



FIRST RESORT GIVES GODOLPHIN 2YO GRADED SWEEP AT CHURCHILL

First Resort (Uncle Mo) sat a perfect, stalking trip beneath Luis Saez and held off a late rally from the odds-on 'TDN Rising Star' Jonathan's Way (Vekoma) to give Godolphin a sweep of Saturday's graded races for 2-year-olds in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes at Churchill Downs. With the victory, First Resort collected 10 points on the Road to the Kentucky Derby.

Off to a good start from his outside draw racing beneath the lights, the homebred was placed in a fantastic spot in second by Saez to press the pace outside of longshot leader **Dapper Moon** (Malibu Moon).

Saez hit the gas on the far turn and First Resort responded to strike the front three furlongs from home. The 6-1 chance cornered for home as the one to catch, opened an imposing advantage in the final furlong and continued on powerfully to score by 2 1/4 lengths.

Jonathan's Way, winner of the GIII Iroquois Stakes and a disappointing seventh at a well-backed 5-1 in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, was away a bit awkwardly from his inside draw and was hard held by Joel Rosario while surrounded by horses racing in fifth for most of the way. Tipped out and into the clear leaving the quarter pole, Jonathan's Way rallied nicely in the stretch, but was never a serious threat to the winner. **Cont. p3**

FORMIDABLE MAN LANDS HOLLYWOOD DERBY FOR CITY OF LIGHT CONNECTIONS

East Coast-based horses had won the GI Hollywood Derby in six of the last eight years and three of the last four, but it was a California 1-2 in Saturday's renewal at Del Mar, as William and Suzanne Warren's Formidable Man (City of Light) parlayed a perfect trip in the box seat into a clear-cut victory over King of Gosford (GB) (Zoustar {Aus}). 'TDN Rising Star' Donegal Momentum (Uncle Mo) broke best of all and led the Hollywood Derby field down the chute, but Rothschild (Uncle Mo)--also ridden positively by Flavien Prat--had command linking up with the course proper before the New Yorker asserted again and was back in front passing the six-furlong peg. A debut winner as the favorite sprinting in the Ellis mud July 5, First Resort set a pressured pace and was a solid second in the GII Saratoga Special Stakes Aug. 10. He switched to grass with a fourth-place finish in the GI Summer Stakes at Woodbine last time Sept. 14. He was making his two-turn debut in the Kentucky Jockey Club.

Trainer Eoin Harty was winning his first graded race in nearly

four years after saddling First Resort's dam to win the 2020 GI La Brea Stakes.

"He displayed his versatility today trying two turns for the first time," Harty said. "Initially, I thought he'd be a little farther back, but after I saw the opening quarter I realized why he was there. He's a very talented colt and his mother wasn't as mentally sound as he seems to be. He was bred to be a good one and he really is. It's fun working with the generations of families with Godolphin. I'll speak with the team over the next couple of days and come up with a plan for him going into next year. It's very exciting to have a colt of this caliber."

Saez added, "We were in a perfect spot early in the race. In his dirt races he was on the lead, but he was able to track just off the leader today with the pace being pretty slow. Turning for home I could feel I had a lot of horse beneath me. He really took off down the lane and I could tell the further this horse goes it will be better."

Pedigree Notes:

Uncle Mo is now represented by 57 graded/109 stakes winners worldwide. Street Boss is the broodmare sire of three graded/14 stakes winners. The Harty-trained Godolphin homebred Fair Maiden upset the 2020 La Brea Stakes at Santa Anita and also came within a neck of capturing the previous

year's GI Natalma Stakes over the Woodbine lawn. First Resort is her first foal. She is also responsible for an Into Mischief filly of 2023. She was bred to Flightline for 2025. First Resort's second dam and two-time winner Shieldmaiden brought \$875,000 from John Ferguson at the 2009 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. His fourth dam is GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Secret Status (A.P. Indy).

GOOD CHEER THE TOAST OF THE GOLDEN

Godolphin homebred **Good Cheer** (Medaglia d'Oro) unleashed a powerful run on the far turn and made it a perfect four-for-four with an off-the-pace victory in Saturday's GII Golden Rod Stakes at Churchill Downs, good for 10 points on the Road to the Kentucky Oaks. **'TDN Rising Star' Quietside** (Malibu Moon) was 2 1/2 lengths back in second. **Eclatant** (Into Mischief) was third.

Favored at 3-5 off a 4 3/4-length success in the track-and-trip Rags To Riches Stakes Oct. 27, the bay filly bumped with a rival shortly after the start and raced in an inside fifth beneath Luis Saez through fractions of :24.31 and :48.66. Good Cheer began to catch the eye with a four-wide sweep on the far turn and poked her white-and-blue blinkers in front approaching the quarter pole. She set sail for home from there, opened a 2 1/2-length advantage at the stretch call and kept on motoring down the lane to stay perfect.

Good Cheer debuted with an 8 1/4-length victory going a mile around two turns at Indiana Aug. 5, then added an allowance by a jaw-dropping 17 lengths in the Churchill Downs slop Sept. 28. She defeated four rivals while making her stakes debut in the Rags To Riches while pairing up career-best 86 Beyer Speed Figures.

