BREEDING DIGEST: A CRY ECHOING DOWN THE STREET



Street Cry | Darley Stallions

All of us involved in this game tend to be exposed to its ups and downs on a scale proportionate to our means. That being so, there have unsurprisingly been some pretty wild extremes --for better and worse--in the story of the most lavishly funded program in its history.

Just think back, for instance, to the last days of April 2001. Sheikh Mohammed had sent Street Cry (Ire) back to the United States, where he had been skillfully developed as a juvenile by Eoin Harty, with the mission of winning the GI Kentucky Derby after wintering in his desert homeland. But now Street Cry had been struck by an ankle inflammation, and would have to be scratched.

Within the week, nobody on the Godolphin team was still giving that disappointment a moment's thought. At least Street Cry would be back in a few months. Over in Britain, in contrast, the horse that the Sheikh cherished above all others had just lost a harrowing battle with grass sickness.

The following year Street Cry would emulate the tragic Dubai Millennium (GB)--who had in 2000 fulfilled the destiny for which he had been renamed--by winning the G1 Dubai World Cup.

HISA PROVISIONALLY SUSPENDS PACO LOPEZ AFTER INCIDENT AT PARX by Bill Finley

Reacting to an incident that took place Tuesday at Parx in which he was caught on video striking the horse **National Law** (Constitution) in the face with his whip following the fifth race, jockey Paco Lopez has received a provisional suspension from the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA).

"In response to the incident yesterday involving jockey Paco Lopez, the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority has provisionally suspended Paco Lopez from all racing activities under HISA's jurisdiction, effective immediately," said a HISA spokesperson. "The provisional suspension will proceed under an expedited timeline through HISA's adjudication process."


Parx officials also weighed in on the incident with a statement of their own.

Another runaway Grade I success when commuting back Stateside volunteered him as a potential Horse of the Year, but a recurrence of his ankle issue instead saw him retired to Jonabell.

That farm had been purchased the previous year as part of Godolphin's increasingly international agenda. And he certainly had an apt profile for reconciling different racing cultures, having proved a dirt champion despite being out an G1 Irish Oaks winner by Troy (GB) (Helen Street {GB}, whose full-sister of course produced Shamardal).

Street Cry's first crop, conceived at \$30,000 and delivered in 2004, would include Zenyatta, whose public reach has

perhaps been matched among modern fillies only by another of his daughters, the 2011 foal Winx (Aus). But it also featured a couple of colts who would both end up following their sire to Jonabell, in **'TDN Rising Star'** Street Sense and Street Boss.

Street Sense | Sarah Andrew

Street Sense's 2-year-old championship elevated his sire's fee to \$50,000; his Kentucky Derby, to \$100,000. Then Street Boss blossomed with two Grade I sprints as a 4-year-old, and Zenyatta won the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, taking Street Cry to

\$150,000.

But this, Winx apart, would prove one of many stallions whose record did not particularly improve with the presumed caliber of his mares. His two most accomplished Australian runners besides Winx, Shocking (Aus) and Whobegotyou (Aus), both belonged to his first shuttle crop; and arguably he made no greater impact as a six-figure cover in the U.S. than through star juvenile New Year's Day.

While the latter is now

represented at stud by Maximum Security, the principal conduit for Street Cry's branch of the Machiavellian line has meanwhile led through those two first-crop sons who stood alongside their sire at Jonabell. *Cont.*

Street Cry himself having died aged 16, in 2014, they have carried the torch nobly. Street Sense, in contrast with his sire, enters the evening of his career with an ever-stronger legacy, the succession being contested with notable vigor by such young sons as 'TDN Rising Star' McKinzie, Maxfield and Speaker's Corner. Street Boss, similarly, has Anamoe (Aus) recently starting out in Australia with nine elite wins to his credit.

