



SAFFIE JOSEPH, JR. UNVEILS PAIR OF 'TDN RISING STARS'

Though he won the 2022 GI Florida Derby with White Abarrio (Race Day), Saffie Joseph, Jr. isn't necessarily thought of as someone to fear on the roads to the GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Kentucky Derby. His bread and butter remains claimers and tough older horses like the now 5-year-old White Abbario and Skippylongstocking (Exaggerator), who won this year's GII Oaklawn Handicap and the GII Charles Town Classic Stakes.

But that may be about to change. It's early yet and Todd Pletcher has yet to send his first string to Palm Beach Downs and Bob Baffert will be welcomed back this year at Churchill Downs, where his starters could include GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Citizen Bull (Into Mischief). But Joseph appears to have at least two 2-year-olds who will certainly be heard from again. On back-to-back days he had two 'TDN Rising Stars'.

On Friday, **Rojo Rita** (Volatile) won a maiden special weight race by 16 1/4 lengths. The time was 1:11.43 and she got an 83 Beyer. Neither of those numbers are that exceptional, but the way she ran was. With Edgard Zayas aboard, she opened up by two lengths down the backstretch before exploding in the stretch to pull away.

"She was training well," Joseph said. "She worked within herself." **Cont. p3**

GUN RUNNER'S 'RISING STAR' BULLARD TROUNCES BOB HOPE FIELD by Jill Williams

In the first domestic graded race for juveniles since the Breeders' Cup a little more than two weeks ago, 'TDN Rising Star' Bullard (Gun Runner) stayed unbeaten to capture Del Mar's GIII Bob Hope Stakes Sunday. The \$675,000 Keeneland September purchase had gone to the post favored over highly regarded GI Del Mar Futurity runner-up and GI American Pharoah Stakes third McKinzie Street (McKinzie), who would hit the board once again.

Umberto Rispoli, who has been aboard in both of Bullard's two career starts, was immediately effusive in his praise of the colt.

"I just think he is a horse that deserves a bit more distance. Look he hacked, he moved, he gallops like a good horse, like a great horse," said Rispoli. "He is a horse who has shown us who he is only at his second start. He needs to figure out what is really going on with horse racing." **Cont. p5**



Joseph continued: "We never really let her run in the mornings because she is so quick. You never think you're going to win first time out by 16 lengths. Sometimes you think you're going to win first time out and it doesn't happen. She ran well and she ran beyond our expectations."

The daughter of freshman sire Volatile (Violence) hasn't yet convinced Joseph that she is the type of horse who can make the nine-furlong Kentucky Oaks.

"That's hard to say," he said. "She's by Volatile, so you think speed and sprinting. So I wouldn't say just yet that she will go long. Going forward she'll need to show us she can go a distance. She looks more like a sprinter type."

Joseph said he hasn't yet mapped out a schedule for Rojo Rita, but said the Jan. 1 Cash Run Stakes at Gulfstream,, which is run at a mile, is a possibility.

Some 24 hours later, the rumor out of Gulfstream was that **Grayscale** (Frosted) was Joseph's best 2-year-old colt, and he lived up to the hype. Sent off at 3-10 and ridden by Drayden Van Dyke, he won by 4 1/2 lengths and was never really challenged. Grayscale is owned by e Five Racing and cost \$240,000 at Keeneland September.

"He had worked very quick," Joseph said. "He always showed promise. In his first breeze he got beat and he never got beat in

a breeze again. He has a lot of talent and has learned quickly. We're excited to have gotten him started. This is a very promising horse. He's push button. He will go as fast as you want or as slow as you want. He can gallop as slow as you want and fast as you want when he turns it on. Obviously, his future is very bright."

Grayscale was given an 86 Beyer figure.

The workout pattern on Grayscale was a tip off. He had had four bullet workouts including a four-furlong move on Oct. 20 in 44.80.