Immersive (Nyquist), a slam dunk to be crowned as the champion 2-year-old filly of 2024 at January's Eclipse Awards.

"Her record really speaks for itself and the style in which she's won all of those races has been very impressive," Cox said. "She is another testament to Godolphin's program. She's handled everything we've done with her, so far, extremely well and I think we haven't seen her best yet."

Saez added, "She's been so impressive in all four of her starts so far. She was really tugging at me around the turn and I knew it was time to go. She finished up really well down the lane."

Formidable Man, looking to add this to his victory in the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 1, was alertly into stride for Umberto Rispoli and secured the coveted spot on the back of the front-runner, while King of Gosford traveled about two lengths behind Formidable Man while also saving every inch of ground.

Committed to an all-the way try by Javier Castellano, Donegal Momentum got the opening half in a manageable :47.84 and was niggled along three furlongs out as Rothschild tried to pour the pressure on. The latter was soon off the bridle, and that gave Rispoli the opening he was looking for, as he went for Formidable Man in earnest on the swing for home. Donegal Momentum wasn't done quite yet, as he continued to hold the call into the final furlong, but Formidable Man had all the answers, as he pushed past the stubborn front-runner with about 100 yards to race and held firm. King of Gosford followed the winner's move into the lane, switched off heels and was up on the line to touch Donegal Momentum out of second. Del Mar Derby and GII Twilight Derby runner-up **Stay Hot** (Summer Front) rallied inside for fourth, while favored **Carson's Run**



(Cupid) offered a mild rally to be fifth after covering ground on the turn.

"He had a fantastic trip," said winning trainer Michael McCarthy. "I had said to Umberto (jockey Rispoli) maybe we go ahead and bounce out of there early. I wasn't sure what to make of the pace. On paper it didn't look like there was going to be a ton. Glad to see we were sitting where we were just behind the speed. He always looked like he was threatening to run a big one. A hole opened up and he exploded."

Formidable Man rounded out a \$1,324 exacta underneath the Rispoli-ridden Trikari (Oscar Performance) after making the majority of the running in the GII American Turf at Churchill May 5, but ballooned to sixth in the June 1 Audubon Stakes in Louisville. Returned to the Golden State, the \$375,000 Keeneland September yearling rallied from off the speed to post a 1 1/2-length success in the restricted Oceanside Stakes over a mile July 20 and was a bit handier to the pace when besting Stay Hot by a half-length in the local Derby over course and distance on Sept. 1.

The Warrens campaigned City of Light with Michael McCarthy to victories in the 2018 GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile and a swansonging success in the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational. The Warrens also raced 2005 Horse of the Year Saint Liam.


Formidable Man is the second elite-level winner for City of Light, joining 'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness, who added this year's GI Curlin Florida Derby and GI Travers Stakes to the 2023 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

A Grade II winner and Grade I-placed on the turf on the Southern California circuit, Fanticola has thrown four winners from four to the races, with Formidable Man clearly the best of them.

Clear Creek Stud purchased the mare for \$60,000 in foal to Flatter at the 2021 Keeneland November Sale and the 2-year-old colt Cc Cola is currently in training at Delta Downs, having breezed a half-mile as recently as Saturday. The mare's current yearling, a filly by Knicks Go, was bought back for \$97,000 at the Breeders' Sales Company of Louisiana Yearling Sale in late September and she is also the dam of a weanling filly by Jack Christopher. Fanticola is due to Clear Creek's Star Guitar for her 2025 produce.



GUN RUNNER HALF-SISTER PRETTY ANA MAKES THE GRADE IN THE COMELY

Three Chimneys Farm homebred **Pretty Ana** (Quality Road), a half-sister to Horse of the Year and leading young sire Gun Runner (Candy Ride {Arg}), dug down gamely in the stretch to

record a career high in Saturday's GIII Comely Stakes at the Big A.

Sent off as the third-choice in the field of five, the rail-drawn 7-2 chance led them into the clubhouse turn and exchanged blows with longshot **Dorothy's Dreams** (Always Dreaming) through fractions of :24.41 and :49.32. With that rival backing out of it on the turn for home, Pretty Ana braced for the challenge of favored **Alpine Princess** (Classic Empire), who loomed boldly on the outside. Those two put on a show down the stretch with Pretty Ana wanting it just a little bit more, outgaming that rival by a head.

"I'm so happy for Mr. Torrealba and the whole Three Chimneys team," winning trainer Chad Brown said. "This is their core family, and this filly is worth quite a bit of money. Hopefully they keep her in training next year and we can build on her resume. She's lovely to have and on top of what she did today, she's a very classy horse and a pleasure to have around."

A front-running maiden winner at second asking for Steve Asmussen at Fair Grounds back in February, Pretty Ana was transferred to Brown this summer. She made two tries on grass for Brown, including a solid third-place finish behind subsequent GIII Pebbles Stakes winner No Mo Candy (Uncle Mo) in an optional claimer over the lawn here Sept. 20. She finished third, beaten only a neck, back on dirt while making her stakes debut





Tapit's leading money earner who won the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile and G1 Breeders' Futurity in **an unbeaten two-year-old season**.

