Farm in 2011 for \$1.5m at KEENOV and the family includes French MG1SW Nebraska Tornado (Storm Cat) and MG1SW Westover (GB) (Frankel {GB}). Sky My Sky's yearling Curlin colt sold for \$535,000 at FTSAUG to Flying Dutchman and she foaled a full-sister to Guns Loaded this year before visiting Flameaway for 2025.

FROSTED FIRSTER GRAYSCALE RUNS TO THE MONEY, 'TDN RISING STAR' HONORS

eFive Racing Thoroughbred's **Grayscale** (c, 2, Frosted--Petunia, by Into Mischief) was pegged as the 8-5 morning-line favorite for Saturday's seventh race at Gulfstream, but his worktab--which included a bullet half-mile in :44 4/5 last month and other morning trials that screamed ready--dictated that he'd jump a much-shorter price for his career debut. Crunched into 3-10 for the Breeders' Cup-winning connections of trainer Saffie Joseph, Jr. and jockey Drayden Van Dyke, the gray colt made no mistake en route to being named the afternoon's second **'TDN Rising Star'**.

Away in mid-division from his low draw, Grayscale--equipped with a shadow roll for the debut--was ridden positively by Van Dyke to head off his rivals through an opening quarter mile that was timed in :22.28 over a surface that has been yielding below-par times over the last few days. Galloping along nicely in hand while maintaining a safe margin on his rivals, he turned for

home having gone the half in :46.68 and kicked home with powerful strides to score handily, covering the six furlongs in 1:11.42, a time that should grade out well.

On behalf of Bob Edwards's operation, Joseph paid \$240,000 for Grayscale at last year's Keeneland September Sale, the second-priciest of 66 Frosted yearlings (75 ring) reported as sold in 2023.

Inbred 4 x 4 to A.P. Indy and therefore 5 x 5 to Seattle Slew, Grayscale is a half-brother to Zoe's Prime (Bolt d'Oro), runner-up in Keeneland's Listed Limestone Stakes this past April. Grayscale is the second winner from as many runners for his unraced dam, whose youngest offspring include a yearling filly by Connect and a weanling colt by Mo Donegal. Petunia was most recently bred back to Frosted.

Grayscale is the fourth 'TDN Rising Star' for Frosted, who was also represented this season by Maymun.

Madaket Stables homebred Jack and Jim remained undefeated in his stakes debut after staging a prolonged rally under Manny Franco. Previously, he had won his debut in a Sept. 22 maiden over track and trip.

After taking a bump from Davy Crockett (Constitution) at the start, the 2-1 second choice in the field of 10 was settled three-wide while seven lengths behind pacesetting Not for Hire (Not This Time). He commenced his bid on the far turn and was guided five-wide into the stretch while advancing past foes. Responding generously to Franco's urging, he hit the front after sweeping past Sounds Like a Plan (Twirling Candy) approaching the sixteenth pole. Thereafter, he held the hard-charging duo of Smooth Breeze and Early Adopter (GB) safe and prevailed by a slowly-diminishing half-length.

Graham Motion, who also trained the winner's dam, said, "We put a ring bit on him just to make him a little bit more manageable and to keep him straight. It seemed to make a real difference. We got the jump on the favorite, which I think helped. Manny gave him a super ride." He continued, "I would imagine there's a shot we take him down to Florida at some

point, but I'm not in a big hurry. That's why I didn't run him back too soon – he's just a little light and he doesn't carry a lot of condition. He's a bit of a nervous horse I guess. I think hopefully we'll have him around for the nice races next summer."

His dam Monette, GSP & SW-Fr, \$96,879, won a Listed stakes at La Teste De Buch before being purchased privately by Madaket Stables LLC as a 2-year-old. In her US debut, she finished second, a head behind Lonely Road (Quality Road) in Belmont Park's 2018 GIII Matron Stakes. Jack and Jim is her first known foal. She has an unnamed yearling full-brother to Jack and Jim and produced a Drain the Clock filly this year. She was bred to Complexity for this term. Named a 'TDN Rising Star' for her 7 1/2-length romp at Keeneland in April, Shoot It True then took on the boys as the heavy favorite in the Kentucky Juvenile Stakes at Churchill Downs May 2 but weakened off the lead after fast fractions to finish fourth behind another classy filly in West Memorial (Caracaro). Unraced since that effort, she lined up again Saturday against the boys in her longest distance to date for Wesley Ward who opted to remove the blinkers for his 5-2 third choice. Sharp from the middle of the gate, Shoot It True went on

with it up front while dealing with a pesky Kenny Be past the half in :46.12. Never letting that rival by, she rode the rail around the far turn and responded in kind to rousing by Frankie Dettori by opening up down the lane, coming under the wire geared down while clearly the class of the field.