"It was supposed to be a strong work," Joseph said. "Drayden worked him that day and he couldn't believe he went in :44 4/5. They were letting him run, but within reason. But the time is legit."

Joseph isn't sure what's next for Grayscale, but don't be surprised if he eventually winds up in races like the GII Fountain of Youth Stakes or the GI Florida Derby.

"The next race will let us know what kind of talent we really have," Joseph said. "He'll have to face winners and that's where you find out if they are real prospects or just OK prospects. We are very optimistic with both of them."

Joseph said he has at least one more 2-year-old that bears watching. That is the unraced colt Thought Control (Gun Runner). *Cont.*



On Tamara, The Jury Is Out

Certainly it was disappointing to see 'TDN Rising Star' Tamara (Bolt d'Oro) lose in her comeback race on Friday at Del Mar, even if she did get beat by the undefeated filly Sandy Bottom (Omaha Beach) and only lost by a nose. Tamara, the daughter of the great Beholder (Henny Hughes), was all the rage after she won the 2023 GI Del Mar Debutante by 6 3/4 lengths.

The 4-5 favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, she finished seventh in that race. After the race it was discovered that she had a fractured splint bone in her left leg.

So Tamara was coming off an injury and had had a year off, reasons why she might not have been at her best on this day. But there can be no excuses next time when she starts in the Dec. 26 GI La Brea Stakes at Santa Anita. She needs not only to win but to win impressively to get the hype machine going again.

Meanwhile, the winner, Sandy Bottom (Omaha Beach) is also being pointed to the La Brea. Also coming off a long layoff of more than a year, the winner of the Anoakia Stakes for trainer Michael McCarthy could very well be the real deal.

Nobals Shows Some

Coming into Saturday's GII Kennedy Road Stakes at Woodbine, it appeared that **Nobals** (Noble Mission {GB}) had lost a step. After winning the 2023 GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, he had failed to hit the board in all three of his starts this year. Now it looks like the mojo is back. He won the Kennedy Road by three-quarters of a length and beat the star Canadian sprinter Patches O'Houlihan (Reload), who came into the race with a record of 11-for-13, in the process. **Cont.**

Rispoli continued: "Everything is about learning for him. Once he understands how this all really works, I think he is going to improve, improve, and improve. I don't think it was his best today."

Just like in his only previous start--a win at six furlongs over the Del Mar surface Sept. 1--Bullard trailed early before unleashing a closing kick that likely has his connections itching to try him at longer distances. In the Bob Hope, daylight maiden winner Maximus (Maximus Mischief) was quickest to the front, but was soon joined by another open-daylight winner in Kalea Bay (Authentic), as well as McKinzie Street. Meanwhile, Bullard lacked the same early speed of his contemporaries, trailing about five or six lengths back as Kalea Bay recorded a crisp first quarter in :21.63. Bullard continued to amble along at the back as McKinzie Street shook clear up front and blazed through a half in :43.93. Even as Bullard stayed at the rear, his stride noticeably lengthened and--more telling--he was doing it easily. The dark bay swung wide, pulled alonsigside McKinzie Street as he paused before switching to his proper lead, and suddenly found another gear to blow by his more experienced rival. Other than one left-handed suggestion before he'd swapped leads, Rispoli essentially hand rode Bullard down the lane and relaxed several strides before the wire. Cont.

Clear by 4 3/4 lengths at the finish, Bullard galloped out with his ears pricked as career debuter **Madaket Road** (Quality Road) finished second and McKinzie Street held for third.

Owned by St. Elias Stable, Talla Racing LLC, Three Chimneys Farm, and West Point Thoroughbreds, Bullard earned 'Rising Star' honors, as well as a Bob Hope field co-highest Beyer Speed Figure of 84, when unveiled Sept. 1. The dark bay was the second Bob Hope winner for trainer Michael McCarthy, who incidentally won the first black-type race of his career in the 2014 Bob Hope with No Problem (Munnings). Two races prior to the 2024 Bob Hope, McCarthy warmed up in the Del Mar winner's circle with another promising 2-year-old colt in Journalism (Curlin).