Then the G1 Belmont and G1 Travers at three. **Essential Quality**, the dual Champion whose first-crop yearlings in 2024 sold for \$572k, \$510k, and four at \$500k, with a \$186k average.

Will Then was last seen Oct. 26 breaking her maiden up north at Woodbine on their turf course but before that did not find the Kentucky Downs course to her liking, finishing 10th on debut Aug. 31.

In no rush after the jump, Will Then set up shop in 10th as the pacesetters stepped out through :22.69 and a :46.98 half mile. Five wide and gaining steam through the turn, she was called on for her best as she slingshot into upper stretch. Rolling on the grandstand side and closing the distance between herself and the leaders with every stride, Will Then inhaled her inside foes to win stylishly. 'TDN Rising Star' Casalu (Caracaro) was second while Resolve (Midnight Lute) came on to claim third.

Will Then is War of Will (by War Front)'s first black-type winner.

"I loved that trip," said winning trainer Jonathan Thomas. "I actually loved the fact that she got shuffled back. Just for educational reasons I thought this was great."

"Once the pace kicked on, it looked like there was a lot of contested situations in front of us. We just looped and reined out of the back and got a clear run. She's really figuring this course out quickly."

Winning rider Vincent Cheminaud added, "I was very confident. I was influenced three years ago; I rode a lot for Augustin Stables. It is very important for me, they gave me their trust, their belief in me and I was very happy to win for them

today. And you know, Jonathan is such a good trainer, and we have a very good relationship. The last time she won easy, but today she needed to improve. She is very nice, you know. I want to see her in the next year."

Pedigree Notes:

A half-sister to Selima Stakes winner Born Dapper (Union Rags), Will Then is her dam's most recent to the races. Remember Then has assembled an interesting broodmare record, as aside from one foal, all of her offspring have been fillies. From five born, all of them are winners and two have earned black type. The mare is herself a full-sister to SW & MGSP Senada, who went on to produce GSP Layla Noor (Midnight Lute). That daughter has since become a winner producer in Japan (all fillies).

Beneath that multiple graded winning dam, there is also GISP Arthur's Tale (Bernardini) and SP War Hoot (War Chant).

Another of Remember Then's full-sisters produced SW & MGSP Gingham (Quality Road) and that one's full-brother Blackadder.

Remember Then has produced one foal since Will Then, a filly by Quality Road, and was barren on a trip to Union Rags for 2025.

Mi Hermano Ramon, making his third start off of a 14-month layoff, captured the 1 1/16-mile GII Seabiscuit Handicap at Del Mar Saturday at 11-1. After a Singletary Stakes win and a Cinema Stakes placing last year at three, he flirted with another black-type win last month when finishing a neck second to the re-opposing Sumter (War Front) in Santa Anita's Lure Stakes while registering a career-high 96 Beyer Speed Figure. After four sharp works on Santa Anita's training track, he got the better of not only Sumter Saturday, but also of 10 other rivals, and secured his first graded score.

Off from the middle of the gate in the Seabiscuit, Mi Hermano Ramon brushed with the horse to his outside before settling near the back while Sumter and 73-1 longshot Fast Buck (Gallant Son) dueled through :23.98 and :47.29 fractions. Swinging wide off the turn, he avoided traffic, stubbornly kept to his incorrect lead for a number of strides, and hooked up with MGSP Astronomer in the middle of the course. He put that challenger to bed and had enough to hold off a late-flying Redistricting (GB), second last out in the GIII Knickerbocker Stakes in New York, while under a late hand ride.

"He's going to run his race. He's going to fall back," said winning trainer Mark Glatt, who was winning the Seabiscuit for the first time. "He's not a horse that can quicken so we just wanted to keep him in the clear. Don't want to lose any momentum with him because once he gets going he comes pretty good. Hector [Berrios] put a perfect ride on him, they parted the seas for him and he got a spot and got the 'W'."

Pedigree Notes:

Former Airdrie stallion Creative Cause is the sire of Mi Hermano Ramon and 26 other black-type winners, including GI Stephen Foster Handicap winner Pavel. The son of Giant's Causeway now stands at Marjorie Farms near Fredericksburg, Texas. While Mi Hermano Ramon is one of nine graded winners for his sire, he is the only stakes winner out of a daughter of Suances (GB), who stood at Rancho Temescal in California. Rancho Temescal co-owns the Seabiscuit winner with Red Baron's Barn.

Mi Hermano Ramon's dam, bred by Red Baron's Barn as was her son, was a three-time winner. She produced one living foal after Mi Hermano Ramon, a 3-year-old colt, Runninferbunnin (Flintshire {GB}), who is unraced.

TRAINER BEN CECIL PASSES AWAY AT 56

After a years-long long battle with cancer, Southern California-based trainer Ben Cecil has passed at the age of 56. He leaves behind his wife Kirsty, and two children, Francesca and Hugo.

A near 30-year training career yielded 325 victories and nearly \$25 million in prize money. He conditioned several Golden State heavy weights including multiple Grade I winners Golden Apples and Squeak, along with top-flight winners Donna Viola and Passinetti.