Overall, despite his **'TDN Rising Star'** and GI Kentucky Oaks winner Cathryn Sophia, Street Boss has proved so much more effective in Australia that he moved there permanently in 2022. His daughter **Accomplished Girl** did manage another black-type success at Fair Grounds on Saturday, but for Godolphin it was sooner as damsires that both he and **Street Sense** dovetailed for a gratifying Thanksgiving weekend.

Perhaps we should not be surprised. Though Zenyatta proved a notorious anti-climax as a broodmare, Street Cry's daughters have lately produced such good horses as Vino Rosso (Curlin), Just F Y I (Justify) and Rebel's Romance (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}). That reminds us how gradually distaff influence tends to burn, but Street Sense's daughters have already produced the likes of European champion Roaring Lion (Kitten's Joy) and one of this year's leading sophomores in 'TDN Rising Star' Mindframe (Constitution).

As winner of the GI Ogden Phipps Stakes and GI Beldame Stakes, Wedding Toast arguably remains the best female runner by Street Sense. She had plenty of genetic help from her dam, a half-sister to that extraordinary creature Congaree, and has naturally been given every opportunity in her matings. Unfortunately her first three foals to make the track, by Dubawi (Ire) and Tapit, have proved most disappointing: a Tapit gelding did win at Remington Park a couple of weeks ago, but under a \$5,000 tag. *Cont.*



Now, however, her 2-year-old daughter by the venerable Medaglia d'Oro, Good Cheer, is four-for-four after landing the GII Golden Rod Stakes at Churchill.

(Which success incidentally complemented another graded stakes for Medaglia d'Oro a couple of days previously, Loved having beaten another Godolphin filly, Tarifa, in the GIII Falls City Stakes. Loved is a half-sister to one of Street Sense's young guns in Maxfield, their dam Velvety being by distaff phenomenon Bernardini {himself additionally sire of Tarifa} out of Bernstein's \$3.1-million sister Caress {Storm Cat}.)

On the same Churchill card, the GII Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes fell to **First Resort** (Uncle Mo)--whose dam, Fair Maiden, was like Wedding Toast a homebred Grade I winner for Godolphin, albeit her success in the La Brea Stakes came as rather a shock.

First Resort is her first foal and, while the next couple of generations are quite fallow in terms of black type, the fourth dam is GI Kentucky Oaks winner Secret Status (A.P. Indy) --whose son by Unbridled's Song, Dunkirk, won the GII Florida Derby.

Perhaps what's most pleasing about First Resort is the fact that he's trained by the same man who supervised Street Cry, all those years ago, at the same stage of his career. Harty's self-effacing nature has long made him an admirable team player for Godolphin, but probably does not assist his promotion of what is nowadays also a public stable. Don't forget that he was also behind the scenes with Bob Baffert during the Silver Charm/Real Quiet era; nor that he is a fifth-generation horseman from one of Ireland's most respected racing families. Those genes are plainly telling in his handling of First Resort, much as those of his old buddy Street Cry have filtered through to the colt himself.

Beach Riding the Crest of a Wave

Street Cry's distaff influence was reiterated over the holiday weekend by **Kehoe Beach** (Omaha Beach), the GII Mrs. Revere Stakes winner being out of his daughter Sweet Awakening. That takes him up to 91 graded/group winners as damsire.

Kehoe Beach's breeders bought Sweet Awakening for \$45,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November Sale, following a curtailed track career, and tried to flip her in foal to Run Away and Hide in the same ring the following year.

Fortunately she failed to meet her reserve, at \$27,000, and three of the breeding partnership ended up racing the foal themselves: as Are You Kidding Me, he became a multiple Canadian graded stakes winner and banked over \$1.3 million for Ronald Kirk, John Bates and Michael Riordan. *Cont.*



Kehoe Beach, with her page duly illuminated, was sold to Cherry Tree Farm as a weanling for \$180,000 before proving an excellent pinhook at \$450,000 back in the same ring the following September.