Pedigree Notes:

Bullard makes it 25 graded winners in just four crops to race for exceptional Three Chimneys Farm sire Gun Runner, who will stand for an advertised \$250,000 in 2025. Gun Runner, the 2017 Horse of the Year, is currently second on North America's 2024 leading sires list. Among his 15 other 'Rising Stars' and 33 other black-type winners are GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Sierra Leone and late champion Echo Zulu. The chestnut just added another 'Rising Star' Saturday at Churchill Downs with Guns Loaded.

By the pensioned Pennsylvania stallion Warrior's Reward, who has 14 stakes winners out of his daughters, Bullard's dam Reve d'Amour was unraced but already has produced two stakes winners from five foals to race, including Ellis Park track record setter Mundaye Call (Into Mischief). A half to GSW Can the Man (Into Mischief) out of French MGSW and English G1SP Smolensk (Danzig), Reve d'Amour is a granddaughter of GI Kentucky Oaks winner Blush With Pride (Blushing Groom {Fr}), the stellar broodmare best known as the dam of Broodmare of the Year and \$14-million Fasig-Tipton buy Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister). It's a deep family littered with champions, Classic winners, sires, stars in the sales ring, and more.

Reve d'Amour has not had a foal since Bullard and has again been reported as barren for 2025.

HORSE EUTHANIZED AFTER LAST RACE AT WOODBINE ON SATURDAY, TRACK DEEMED SAFE BY AGCO FOR SUNDAY

During the finale of a 12-race card at Woodbine Racetrack on Saturday, Flawless Ruler (Honor Code) was eased at the top of the lane during a \$15,000 claimer going a mile and a sixteenth over the all-weather course, was vanned off, and after an examination by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO)-licensed veterinarians at the barn, the 5-year-old gelding was humanely euthanized, the track said via a press release late Saturday.

Following a thorough investigation of the incident, the veterinarians concluded that the injury was unlikely to be a result of track conditions. With the concurrence of the AGCO and communication with the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA) and the Jockeys' Guild, it was decided that training would proceed as scheduled on Sunday morning.

Following safety concerns with track conditions last weekend after three breakdowns--one during training on Saturday and two on the card that same day--which led to the cancellation of two races on Saturday and the entire Sunday schedule, Woodbine and its Tapeta consultants worked to improve the track conditions and return the surface to its optimal condition for safe training and racing.



Following the approval of the AGCO, Woodbine resumed racing on Thursday, which continued on Friday and into Saturday.

Owned by Bruno Schickedanz and trained by Norman McKnight, Flawless Ruler raced 20 times prior to Saturday's start and was claimed from CamHaven Farms and trainer Steve Flint for \$15,000 at Woodbine Sept. 29. The horse's jockey, Keveh Nicholls, was unharmed during the incident.

CANADIAN CHAMPION TYSON TO TAKE UP STUD DUTY AT STONE JUG IN PA

Canadian champion Tyson (by Tapit), purchased for \$175,000 by Darryl and Jill Myers when topping the final session of last week's Keeneland November sale, will stand his first season at the couple's Stone Jug Ranch which is a new Thoroughbred operation in Dillsburg, Pennsylvania, the breeders said in a release on Sunday.

"We've talked about [standing stallions] in the past," said the Myers's bloodstock advisor Ed Price. "But things got serious a week or two ago when we saw this horse."

Bred and raced by Hill 'n' Dale Equine and Stretch Run Ventures, Tyson retires as Canada's 2023 Sovereign award-winning older horse. Last year as a 4-year-old, the Josie Carroll trainee went back-to-back at Woodbine by winning the GIII Dominion Day Stakes and GII Seagram Cup Stakes, and then was third in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Saratoga. The homebred retires with earnings of \$378,548.