As nephew to legendary British trainer Henry, Cecil's lineage suggested no other career path than the one taken. His father

David also trained for a period. Cecil's route to the California training ranks was a bit of a circuitous one, however.

In the late 1980s, he worked as an exercise rider and groom at Colin Hayes's sprawling Lindsey Park training center near Adelaide in Australia. He then spent a brief spell as a cattle driver on a remote outback ranch.

Cecil then returned to the UK, where he worked for lan Balding (during the years of top-class winners Silver Fling and Dashing Blade), and for St. Leger winning trainer Mark Tompkins.

Cecil's California dreams began as pupil assistant to trainer Gary Jones, when the stable was armed with Hall of Famer Best Pal. He then moved his assistant's tack to young trainer Rodney Rash.

"He was the toughest person I ever worked for," Cecil told the Thoroughbred Racing Commentary in 2017, about his time working for Rash.

"But it's probably what I needed as well. When you're pupil assistant and you're late for work, it's just like anyone else. But

when you're assistant--and particularly for Rodney Rash--you're in big trouble if anything goes wrong. Basically, I grew up very quickly."

After a little more than a year-and-a-half in that position, Cecil was thrust into the saddle, handed the stable's reins when Rash passed away suddenly from a blood disorder. Cecil handled the transition with aplomb, maintaining the barn's high standards over subsequent years.

Donna Viola won the 1997 GI Gamely Stakes in a plunging finish. The former John Gosden trained Squeak picked up a brace of Grade Is during the second half of 1998.

Cecil was patience personified in nursing Passinetti back from a serious tendon injury to victory in the 2003 GI San Juan Capistrano. Cecil's most prolific masterpiece was the Gary Tanaka-owned Golden Apples, who won three Grade Is between 2001 and 2002.

Compared to the rich pickings of his early days with a license, Cecil's training career over the past decade or so was marked by fewer days at the top table. During this period, owner-breeder Paul Reddam was a loyal and vital mainstay for the barn.

Cecil told the TRC in 2017 that he viewed his uncle Henry's glorious redemption from well-documented personal and professional travails as aspirational.

"He's one of my inspirations--definitely," Cecil said, at the time. "I think, like we all do, it's the hope that we get through it. You have to think there's some light at the end of the tunnel."

ALCOHOL AND GAMING COMMISSION OF ONTARIO ORDERS ADDITIONAL MEASURES TO PROTECT HORSES AT WOODBINE

Responding to a rash of recent breakdowns at Woodbine, the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO), which regulates racing in the province, has taken steps it hopes will lead to fewer injuries. Woodbine has now had six fatalities since the Nov. 9 card in which two horses died and the remainder of the day's program was cancelled, as was the next scheduled day of racing.

The biggest change is that any horse that has raced within the previous 14 calendar days is ineligible to race and will be scratched if already entered. With the new rules having gone into effect after entries were drawn for Saturday's races, 12 horses that were entered to run back within 14 days were scratched from the card.

Four horses were scratched from the second race, leaving it with a field of just six. Five horses had to be withdrawn from the 10th race, leaving a field of six.

Other steps that were taken include:

- (*) Any racehorses that have received an intra-articular fetlock injection--used to treat joint issues--within the previous 14 calendar days of race date will be restricted from entering to race.
- (*) The AGCO is requiring that an official veterinarian be present and observe horses during all morning training at Woodbine.

Before a horse on the Veterinarian's List is permitted to return to work, its trainer and a private veterinarian must observe it jogging within 48 hours before the work and jointly certify that the horse is fit and sound before being examined by the official veterinarian and being permitted to work.

The new rules will be in place until further notice.

Lexington. He had kids that went to school with Doug Arnold's kids and he just happened to introduce me to him because he knew I was trying to get in the business. I went to school here, but had moved to Missouri for a job. I was in college athletics administration prior to being in the horse business. I moved back to Lexington and started volunteering at Doug's farm. He had a couple of things go right--he had a couple of young stallions that he got off to a good start, then sold, so he brought me on full time and later I just happened to apply to a job I saw listed at TDN or BloodHorse for a stallion manager position at Taylor Made. I sent in an application, met with those guys, and just kind of lucked into that way.

I'm the only person in my family in racing. I don't think they understand what I do exactly. I've tried to explain it multiple times. My brother could care less about it.

I'm really appreciative of the Taylor family. They're great people to work with. I've learned a lot. They've been great to me, taught me a whole lot, and I'm very appreciative of what they've done for me and a lot of people they've gotten into this business.

HISA 150-DAY LAYOFF REPORTING REQUIREMENT BEGINS DEC. 5

The Horseracing Integrity & Safety Authority (HISA)'s 150-Day Layoff Report rule is scheduled to go into effect Thursday, Dec. 5, the group announced Saturday afternoon.

Announced back in July but beginning on the aforementioned date, any horse who has not raced in 150 days (approx. five months) or more must have a report submitted prior to race entry. It is recommended that said report be uploaded 10-14

days prior. Trainers will be notified when a horse has been off for 140 days.