As his fourth graded stakes winner, Kehoe Beach maintains a persuasive rally by her sire. On the face of it, Omaha Beach did not quite match his billing when fourth of the Spendthrift quartet who dominated the freshman table last year, having started out at the highest fee. But we shouldn't forget that he only broke his maiden at the fifth attempt, his subsequent blossoming yielding consecutive Grade I wins over nine and six furlongs.

The cream is duly rising with his maturing stock, and Omaha Beach now bestrides his intake across all indices of quality, notably with 21 black-type performers in 2024 at 14 percent of starters. (Across the two years, moreover, he's up to 18 percent.) He cannot match a handful for sheer volume of winners, but tellingly is clear on purse money.

Spendthrift's hopes of a freshman hat-trick (following Good Magic and Mitole) remain on a knife edge, with Vekoma holding a wafer-thin lead. The two horses that chased home First Resort on Saturday, 'TDN Rising Star' Jonathan's Way and Tiztastic, each enhanced his status as principal earner for Vekoma and Tiz



the Law respectively. Through Monday, Vekoma stood on \$2,611,038 against Street Sense's son McKinzie on \$2,598,391, with Tiz the Law, whose daughter **Book'em** won her third straight on that same Saturday card at Churchill, breathing down their necks on \$2,543,857. *Cont.*

Standing on the Shoulders of Giants

Most precious result of the week was surely the graded stakes

breakthrough of Gun Runner's half-sister **Pretty Ana** (Quality Street) in the GIII Comely Stakes. But there will also have been plenty of relief in the City of Light camp that Formidable Man, in the Hollywood Derby, was able to become the second Grade I winner craved for the sire of 'TDN Rising Star' and champion Fierceness. And meanwhile there was also a significant breakthrough for freshman War of Will, whose daughter Will Then became his first stakes winner in the GIII Jimmy Durante Stakes.

Will Then was contributing to a remarkable week for Augustin Stables, as one of three homebred graded stakes winners at Del Mar, following **Mrs. Astor** (Lookin At Lucky) in the GIII Red Carpet Stakes and **Truly Quality** (Quality Road) in the GII Hollywood Turf Cup.

Truly Quality, a half-sister to recent Canadian graded stakes winner **Mouffy** (Uncle Mo), is out of a graded stakes-placed

daughter of George Strawbridge's champion grass mare Together Forever (Belong to Me). But good breeders tap into each other's work and Strawbridge did just that with Will Then's dam Remember Then (Pulpit), whose family had been cultivated with a familiar touch of genius by his friend Arthur Hancock. Remember Then, who won her first three races in Strawbridge's colors, had been bought as a yearling from Stone Farm as a daughter of four-time graded stakes winner Owlsey (Harlan), whose own dam was similarly

homebred by Hancock.

A parallel process accounted for Mrs. Astor, whose dam Causal (Creative Cause) was another yearling purchase by Strawbridge from an exemplary operation, in this case that of Brereton C. Jones of Airdrie Stud. *Cont.*

Causal, a half-sister to two Canadian champions in Biofuel (Stormin Fever) and Tu Endie Wei (Johar), was confined to a very light career and was soon culled from the Strawbridge program, only to be sold on by her purchasers in a Fasig-Tipton digital sale in July (in foal to Army Mule) for just \$48,000. Her alert purchasers were...Airdrie Stud!

There's no higher praise than to say that the team there are proving worthy of the BCJ legacy. The late Governor reached Thanksgiving matched in 2024 only by Godolphin in stakes winners bred, level on 18 apiece. First Resort has now edged Godolphin into the lead, but as a son of Uncle Mo is typical of the fee gap between the stallions typically used by these two programs. To have pulled clear of every other breeder in the land is a remarkable achievement.

"We are aware of the incident that took place after the fifth race on Dec. 3 and want to express that we aspire to hold the jockey colony and all of the horsemen and women here at Parx to the highest standards," the release read.

"Unsportsmanlike behavior should not and will not be tolerated," the Parx release said. "We will deal with this accordingly. We are cooperating fully with our stewards and with HISA and will support any disciplinary decision they make in the matter."