"He's by a very successful sire of sires, Tapit," said Price. "It's one of the strongest modern-day female families, with Rags to Riches, Arcangelo. [His third dam, Broodmare of the Year] Better Than Honour was the most expensive broodmare ever sold, at \$14 million. *Cont.*

"Plus the fact that he had a lot of racing ability, he won four of his first five starts, was a Grade II and Grade III winner, and was third, beaten around three lengths in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. And his foals will be eligible to race in the PA-Sired/PA-Bred Series."

One of 10 Tapit champions (from 175 stakes winners), Tyson is the first foal for Honouring, a Smart Strike winning full-sister to GISW Streaming and SW Treasuring. Another half-sister, Modeling (Tapit), is the dam of Eclipse winner Arcangelo (Arrogate). Honouring's next two foals, both by Tapit, were six-figure sales yearlings at Keeneland.

"Tyson will become one of the six new stallions to date for the 2025 Pennsylvania breeding season," said Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association Executive Secretary Brian Sanfratello. "Thanks goes out to the Myers for their dedication to Pennsylvania breeding with the opening of their new stallion farm. Tyson should fit in very well and I wish Darryl and Jill good luck in their new endeavor."

The Stone Jug addition is expected to arrive at the new stallion farm in a few weeks. A stud fee and terms will be named at a later date.

"I felt very good about this filly. I wasn't as sure about the colt yesterday [Jack and Jim] just because it was a big step up, but this filly just trained so well," said trainer Graham Motion. "She's a real pro.

"I think I feel the same about her as I do the colt--obviously, she'll end up in Florida, but I'm not in a big hurry to run her," said Motion. "I think she can have a big year next year. There's so many nice races for these 3-year-olds on the grass, and to have one for each division would be a dream. It's exciting."

The winner's dam produced a colt by Space Blues (Ire) last year, which is her last reported registered foal. She was not bred for 2025. Bari counts as a half-sister English stakes placed La Spezia (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who is the dam of English group stakes winner Thomas Hobson (GB) (Halling).

Stepped up in distance while facing New York-breds in each of her three prior starts, she cut back here to six furlongs (her winning debut distance) off the one-mile Maid of the Mist Stakes Oct. 27. Kept in this spot instead of chasing open company in next month's GII Demoiselle Stakes, With the Angels took all the money as the 1-5 chalk but, for the first time, didn't break on top from her rail draw and had to settle back while a close-up fifth. Tipped out off the fence around the far turn, she began to inch forward in pursuit of Stone Smuggler who turned for home on the lead. Fanned out five across at the furlong marker, With the Angels showed her class while clearing off inside the final sixteenth to stay perfect.

"I told [jockey] Jose [Ortiz] the one hole kind of wasn't ideal, and I anticipated a lot of speed in this race and that it was probable we'd want to take the opportunity to sit off of it and see how she [With the Angels] handled that," said winning trainer Linda Rice, who also noted that future goals for her 'Rising Star' included starts in the Bouwerie, the Test and the Victory Ride. I think keeping her from six [furlongs] to a mile, six and a half or seven might be her sweet spot – who knows. We'll find out in the long run. Today she was running on the end of it like she almost needed a little more ground to get there – I was concerned. I would say we'll probably keep her a one-turn six-to-a-mile this coming season unless we start to see other things. It's a great way to cap off her 2-year-old season, so we'll send her home and give her a couple months off."

One of 12 stakes winners for Omaha Beach, With the Angels was a \$350,000 OBS April purchase for Justin Casse and is her dam's second stakes winner, joining SP Maggy's Palace (Palace Malice). 

He said, "Goffs has been a very lucky place for us. The Blue Point and the Ghaiyyath selling in 2022 was a magic day but we've been fortunate to have had a few more six-figure foals sell here as well."