A live demonstration and Q&A will be hosted Tuesday, Dec. 3 at 5:00 p.m. with representatives from the HISA veterinary team and IT department available for questions. Please register here to attend.



PATCH ADAMS A SECOND 'RISING STAR' FOR INTO MISCHIEF, GEROUX AND COX

WinStar Farm, CHC Inc and Siena Farm's **Patch Adams (c, 2, Into Mischief--Well Humored, by Distorted Humor)** tore away from his rivals in the final furlong to become the day's second **'TDN Rising Star'** for his sire, trainer Brad Cox and jockey Florent Geroux with a jaw-dropping performance. He becomes the 47th **'Rising Star'** for the Spendthrift super-stallion.

Looking to atone for a debut third--albeit a highly rated one-when odds-on at Keeneland Oct. 11, the homebred colt was 58 cents on the dollar this time around and made absolutely no mistakes. Right into the bridle, Patch Adams was in the vanguard early and ultimately tracked from third, three off the inside as 5-1 chance Zat's the One (McKinzie) got his opening couple of furlongs in :22.51 while doing it from between rivals. Cruising up to draw on even terms while in hand and ready to explode at the five-sixteenths, Patch Adams swapped his leads right on cue when heads were turned for home and was off and gone through the final furlong and a half, covering his final threeeighths of a mile in a very slick: 35.61 (final furlong in: 12.17) geared down) according to DRF Formulator. The final time of 1:20.77 over a fast main track was just 0.33 off the track record held by Groupie Doll. Cant Stop Munnings (Munnings) was along for second ahead of longshot **Shogun** (Blame) in third.

Patch Adams's stakes-winning third dam was purchased by WinStar for \$150,000 in foal to Awesome Again at the 2001 Keeneland November Sale and among her eight winners was G1 Dubai World Cup hero Well Armed (Tiznow), GISP Helsinki (Distorted Humor) and GSW Witty (Distorted Humor), the dam of GSW Bombard (War Front) and MGSP Amuse (Medaglia d'Oro).

Well Armed's full-sister Life Well Lived was less accomplished at the races, but foaled five winners from seven starters, most notably American Patriot (War Front), winner of the GI Maker's Mark Mile Stakes and now a stallion at Darley in Japan. Also responsible for MGSP Muqtaser (Distorted Humor) and 'TDN Rising Star' Parchment Party (Constitution), Life Well Lived was purchased by Machmer Hall for \$360,000 back in foal to Constitution at the 2023 Keeneland November Sale, produced a colt this term and is due to the same stallion for 2025. Well Humored is also the dam of a yearling full-brother to Patch Adams.

The cross of Into Mischief over Distorted Humor has been very successful, accounting for now 49 winners from 62 starters and 11 stakes winners, including WinStar sire and 'TDN Rising Star' Life Is Good, Practical Joke and recent GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Citizen Bull. Goldencents is out of a mare by Forty Niner's son Banker's Gold.

IDIOMATIC'S HALF-SISTER CHASTEN RACES TO DEBUT 'TDN RISING STAR' HONORS

Saturday's program at Churchill Downs is meant to showcase the 'Stars of Tomorrow' and Juddmonte's bred-in-the-purple Chasten (f, 2, Into Mischief--Lockdown, by First Defence) shaped as just that, doing her best work late to score by a widening margin and earn the 'TDN Rising Star' badge.

The half-sister to champion Idiomatic (Curlin), MGISW, \$3,944,190, appeared to get bounced around at the break of the seven-furlong contest and was clearly last early before making progress and improving a spot or two down the backstretch. Asked to come through between rivals bending into the turn 3 1/2 furlongs from home, Chasten was pulled out into the four or five path to emerge a threat passing the quarter pole. In the slipstream of favored Sycamore Shoals (Street Sense), who earned a 74 Beyer for her dead-heat second on her lone previous trip to the races at Keeneland Oct. 24, on the swing for home, the homebred wandered around a bit, but was angled off that one's heels, wrested command with about a sixteenth of a mile to travel and pulled clear while under mostly hand urging, then galloped out with good energy into the turn. The winner's stablemate Our Shenanigan (Practical Joke), beaten a head for a \$150,000 tag in Lexington Oct. 25, took a short lead inside the final furlong and held for second ahead of Sycamore Shoals.

"She's as tall as her sister and to the races much earlier, even though we didn't start on her until late spring," said Juddmonte USA General Manager Garrett O'Rourke. "She's got a long ways to go to be Idiomatic, but that's a pleasant start."

Chasten becomes the second winner from Lockdown, who won her maiden at second asking and annexed the 2017 Busanda Stakes before finishing second in the GII Gazelle Stakes





and a longshot third to Abel Tasman (Quality Road) in that year's GI Kentucky Oaks.

Lockdown is the full-sister to Juddmonte's 2014 champion older mare Close Hatches, who has bred four winners from as many to race, including MGSW/MGISP 'TDN Rising Star' Scylla (Tapit), her MGSW/MGISP full-brother Tacitus and this year's GIII Ohio Derby hero Batten Down, also a son of Tapit. This is also the female family of dual Group 1 winner and now Japan-based Siskin (First Defence).