"She's a nice filly," said Ward. "She relaxed a lot more. Took the blinkers off, but if you see the first part of the race, she is pricking her ears - with the blinkers they don't do that, because they don't know who is around them. So that is the reason I did that. I told Dave Reid, the owner here, that we were maybe about 80 percent fit, but she is a really, really good filly. I think she is going to be a much better 3, 4-year-old filly. So this will be the last start of the year for her and we will bring her back in the spring. Won't see her again until either Keeneland in the spring or here in the spring."

One of 79 stakes winners for Munnings, Shoot It True was a \$340,000 yearling buy out of SARAUG for Preferred Equine. To the Moon Alice, a half-sister to GSW Unchained Melody (Smart Strike), saw her yearling Street Sense colt sell for \$120,000 also at SARAUG. Practical Dream faced down a trio of runners from Bob Baffert's stable and triumphed to earn her first black-type in the Desi Arnaz Stakes at Del Mar on Saturday.

The filly broke her maiden in gate to wire fashion to score by two lengths at the seaside oval Sept. 8. A runner-up to rival and chalk here Silent Law in the Anoakia Stakes at Santa Anita Oct. 25, the gray was tabbed as a 4-1 shot this time. Practical Dream dueled with Silent Law from the bell and the pair continued to battle up the backstretch. Gaining the advantage before the far turn, the juvenile kept to the task through the top of the lane and she could not be caught.

"The filly was sharp today and she's only going to improve with distance," said trainer Tim Yakteen. "She obviously showed up today. She had been doing very well for us. I'm glad Santa Anita was able to get the Anoakia race for us and help us set up for this race. I thought things looked well when we were lapped on to Silent Law early, but until you cross the wire and you're in front, you never know."

A half-sister to MSW Don'tsellmeshort (Benchmark) and MGISW Brother Derek (Benchmark), the winner's dam is responsible for a yearling filly by Tapwrit and she foaled a filly by Pinehurst May 4. Another manic sale season is upon us. Goffs kick-starts what promises to be an exciting few weeks with the November Foal Sale getting underway on Monday followed by the mares sessions on Friday and Saturday before the action rolls on to Tattersalls at Newmarket before concluding at Argana next month.

CLOTH OF STARS COLT LEADS THE WAY AT ARQANA NOVEMBER YEARLING SALE

A son of Cloth Of Stars (Ire) topped Argana's Flat yearling finale at €23,000 when selling to Clifton Farm.

Sold as lot 139 from Jedburgh Stud, he hails from the family of G1 Melbourne Cup second Heartbreak City (Fr) (Lando {Ger}), as well as Classic winners Paddington (GB) (Siyouni {Fr}) and Madelia (Fr) (Caro {Ire}).

The highest priced filly on the day was lot 137, a daughter of Saxon Warrior (Jpn) and Missisipi Baileys (Fr) (Aglaam (GB)) who was knocked down for €22,000 to Witold Miedzianowski. Consigned by Trois Chapelles, the bay is related to stakes winner and G1 Cheveley Park Stakes third Baileys Jubilee (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}).

Another son of Cloth Of Stars (Ire) (lot 118) brought the day's third dearest price, with DC Bloodstock signing the ticket for €18,000. The Haras de l'Hotellerie-consigned grey is out of a half-sister to listed winner and group placed Holy Moly (GB) (Mount Nelson {GB}).

Janda Bloodstock was the leading buyer with seven lots acquired for a gross of €52,000. Haras de Castillon was the leading consignor with 13 sold for an aggregate of €58,500.

At the close of trade for the November Yearling Sale, 117 sold from 160 offered (73.1%) for a gross of €600,500 (-36.8%). The average was €5,132 (-23.4%) and the median was €3,500 (-30%).

Where Does The Value Lie Cont. from p1

Gwen Monneraye of the La Motteraye Consignment, Mimi Wadham of WH Bloodstock and Tally-Ho Stud's Roger O'Callaghan weigh in on the big topics ahead of the breeding stock sales.