In the one-mile-and-70 yards maiden race, National Law took the lead on the far turn. But the colt bore out badly in the stretch, so much so that he was only a few feet off the outside rail. He still managed to hang on and win by 1 1/2 lengths. While Lopez was pulling the horse up after he crossed the wire he

stood up in the saddle, cocked the whip in his right hand and slashed the horse across the neck.

National Law is owned by Colts Neck Stable, which is run by Rich Santulli and his son Stephen. In a tweet sent out Tuesday night, Stephen Santulli didn't show any sympathy for Lopez.

"After the fifth race at Parx today, Paco Lopez struck a horse of ours across the neck/mouth, after the race had finished," said Santulli. "We do not agree with the action he took, nor Jorge Duarte's opinions on how the situation was handled. It is truly one of the most unwarranted actions I have seen lately. Colts Neck Stables has not and will not ever condone this type of treatment towards horses. We love our animals, and it is always our priority to maximize their quality of life while under our care."

Santulli was reacting to a tweet posted Tuesday by the colt's trainer, Jorge Duarte, Jr., who posted the following on X: "Jockeys are the toughest athletes. We have mental health involved already anyone who saw the whole stretch run would say Paco was outstanding keeping the horse safe."

Duarte later took down the tweet.

Lopez was scheduled to ride four horses Wednesday at Parx, but was taken off all of his mounts. Cont.

It's unlikely that he will be allowed to ride this weekend at Gulfstream Park, but if he does, outspoken owner Mike Repole tweeted that he will not be riding any of his horses any time soon.

"This morning, Todd Pletcher and I contacted the racing office at Gulfstream Park and notified them we would be taking Paco Lopez off Battle Drum in the fifth race on Saturday," Repole posted. "We also made it clear that if the Stewards do not approve the change, we would scratch Battle Drum from the race."

In another tweet, Repole wrote: "The actions today of veteran jockey Paco Lopez were completely, totally unacceptable, inexcusable and reprehensible. There is no place for this in our sport. This is why racing needs a national governing body and jurisdiction that reviews all of these important matters immediately and can act on them promptly."

The *TDN* reached out to Lopez for a comment, but he did not return our calls.

TRAINER ROJAS, CLEARED OF DRUG CHARGES BY U.S. SUPREME COURT, CAN'T OVERCOME LICENSING HURDLE IN

KENTUCKY by T.D. Thornton

Trainer Murray Rojas spent nearly a decade fighting equine drug misbranding charges stemming from a years-long federal investigation of horsemen and veterinarians at Penn National Race Course. While other similarly indicted co-defendants opted for plea-bargain deals, Rojas maintained her innocence even through an ordeal that she said "wrecked" her career.


In 2021 she took her case all the way to the United States Supreme Court, where her perseverance resulted in the overturning of a 27-month prison sentence and the vacating of all charges against her.

Rojas has since regained her previously revoked licensure to train Thoroughbreds in Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware, West Virginia and Arizona. On Tuesday, she wanted to add Kentucky to the list of states where she can legally ply her trade.

But after facing an intense round of questioning and testimony via videoconference by the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation (KHRGC)'s license review committee, Rojas instead ended up withdrawing her request for a Kentucky training license.

Rojas made that decision after the chair of that committee, Gregory Harbut, told her after the board emerged from closed-session deliberations that if she didn't choose to withdraw her license request, the committee's vote would "almost certainly result in the denial of this application."

Rojas didn't participate in the Dec. 4 hearing accompanied by an attorney. But she did understand the legal ramifications that were explained to her--namely, that if the KHRGC put a license denial on her record, it would jeopardize Rojas's ability to continue training in other states that had already granted her licenses. *Cont.*

"I don't want a denial on my record," Rojas said.

But, Rojas added, "I would like to reapply with my lawyer next to me to do this. Because, obviously, I didn't answer right, and I'm not really sure why you would prove me guilty when I'm not guilty of anything."