Chasten is the 46th 'TDN Rising Star' for Into Mischief, and the cross over Unbridled-line mares--particularly via Empire Maker-has been responsible for the likes of GI Kentucky Derby winner and current Juddmonte sire Mandaloun, his full-brother Mullion and the late MSW Taraz. Empire Maker's half-sister Honest Lady (Seattle Slew) is the dam of New York-based sire and 'Rising Star' Honest Mischief in addition to Chasten's broodmare sire First Defence.

Chasten is the last listed produce for Lockdown.

Looking to add to Puca (Big Brown)'s remarkable streak of runners, **BAEZA** (McKinzie) will go to post in the turf night cap at Del Mar. Racing for the partnership of C R K Stable and Grandview Equine, the John Shirreffs trainee has big shoes to fill as the half-brother to MGISW Dornoch (Good Magic) and his full-brother, GI Kentucky Derby hero Mage. Even before those two, their dam had produced another stakes runner, namely Gunning (Gun Runner). She was placed in the Listed Runhappy Audubon Oaks in 2022 and the Dig A Diamond Stakes in 2023.

Baeza was sold for \$1.2-million in 2023 at the Keeneland



September sale to Mayberry Farm as agent for the current ownership group. Dornoch and Mage also went through that ring, bringing \$325,000 and \$235,000 as yearlings, respectively, while Gunning was an RNA back in 2020 when bidding halted at \$70,000. Puca changed hands to John Stewart last year for \$2.9-million at the Keeneland November auction.

Baeza has been at the track since June and a characteristically steady string of works follows him into this race. His five furlong move Nov. 16 was a bullet over the Del Mar main track, the clocked time of :59.40 marked as the fastest of nine that morning. Umberto Rispoli is in the irons and he's been given 3-1 morning line odds which will likely only be lower by gate break. TJCIS PPs



St. Elias Stables homebred Rated by Merit, featured in *TDN* nearly six weeks ago as Vinnie Viola's "unlikely Derby contender," showed again why he ranks at or near the top of the promising 2-year-olds for the powerful stable. The undefeated colt won Saturday's FTBOA Florida Sire In Reality Stakes at Gulfstream to sweep the Florida Sires series.

With the In Reality his first try around two turns, Rated by Merit broke smoothly from the rail to set an easy :24.13 and :48.92 pace. Classic of Course threatened to his outside on the turn, but the 1-5 favorite let out a notch with confidence and, despite belatedly swapping to his correct lead and drifting slightly in the lane, he finished six lengths clear while pricking his ears at the wire.

"When I took the lead at the beginning I was expecting some pressure, but I didn't get any," said winning rider Jesus Rios. "For that reason, I was very relaxed with the horse and in the final stretch he got wide a little bit but the horse was very strong in the last part of the race. He is a very special horse. I feel very blessed to win this race and win the Triple Crown of the Florida Sire Stakes."

Rated by Merit has posted Beyer Speed Figures of 92 or above in each of his three previous starts, including a 99 in the FTBOA

My Denysse played the spoiler in the My Dear Girl Stakes at Gulfstream Park while carrying 35-1 odds and breaking her maiden in her fifth lifetime jump.

Beginning her career on this oval, she ran fourth against statebred company June 23 and slowly improved with each start. She was last seen begrudgingly yielding the lead late to lose by a neck Oct. 20 against an open maiden special.

Settling in fifth as heavy 1-5 favorite Stunner stepped out to lead, My Denysse was in no hurry to catch that one until they entered the far turn, where she was pushed for more while coming five wide. Rallying from that overland route while the longtime leader tried to give them all the slip after :23.32, :47.49 and 1:13.21 splits, the gap was closing relentlessly as Stunner got leg weary late. Produced for one last lunge in the shadow of the wire, My Denysse nailed the betting choice by a neck. It was over seven lengths back to Fede in third.

"My expectation, I've got to be honest, was I hope I run second. Stunner looked like a very difficult task. I was hopeful that the extra half a furlong was going to help us," said Ruben Sierra, who bred, owns, and trains the filly under the Just For Fun Stable, Inc. moniker. "I've got to give all the credit to Rios. When he rode her the first time he said, 'This is the filly I want to ride.'"

Of instructions he may've provided, Sierra added, "All I told Rios was, 'Good luck,'. He's been telling me all along he was very confident going into the race. I was surprised that he was that confident, but I guess he knew what he had. He executed the plan to perfection. I can only give him a lot of credit."

The victress is her dam's most recent to garner black type behind multiple Listed winner and track record-setter Warrior's Pride (Poseidon's Warrior). 'IT'S GREAT FOR THE BOYS' - VIGORS BROTHERS EMBARK ON PINHOOKING PROJECT

New dreams abound for Harry and Oliver Vigors, some of the youngest pinhookers to get in on the action at Tattersalls this week, with the pair going to 72,000gns to secure a Perfect Power (Ire) colt in partnership with Redwall Bloodstock.

That proved to be the sale-topping figure for the final session of what has been record-breaking foal trade at Tattersalls. In fact, such records had already been achieved by Friday when the 30,906,000 turnover for that memorable session exceeded what was spent during the entirety of this sale 12 months ago.