Mullins added, "We're very positive about this year's draft. It has been quite busy over the past couple of days so you'd have to be optimistic. Pinhookers and end users will live and die by the decisions they make between Monday and Thursday, where close to 1,000 foals will be offered under the hammer. Any person who can turn a €200 foal into a €18,000 yearling knows what they are doing and that's exactly what Sarah Dempsey of Tincoon Stables did at the Goffs Autumn Yearling Sale with a colt by Lope Y Fernandez (Ire). That result among others has provided Dempsey with an opportunity to dig a little deeper this week but, make no mistake, she will not be venturing too far away from what has proved to be a tried and trusted model in unearthing value at the middle to lower end of the market.

She explained, "We've been pinhooking for the past couple of years and it's definitely working. If we see a chancy foal that walks at small money, we are willing to take a punt. The sire doesn't really bother me but they have to walk. You'll always sell a nice horse regardless of what they are by. We started off with one or two and this year we sold four yearlings. We'd like to expand it and are planning to buy a few more this year."

Dempsey continued, "The Lope Y Fernandez was very cheap but we knew that there was improvement in him. He turned inside out for us and it was an amazing result. We couldn't believe it. We have a bigger budget this year as a result but we won't be losing the run of ourselves--we're still searching for a bargain. We know that we are able to buy nice horses and we might try to up the level a small bit this year but we won't be changing tack too much. Really, it's all about getting out and seeing as many horses as possible and hoping that one or two might slip through the cracks."

Indeed, Dempsey is not the only pinhooker who faces into Goffs with something of a war chest. The strength of this year's yearling market, particularly from the Orby Sale onwards, put a very good look on the year for many traders. **Cont. p4**

Nobody is more aware of this than Goffs chief executive Henry Beeby, who is expecting bountiful trade for the foals right through to the mares session on Friday and Saturday.

He said, "This is a sale we are very proud of and it has the cream of the Irish foal crop. The best Irish foals come here because we deliver every year. The place is absolutely buzzing

today [Sunday] and every vendor I have spoken to can't believe the footfall. There is an international audience here, all of the Irish and English pinhookers are here and there is some Japanese interest as well. We're just after having a yearling sale season that appeared to get stronger and stronger and that would give hope that pinhookers will get stuck in and you'd hope that there are also plenty of end users who will see the value towards the top end of the market as well."

As well as foals by top notch stallions Blue Point (Ire), Camelot (GB), Havana Grey (GB), Mehmas (Ire), Kingman (GB), Lope De Vega (Ire), No Nay Never, Night Of Thunder (Ire), Wootton Bassett (GB) and more, for many buyers, this week will provide the first glimpse of some of the potential stars of the future, with foals by Minzaal (Ire), Blackbeard (Ire) and Bayside Boy (Ire) to name but a few on show.

And while Goffs may not have the spellbinding Niarchos draft to look forward to this week, there are some big-name mares on show--none more captivating than Gouache (Ger) (Shamardal), the dam of Japan Cup-bound Goliath (Ger) (Adlerflug {Ger}).

Beeby concluded, "It's fair to say we will have to wait a long time to have a sale like last year's mares' sale. If you strip out the Niarchos draft from last year, we still had a good sale. We have a good catalogue this year with a lot of highlights in there, including the dam of Goliath, who is one of the jewels in the crown. But only one jewel. There are several others who are going to attract plenty of attention. We expect a big international audience for the mares session and they will possibly come for the Wednesday foals as well. We're hopeful."



CHAPEL STUD ANNOUNCE DEATH OF PROMISING JUMPS SIRE WALZERTAKT

Chapel Stud's National Hunt stallion Walzertakt (Ger) has died following a freak accident, the operation announced on Sunday.

Roisin Close, Chapel Stud manager, said, "Unfortunately, Walzertakt incurred an accident whilst receiving rehab in preparation to stand next season and despite everyone's best efforts to save him he had to be put to sleep. We extend our condolences to Simon Davies at DahlBury, on whose behalf we stood him. Known as 'Walt' to all of us in the yard, his presence will be greatly missed."