Earlier in Tuesday's hearing, Rojas had expressed frustration at the license review board's line of questioning, which had included numerous repetitive queries, such as, "Why do you think you are here today?" "Tell us why you're here." "What brings us to this process?"

(The occasional poor quality of the livestream audio and the wide-angle placement of the camera in a conference room made it difficult for *TDN* to ascertain at times exactly which KHRGC license review committee members were speaking. Beyond chair Harbut, the other members on Tuesday were Paul Brooker, Michael Dudgeon, Jamie Eads and Shannon Garner).

At one point, Rojas was admonished by a committee member, "It's important that you answer the questions that we ask truthfully."

Rojas was also reminded several times that, "This is not a criminal procedure, so you don't have to worry about double jeopardy."

But, Rojas said, that's exactly how she felt, stating to the

committee with exasperation, "You're trying to convict me again."

In July 2017, Rojas was found guilty on 14 of 21 counts of misbranding prescription drugs, charges that were brought against her as part of a Federal Bureau of Investigation inquiry into alleged equine drug administration at Penn National. She was found not guilty on seven counts of wire fraud.

As the *Paulick Report* wrote in a 2022 chronology of her case, "Rojas was accused of having veterinarians administer medications to horses within 24 hours of a race in violation of state regulations. Veterinarians who testified in the case say they also falsified dates of the treatments in records submitted to regulators. The practice, according to testimony given during the trial, was widespread at Penn National."

Sentenced to 27 months in federal prison, Rojas initially lost on appeal.

But Rojas petitioned the Supreme Court to hear the case, where, according to the *Paulick Report*, her legal team argued that "the trial judge and appellate court erred in their definition of misbranding in both jury instructions and in the appeal. Specifically, they said, the judge failed to instruct the jury properly on the distinction between 'administering' drugs and 'dispensing' them and that the government failed to prove that Rojas 'dispensed' the drugs to her horses." *Cont.*

At the Dec. 4, 2024 hearing for her Kentucky license, Rojas told committee members, "I don't really know what to say other than all my charges were dropped by the Supreme Court. They

overturned the federal government on all the charges [and] I've raced [as a licensed trainer since 2023 in other states] without a problem."

Rojas told the committee members that the conviction "totally wrecked my career. It wrecked my business. It broke me, obviously, paying lawyer's fees. I had the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association backing me. They paid half my fees, because it was such a fake charge. I had the Cato Institute backing me with the Supreme

Court. I've been backed by great people that know that I am innocent, so I feel like I shouldn't have to fight for this anymore."

One license review committee member reminded Rojas that

that her co-defendants had either all pleaded guilty or were proven guilty at trials. "I'd like you to tell us what you did. It's a pretty serious deal," the committee member said.

"It was really a serious deal in my life," Rojas agreed. "I spent

nine years fighting for my rights. I didn't take a 'deal.' All the other trainers took a guilty plea. I did not. I didn't do anything wrong. I'm not going to say I did anything wrong, because I didn't. What I was convicted on was misbranding, which was a completely false charge [because I was following the advice of] a veterinarian. I've used no illegal drugs, at all, ever."

"Then why did they convict you?" asked a committee member.

"They convicted me because they didn't understand the

charges," Rojas responded.

"Misbranding is such a far-fetched idea that [the jury] had no idea what it meant. It was a 14-day trial," Rojas continued. *Cont.*

"The jurors were falling asleep. The judge fell asleep. It was a crazy trial."

During Tuesday's hearing, two other individuals were also seeking to be relicensed by the KHRGC after various sanctions had been imposed against them.

The committee took testimony for nearly an hour total to cover all three cases, then deliberated in private for about 45 minutes before returning to a public session to vote on the applications.

Only in Rojas's case did the board suggest the withdrawal of the application.

The KHRGC committee voted unanimously to approve licenses for Cody Axmaker and Troy Wismer.

In 2022, Monmouth Park stewards had penalized Axmaker with a two-year suspension and a \$5,000 fine after one of his horses died from an accidental overdose of clenbuterol from an apparently mislabeled container.