Turnover climbed by a massive 46% to 43,504,000gns for the entire sale. The 78% clearance rate was up by 4% on last year while the 67,658gns average represented a 52% rise. The median jumped by a similar level [43%] to 30,000gns.

Competing in such a competitive marketplace was not enough to deter the young Vigors brothers. The Perfect Power colt, who was offered by Manor House Farm Stud, was put forward by older brother Harry as the one they wanted most on Friday. While a certain amount of bravery was required, the bidding team--which featured Tweenhills' Hannah Wall--managed to get their boy, all with Dad's blessing of course. Cont. p3







He said, "References to 'the cream of the British and Irish foal crops' have been made constantly throughout this week's record-breaking Tattersalls December Foal Sale and the extraordinary figures show the esteem in which the best British and Irish thoroughbreds continue to be held and where 'the cream' is to be found. All week Park Paddocks has been alive with pinhookers from Britain, Ireland and further afield; a combination of veterans who have been plying their trade for many years and hordes of the younger generation whose

enthusiasm and commitment provide encouragement to the wider industry looking forward.

"Equally notable has been the immense contribution made by owners buying to race. The December Foal Sale will always be dominated by pinhookers, but owners, both domestic and international, have made a huge impact on the sale, particularly those from Australia, China, Japan and the USA as well as from throughout Europe and the Gulf region."

Mahony added, "Between them all they have contributed to a Tattersalls December Foal Sale which will be remembered for a very long time, not only for Whitsbury Manor Stud's outstanding 2,500,000 guineas Frankel filly foal out of Suelita, who equalled the 27-year European record price for a foal, but also for a sale which produced an unprecedented number of foals selling for 500,000 guineas or more, wide margin records across the board for average, median and turnover and a massive 32 of the 40 highest-priced foals to have been sold in Britain and Ireland this vear.

"The confidence that the leading British and Irish breeders show in the uniquely diverse market at Tattersalls is a source of immense pride and it would be no exaggeration to say that so much of the strength of this week's foal trade, as well as the record-breaking December Yearling Sale, has been driven by the game-changing Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale a few weeks ago." He said, "Those three days of yearlings have driven the European bloodstock market ever since and to see so many British and Irish breeders and consignors subsequently reaping richly deserved rewards has itself been truly rewarding.

"Not all in the garden has, however, been rosy and the lowest tier of the market continues to struggle which is a concern, but as we move on to the market leading Tattersalls December Mares Sale we can reflect on another 2024 Tattersalls sale which has exceeded expectations and again shone a positive light on the industry."

Talking Points

- This was a sale where the end-users dominated at the top end. From Amo Racing ending the sale as leading buyer with four foals sourced for 4,675,000gns, it was interesting to see that Yulong [signing under Willingham] and Coolmore filled the second and third spots with spends of 3,224,000gns and 1,800,000gns respectively.
- As well as topping the Friday session with Chaldean's sister, Whitsbury Manor Stud ended the sale as the leading vendor with 21 lots selling for a combined 4,347,500gns.

Philipp Stauffenberg shopped hard at Tattersalls this week and was rewarded for sticking it out to the bitter end when coming up trumps on a Space Blues (Ire) colt consigned by Jamie Railton for 65,000gns.

The colt, which cemented a 365,000gns outlay on four foals this week, was described by Stauffenberg as a proper Book 2 candidate for next year. He hails from a Teofilo (Ire) dam and is from the family of Group 1 winner Debussy (Ire).

The leading pinhooker explained, "He was just a very good walker. He's by a stallion who we don't know a lot about but we have to give him a chance. Of the foals we saw today, he's the one who really stood out by the way he moved. He looks a proper Book 2 horse--not a high-end Book 2 horse but, you never know, if the stallion comes up with a good one, he could be. We just hope for the best with him. This is the fourth horse we've bought this week. It was tough and we were underbidders several times."

Plainly, it's not just European bloodlines on the Northern Farm team's radar, however, so just what is on their wish list when it comes to recruiting stock?

Hashimoto says simply, "We try to diversify what we have in our portfolio."

He continues, "Where the mares are from, or what bloodline they are from, it's not our first priority, but we do prioritise the balance within our operations. One of the main reasons we try to buy a mare from overseas is to try to make sure our bloodlines are not too limited." **Cont. p7**



He adds, "The key is that we don't try to focus too much on one bloodline or one stallion. Of course, Frankel is very attractive for us, Kingman is also very attractive to us, but we

don't try to focus too much on them. It's never a black and white situation, but I think that the key part is the diversification, and the match for those mares with the stallions within Japan."

He adds, "But of course, if the pedigree is good, that's also a very good point that we take into account. We also look into the conformation of the mare, how athletic she is, but when it comes to the broodmare sales, we try to focus more on the horse's race results and also the pedigree, and the conformation comes next."

Hashimoto says that when recruiting young stock they try not to get caught up in the narrow focus on certain sires.

"We just try to look through every horse in the catalogue, and try not to have a preconceived image of how their pedigree is," he notes.