Simon Davies added, "We are devastated with the news of the freak accident to Walzertakt and saddened mainly for Roisin and the team that looked after him. He was a stallion with great potential and temperament who was only just getting going in Britain."

Walzertakt was a high-class stayer on the Flat for Jean-Pierre Carvalho, notably winning the G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil and G3 Prix Gladiateur as a six-year-old in 2015. He was retired to Haras de la Hetraie ahead of the 2017 breeding season, before moving to Haras de la Croix Sonnet where he stood for four consecutive seasons until arriving at Chapel Stud for 2022.



SOUL RUSH FINALLY GETS HIS GROUP 1 TITLE IN MILE CHAMPIONSHIP

The 41st running of the G1 Mile Championship was a salty one, and when the dust settled, it was **Soul Rush (Jpn)** (Rulership {Jpn}) who came out on top to claim his first victory at the highest level in the autumn highlight at Kyoto on Sunday.

The fourth betting choice faced a line up which included defending champion **Namur (Jpn)** (Harbinger {GB}), who had last been seen in a runner-up effort in the G1 Yasuda Kinen, as well as European multiple Group 1 winner **Charyn (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}). Soul Rush was entering this contest after a second-place finish in the G2 Fuji Stakes at Tokyo and a third behind three-time Hong Kong champion, multiple Group 1 winning Romantic Warrior (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) and Namur in that Yasuda Kinen.

Soul Rush broke well with the line and was reserved in midpack as frontrunner **Balsam Note (Jpn)** (Maurice {Jpn}) stepped out to set a moderate early tempo. Positions didn't change much until they swung through the turn and the field fanned out for the final stretch. Still in fifth as the sprint for the line began in earnest, Soul Rush produced a ferocious kick down the center of the course to overtake **Win Marvel (Jpn)** (I'll Have Another) and it was how much he wanted to win by from there. With a jubilant Taisei Danno in the saddle, he was 2 1/2 lengths clear of **Elton Barows (Jpn)** (Deep Brillante {Jpn}) as that one just got up over Win Marvel for second. Betting favourite **Brede Weg (Jpn)** (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}) ran fourth as Charyn put in a respectable effort to claim fifth. Namur came in a distant last.

The final time was 1:32.00, just .70 seconds off the course record of 1:31.30 and .50 off the race record set by Danon Shark (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in 2014.

"I feel great," said Danno afterwards. "I was initially thinking of positioning him further in front, but racing among such strong contenders, sitting in an ideal position wasn't so easy. However, with some of the key members within eye sight, I kept cool and waited for the moment.

"His movement was really good and he wanted to make his move rather early but I let him go as he pleased and he continued to respond really well. In the end [with a good 2-1/2 lengths between us and the rest of the field] I couldn't hear any thundering hooves from behind, only the cheering crowd."

Of Charyn's fifth-place finish as the only overseas contender, trainer Roger Varian was largely happy with the effort, even if the result was not what they'd hoped for.



"He ran a very good race but he was slow coming out of the gate, so the first furlong cost him in the end--you get behind and [go] wide around the whole field," said Varian. "After the start, he wasn't able to secure a good position and afterwards, it was always going to be hard work for him.

"He finished strong, so I thought the horse performed very well--in defeat he proved himself to be very good horse. We have to accept the results although it is disappointing because we came here to win.

"It has been a fantastic year for this horse to win three mile Group 1 races in Europe, and we wanted to finish with another win here, but it did not happen. It still was a very good race--in my opinion, just the start cost him."