How do you look back at the European yearling sale market and what relevance do you think that will have on the breeding stock sales going forward?

Gwen Monneraye: The yearling sales this year were very different to 2023, especially here in France. In 2023, the August Sale at Arqana was crazy good and, like the rest of the European sales, things got a bit quieter after that. This year was the complete opposite. Nobody could have expected the trade that was at Newmarket and sadly we were not consigning there this year! It continued on to the October Yearling Sale in Arqana, which was very strong. But the August Sale was only okay. I don't know if all of that was to do with Amo Racing's investment, but it could be, because they put 25 million on the table and then the rest of the yearling sales became very strong. Before Newmarket, I was fully sure that the stallion men would be dropping their prices and that the broodmare market would be a buyers' market. Now, things are looking very different and I

am expecting strong trade for foals and mares.

Mimi Wadham: The yearling sales certainly picked up in October. It had been a bit worrying up until that point.

Doncaster was actually quite a good sale, Somerville was sketchy and then the August Sale at Arqana was down. We were taken by surprise by the strength of October and that was really down to the Amo contribution. A lot of people got very well paid for their yearlings and that will mean that the foals will be hard to buy over the coming weeks. It's going to be incredibly competitive at the top end of the market.

Roger O'Callaghan: I thought the yearling sales were pretty good. Kia [Joorabchian] brought great enthusiasm to Newmarket. We had a great sale at Donny and that set the tone for the year for us. If you have a nice horse, you will get well rewarded in the market at present.

Where do you think the value might lie at the breeding stock sales?

GM: It's becoming harder and harder to find value but, for me, you have to be at every sale and look at as many horses as possible to try to find value. **Cont. p4**



GM: At some stage you will find value doing that. Trying to predict where the value will lie beforehand is hard--hopefully it will lie at the La Motteraye Consignment!

MW: It's important to look at stallion numbers to see what sires have strong books of mares coming through. We try to follow the results on the track and not just follow the hype. It's easy to say what sire is popular now but the trick is to find the one who is going to be popular by the time the yearling sales roll around the following year. If you know a stallion has big two-year-old and three-year-old crops to run for

them in 2025, it could be a good time to buy a foal by them.

RO'C: We'll find that out in 12 months, won't we?! But if I had to say one area we've been lucky in, it would be buying maiden

mares off the track. We've put a lot of money into the fillies off the track in the past few years and that has been very lucky for

How do you approach the sales do you concentrate on pedigree, colts or filly foals, young or older mares, etc etc?

GM: We used to do a lot of pinhooking but now we concentrate mainly on buying mares. The pinhooking is becoming harder and harder and has got more risky. Also, it's something we feel that we don't have to do as much of because we have more mares and more land. We approach the sales more as broodmare buyers now. Of course

we do pedigree research but we try to be very open minded when it comes to buying mares. Everybody seems to be trying to buy the same horses so that's why you need to keep an open mind. Cont. p5



GM: We concentrate a lot on what the mares look like--good walk, depth, good shoulder and hind quarter etc. We try to invest in a bit of speed, also. We look at a lot and buy very few. In some years, we couldn't find any mares within our price bracket so recently we bought two very old mares who had produced some very good horses. The idea there was to try and produce a filly out of those mares and to race them. Eventually, those mares would join the breeding band. That has been working well so far so hopefully we could find some of the next generation of broodmares by doing that.

MW: We do all of the pedigree research first and whittle down a list. You have to be quite creative with pedigrees sometimes because you have to try and find some value. Certain sires who have fallen by the wayside, they won't work. We won't look at foals out of an exposed mare either. But we do look at a lot of foals--about 70 per cent of the catalogue, which is a lot of foals. The way the market is gone, it's all about sire power.

RO'C: Henry [O'Callaghan, brother] will have all of the pedigrees researched for us and it's just a matter of getting out and looking at as many horses as we can and buying what we like. We try to buy as many nice foals by our own stallions as we can. That's the least we can do when breeders choose to send their mares to us. We've spent a lot of money buying the stallions to start with, so, if we can't see it through, there's not much good in it, is there? It can be a busy few weeks but there's great entertainment in it all and we like to support the people who have supported us.

What young sires are you most looking forward to seeing the progeny of at the sales?

GM: It was a quiet year in France. We have Sealiway (Fr), a son of Galiway (GB), who was a Group 1 winner at two and three. He could be an exciting new sire in France. Regarding the sires abroad, we are looking forward to seeing the foals by Blackbeard (Ire). We have been using him and think he could be an interesting sire going forward. Baaeed (GB) as well. He was a champion of his generation and he is a stallion who is going to be popular.