Yoshida is the largest breeder in Japan – closely followed by his brother Teruya of Shadai Farm – with a broodmare band larger

than that of the whole of the German breeding industry, meaning that Northern Farm is also one of the major vendors in the country. Its draft dominates the Select Sale of yearlings and foals each July at the Northern Horse Park.

"Within the sales portfolio, we like to have some of the European stallions or the US-based stallions represented," says Hashimoto. "Let's say, if we cannot buy a mare in foal to any of the stallions, maybe we might keep some of the mares here [in Europel and then cover them.

and then bring them back to Japan. That depends on the result of the sale. There's not a specific strategy."

While some yearlings are bought by Yoshida at the Keeneland

Sale in September, Hashimoto says that buying foals in Newmarket is a better fit for their racing programme.

"We get to learn a lot from what we see in the yearling sales or foal sales, and the trends for certain stallions," he says.

"Obviously, horses like Too Darn Hot or Mehmas, they are becoming the rising stallions here in Europe, and we get to know why they're so popular, which I think is an important thing for us to take into account."

Hashimoto continues, "The foals we buy are to race in Japan. We've done this for five, six years now. One of the main reasons is that if we buy at the yearling sales in Europe in October, then we import them into Japan, it means they arrive in mid-December or so. In that case, if we start breaking from

then, it's a little bit late for us. Instead, we try to buy the foals so that we can bring them back to Japan at an earlier stage.

"We do go to Keeneland in September, and they come in to Japan in November. In general, horses from America are pretty mature at that stage compared to the horses in Europe."

It's not just a one-way street, of course, and the bilingual Hashimoto, who was born in America where he spent some of

his formative years, is keen to welcome buyers from overseas to the sales in Japan, including to the Northern Farm Mixed Sale of broodmares and foals which is held in late October.

"This year, we found more buyers coming in from overseas compared to other years, which I think is a good thing for the industry itself," he says. "I think one of the reasons why more people have become interested in the Japanese market is because of the good results that we have had in overseas racing in the past five years or so,

He says, "But at the same time, the sales in Japan are also quite competitive. Sometimes it's very expensive to buy, which I think comes from the very good prize-money in Japan. For foreign buyers to compete against the Japanese buyers might be a little bit tough, but still it's a sale, so we can always find a way to buy a horse. For example, Yoshida was traded in the July sale as a foal."

Yoshida (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}), named with a courteous nod to his breeder at Northern Farm, won both the GI Woodward Stakes and GI Old Forester Turf Classic Stakes for the partnership of China Horse Club, WinStar Farm and Head of Plains Partners before retiring to stand initially at WinStar in Kentucky. After four seasons there he moved to stand at Darley Japan earlier this year.

Hashimoto says, "It would be interesting to see how the Japanese horses would fit in different countries.

"We do have that set-up for people to bid online, so that is possible, of course. But they can also come to Japan and enjoy seeing the horses. We'll always be happy to host them."

For some years, a number of top-end European breeders, notably Coolmore, the Niarchos family and previously the Wildenstein operation, have sent mares to visit some of Japan's leading stallions, with the European Classic winners Beauty Parlour (GB), Snowfall (Jpn), Fancy Blue (Ire) and Auguste Rodin (Ire) all emanating from their patronage of the late Deep Impact (Jpn), who is also the sire of the Prix du Jockey Club winner and one of the buzz stallions of the moment in Europe, Study Of Man (Ire).

With Deep Impact having died in 2019, and Heart's Cry, the sire of last year's St Leger winner Continuous (Jpn), also no longer around, breeders with an international outlook will be keeping an eye on the next big name to emerge from the

Japanese stallion ranks. Deep Impact's son Kizuna (Jpn) is at the head of this year's general sires' table in Japan, ahead of the reliable Lord Kanaloa (Jpn), sire of the great Almond Eye (Jpn) among others.

"We had some international breeders send mares to be covered by Equinox this year," says Hashimoto of the top-rated horse in the world in 2023. Equinox's sire Kitasan Black (Jpn) is also rightly on the radar of those outside Japan, and father and son are currently the two most expensive stallions in the country. Meanwhile, next season will bring the first two-year-old runners for Deep Impact's Triple Crown-winning son Contrail (Jpn).

"I think the interest from the international market has been rising, especially with the good results by Auguste Rodin, which is a good thing for the Japanese industry as well," Hashimoto says. "In general, I think the racing industry has become more global, year by year."

Hashimoto himself, with a background in both America and Japan, inside and outside the racing industry, is well placed to take such an overview. He studied veterinary medicine before focusing more on a business career, working in Houston for five years as a petrochemical trader. Ultimately though, he says, "I couldn't forget my passion for the horseracing industry."

Hashimoto has now been back in Japan and working for Northern Farm for six years.

He adds, "It's really a good environment for me to study. I mean, I can learn a lot there. Our operation is very big. We have about 1,000 broodmares, 700-plus foals every year.

"I've been having the opportunity to come overseas and look at the sales and, like I mentioned, getting to know the trends of the stallions. It's a very good thing to be able to understand the difference between Japan and other countries, or to think about what the Japanese racing industry should try to do better, or goals for our farm." KINDLY PRINCE BRINGS £320K AT GOFFS **CORAL GOLD CUP SALE**