Jockey Ryan Moore added, "He couldn't make a good jump at the start and had to race behind, but despite the disadvantages, he gave a terrific effort at the straight." Cont. p12

Pedigree Notes

Out of a placed mare in Japan, Soul Rush is her first offspring to the races and the most accomplished thus far. He does have a half-brother named Dio (Jpn) (Leontes (Jpn)) who claimed a group placing when running second in the G3 Sekiya Kinen this past August. That sibling is a Listed winner after taking the Kochi Stakes in March. Their dam Eternal Bouquet has an unraced 3year-old in-training named Ambassador (Jpn) (Makfi {GB}). She did not produce a foal in 2022 after visiting Epiphaneia (Jpn), but has delivered a 2024 colt by Kiseki (Jpn)--a son of Rulership who won the G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St. Leger) and was five times Group 1-place in Japan. Kiseki made 10 appearances at the elite level in total and was placed in Group company 11 times including once in France.

The female family is internationally busy as there are runners at the group and graded levels in no less than five countries through the generations. Second dam Cat Ali (Storm Cat) produced G2 TV Tokyo Hai Aoba Sho winner Hiraboku Deep (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) as well as the dam of American Listed winner Union Express (Unbridled Express). Third dam Careless Kitten (Caro {Ire}) produced multiple group winner Arkadian Hero (Trempolino) as well as GII Breeders' Futurity second Lorenzoni (Clever Trick), both of whom became sires. Through her daughters, she has several branching lines with those families producing at least eight black-type earners and a threetime Slovakian champion mare.

This is the distant female line of Group 1/Grade I runners Field Cat (Herbager); European champion 2-year-old Hold That Tiger (Storm Cat); Editor's Note (Forty Niner); Springing Leopard (Hawaii) and his full-sister Island Kitty; Hennessy (Storm Cat); Pearl City (Carson City); U.S. champion 2-year-old filly Family Style (State Dinner); and Lost Kitty (Magesterial).

Reigning Hong Kong Horse of the Year Romantic Warrior (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) and emerging sprint star Ka Ying Rising (NZ) (Shamexpress {NZ}) laid down their markers for the Longines Hong Kong International Races meeting in three weeks' time with arrogant victories in Sunday's G2 BOCHK Jockey Club Cup and G2 BOCHK Private Banking Jockey Club Sprint at Sha Tin Racecourse, respectively. The second-named saw the 1200metre course record, held for the last 17 years by the outstanding Sacred Kingdom (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), come tumbling down in a sublime performance from one of the world's top sprinters.

A 300,000gns graduate of the 2019 Tattersalls October sale, Romantic Warrior was having his first run since taking out the G1 Yasuda Kinen in Tokyo June 2, the form of which was franked a few hours earlier when the third home that afternoon, Soul Rush (Jpn) (Rulership (Jpn)), proved an impressive winner of the G1 Mile Championship at Kyoto. First to break the line, Romantic Warrior was a forward factor into the first bend while a fraction keen, then settled in midfield as **Sword Point (Aus)** (American Pharoah) rolled up to see them off turning up the backstretch. Enjoying a rail-skimming trip throughout, the 6-year-old was gently ridden along 800 metres out to pinch a bit of ground on the second bend, and he was steered out into the four path nearing the straight. Beating **Money Catcher (NZ)** (Ferlax {NZ}) to that spot, Romantic Warrior went to Sword Point with about 300 metres to travel and enjoyed a pat down his neck from James McDonald while well clear, saving something for the G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup on Dec. 8. **Ka Ying Generation (Ire)** (Churchill {Ire}) made it an Irishbred 1-2, while **Nimble Nimbus (NZ)** (Sacred Falls {NZ}) got home just ahead of **Ensued** (Lemon Drop Kid) for third.

Fresh off another monstrous Melbourne Cup carnival, McDonald is back in Hong Kong for a five-week stint, and clearly remains in awe of Romantic Warrior.

"He's like the prize fighter, isn't he? Heavyweight champion of the world," McDonald said. "You never really get nervous on him because he's so good. He's an incredible horse. I love him to bits and he's very good.

"You still got to go out and do it and (from) barrier one, you're dictated to a little bit but he's just so good--he can get you out of situations that other horses can't. Just a phenomenal horse, I'm so proud of him. He's come back in terrific order, he never lets you down ever and he's just got this amazing will to win. It's something I've never come across."