MW: I am very excited to see the Baaeeds, however, I am disappointed by the number on offer. There are not very many in the sales. I am also really excited to see the Blackbeards as well.

RO'C: I mean this sincerely, but we like to buy foals that we



believe will run. That's the simple truth of it all. Then we will hone in on the stallions after that. Persian Force (Ire) and Perfect Power (Ire) will probably be our two, purely because we stand one and bred the other.

And then in terms of the movers and shakers that have been announced at stud in recent weeks, what grabbed your attention the most?

GM: I think Charyn (Ire) is going to be an exciting addition to Sumbe in France. He is an exceptional miler and it's quite rare to have a stallion of this calibre starting his career in France so we are extremely excited about that. We will be using him. Metropolitan (Fr) could also be exciting being a Classic-winning son of Zarak (Fr) and we have Puchkine (Fr), a son of Starspangledbanner (Aus), who could be quite interesting as well. There are some new stallions in England and Ireland that are quite interesting, including some of the new horses at Tally-Ho Stud and Vandeek (GB) at Cheveley Park Stud.

MW: Of the stallions that have just gone to stud, nothing springs to mind but, in terms of value, I really think that Ghaiyyath (Ire) and Study Of Man (Ire) are very reasonably priced. I am hoping to send a mare to each of those. **Cont. p6**

RO'C: I'm going to say Bucanero Fuerte (GB). He was the second-highest rated two-year-old in Europe last season and beat Porta Fortuna (Ire) by four lengths in a Group 1. I'd like him. I like his pedigree and his Daddy is doing well. On his day, he was a very smart horse and you could say he's a bit of a forgotten horse so he's the one who floats my boat. Outside of him, we only bid for one horse this year, and that was Big Evs (Ire). Once we had him secured, we were happy and sat on our hands.

Where do you stand with the current crop of first-season sires?

GM: I'm afraid that I am going to be talking about France again because I was very excited about Hello Youmzain (Fr) at the start of the year and I like what has happened with him. I also like the end of the season that Pinatubo (Ire) has had. We were not expecting him to have Royal Ascot two-year-olds and it's good that he had a Listed winner in France recently. I like the progeny of Mohaather (GB) and, of course, Kameko has had a Group 1 winner so he is a stallion to monitor closely as well. There is no standout but I would give them all a chance for next year.

MW: We feel slightly hard done by with Ghaiyyath as we sold a lovely filly by him at Book 2 but felt we probably could have got more for her. The sire has since had a slew of winners and is probably more popular now than during the sale. We are going to stay loyal to him and he could be the one to repay people's faith.

RO'C: Hello Youmzain is the one, isn't he? He's the one I like. He was a good racehorse, everyone sent mares to him and supported him and now he's coming up trumps. **Cont. p7**

MW: If I can't say Violet Hesketh [partner in WH Bloodstock], I will nominate Jamie McCalmont for the mare and Kelsey Lupo for the foal.

GM: At the top level, I would have to say Wootton Bassett (GB) because I have a close relationship with him and have been using him from the start and been very lucky with him. In the middle, I will be with Charyn, even though he is not proven and then at the lower end, I am a big fan of Oasis Dream (GB). I know he is getting on in years but, if you got a filly by him, he would be very good value at £15,000.

MW: Night Of Thunder (Ire) is an exceptional sire and we've been lucky with him so I'll nominate

him at the top end of the market while Study Of Man and Cotai Glory (GB) are good value at £25,000 and €15,000 respectively.

"At the top of the straight, it could have gotten ugly, but Group 1 jockeys make Group 1 decisions and Josh got a lovely run through on the inside.

"Big thanks to Dave (Ellis), who bought the filly without any owners. It takes great nerve to buy the ones you want, and full credit to Karyn (Fenton-Ellis) for filling the syndicate. It's been an interrupted preparation for Captured By Love, but the 1000 Guineas was the one we wanted.

"Full credit to Sam (Bergerson, co-trainer), as I've spent a lot of time at our Melbourne stable during the spring. He held his nerve by not giving her a hard gallop on Tuesday, just didn't think she needed it, and the result was a very satisfying win for everyone involved.

"She's only going to improve heading into the autumn, so very exciting times ahead."