Trainer Danny Shum will vaccinate Romantic Warrior for a potential Middle East sojourn following the Hong Kong Cup, to include possible appearances in the G1 Saudi Cup and G1 Dubai World Cup. Romantic Warrior's first two dams are by World Cup winners.

"It will be tough for him and the team not only in the next few weeks, but the next six months," Shum said. "If he runs good on Dec. 8, the owner, Peter (Lau), is really keen to go (overseas). He deserves to have try. It's once-in-a-lifetime."

A 'Rising' Force

It has been 22 years since legendary trainer David Hayes sent out his only winner to date at the International Races meeting when All Thrills Too (Aus) (St Covet {Aus}) validated \$3.90 (29-10) favouritism in the Hong Kong Sprint. In the form of **Ka Ying Rising**, he'll be sending out a much shorter-priced proposition to add to that total after the 4-year-old shaved 0.07 seconds off Sacred Kingdom's course record set in the G2 BOCHK Private Banking Jockey Club Sprint in 2007.

"You've got to be pretty good to get the course record at Sha Tin when you see all these wonderful, promising horses racing on fast ground," said Hayes. "To have your horse in the book is a bit of a thrill."

Off at a dime on the dollar while in search of his seventh win on the trot, Ka Ying Rising was ridden aggressively from stall 10 by Zac Purton, but was content to ease back into third and allow Victor the Winner (Aus) (Toronado {Ire})--a Group 1 winner locally and placed at the top level in Japan--to take up the running into the turn. Eyeballing that rival and the pace-pressing Copartner Prance (Aus) (Epaulette {Aus}) approaching the entrance to the straight, the chalk ambled up to them with Purton swinging off him and when given his cue at the 300 metres, opening an unassailable advantage, allowing Purton a chance to admire the horse power underneath him with a premature salute.

"I knew it was a track record, so I thought I would seal it with a kiss," Purton said of his celebration. "It's getting scary now how good he's becoming and how easily he's doing it. It's a nice top-up run for the big one next month.

"He's just perfect to ride. He's got great gate speed, he relaxes beautifully mid-race and he's got a great turn of foot--it's everything you need in a sprinter. He hasn't won at Group 1 level yet, so he's still got to do a bit."

Galaxy Patch Watches 'Bubble' Burst

Galaxy Patch (Aus) (Wandjina {Aus}) is the heir-apparent to Golden Sixty (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro) in the local mile division, but Voyage Bubble (Aus) (Deep Field {Aus}) put a bit of a dent into his lofty reputation with a mild upset in Sunday's G2 BOCHK Private Wealth Jockey Club Mile.

Having earned elite-level glory in last year's Stewards' Cup and placings in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile and G1 FWD Champions Mile, Voyage Bubble was sent off as the \$3.50 (5-2) clear market rival to Galaxy Patch (\$1.70) and jumped well from an outside alley before setting up camp just off the flank of Champions Mile hero **Beauty Eternal (Aus)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}). Galaxy Patch was off to a slow start and anchored himself towards the back of the pack for the run down the back.

Three wide with cover after being asked to move early by Vincent Ho, Galaxy Patch looked to steady off heels midway on the turn and was flushed four deep as Voyage Bubble and McDonald waited to make their move. Easily claiming the frontrunner in upper stretch, Voyage Bubble opened a good break and was never in serious danger as perfect-trip **Chancheng Glory** (Mor Spirit) turned in a characteristically honest effort for second. Galaxy Patch was forced to settle for third.

"We think there is still a little something left in him left to come," winning trainer Ricky Yiu said. "Yes (I was confident). Even though he finished second (first-up), I think he was only 75 or 80% fit and that (the) race would bring him on.

"James knows him really well and with a small field we made the right decision to bring him forward and travel in a positive position. He managed to win it in quite comfortable style."