Wismer, according to testimony at the hearing and from online Kentucky court records, had been convicted this past May of seven felony charges (strangulation, assault, domestic violence, violation of a protective order, burglary, robbery and evading police) stemming from his role in a 2023 altercation at Churchill Downs on GI Kentucky Derby Day and a series of related violent incidents that spilled over to the home of his ex-wife.

Wismer told the KHRGC on Tuesday that he had pleaded guilty to the charges on the advice of his attorney so he could enter a court-approved diversion program that spared him most of the jail time. His relicensing was made conditional upon drug and alcohol screenings.

Within minutes of the adjournment of the license review committee hearing, the KHRGC removed the two public-session videos of Tuesday's proceedings from the organization's YouTube channel.

JUST STEEL AMONG LUKAS RUNNERS TRAINING AT OAKLAWN, NEARING RETURN

Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas, who won his seventh GI Preakness Stakes in 2024 with recently retired new Gainesway stallion Seize the Grey (Arrogate), has two of his other highly regarded 2024 stakes performers training at Oaklawn Park for a return to the races.

BC Stables, LLC and Henry Schmueckle's Just Steel (Justify), winner of the 2023 Ed Brown Stakes and runner-up in Oaklawn's 2024 GI Arkansans Derby, GIII Southwest Stakes, and Smarty Jones Stakes, emerged from a fifth-place finish in the Preakness with a right-front leg fracture and subsequently required



surgery. Lukas told Oaklawn publicity this week that the sophomore returned to training about 60 days ago, but has yet to have a timed work.

"He actually looks terrific," Lukas said. "The time off and everything filled him out. He grew. He's 17 hands. Now, he's a man among the rest of these. I'm pretty optimistic that he's going to have a big year."

Lukas indicated there isn't a specific timetable or target for Just Steel. Cont.

"We'll just let him dictate it as we go along. He hasn't had a work yet, so we'll go from there."

Another prominent Lukas runner of 2024 was Lemon Muffin (Collected), who broke her maiden last February at 28-1 in Oaklawn's GIII Honeybee Stakes. The Aaron Sones, Julie Gilbert, and Harrison M. Sones runner was last seen finishing second in a Churchill allowance Nov. 13. She'd finished off the board in a number of races since her Honeybee win.

"She's doing good," Lukas said. "Her last race was more like her. We'll probably stay in our [allowance] conditions with her one more race, at least, before we move up."

The Oaklawn meet begins Friday, Dec. 6.

MCMAHON OF SARATOGA ADDS PROVOCATEUR TO 2025 ROSTER

McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds has added Provocateur (Into Mischief) for the 2025 breeding season with a stud fee set at \$5,000 LFSN, according to a press release from the New York stallion farm on Wednesday.

The 5-year-old will stand alongside three-time leading New York sire Central Banker and nationally ranked second-crop sire Solomini. The farm will hold their annual holiday stallion show on Saturday, Dec. 14 from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. ET., and all three stallions will be available for inspection.

Bred by Kingswood Farm and David Egan, Provocateur was a \$600,000 Keeneland September buy for Spendthrift Farm and MyRacehorse. The Todd Pletcher trainee won the Hutcheson Stakes at Gulfstream Park and finished third in the GI Woody Stephens Stakes. He was purchased for \$200,000 by McMahon during 2022 Keeneland November at the Horses of Racing Age Sale.

HOW I GOT HOOKED ON RACING: CHRISTINA BOSSINAKIS

For the past two weeks, we have been telling you how some of racing's biggest names fell in love with the sport. Now it's our turn. Here are some of the stories behind the bylines you see every day in the TDN.

Christina Bossinakis, Senior Editor

Without a doubt, I did not have the most conventional entry into horseracing. Growing up in Montreal, Canada, I was much more likely to have ventured into the world of harness racing rather than its Thoroughbred counterpart. Courtesy of Blue Bonnets (later re-named Hippodrome de Montreal), Montreal's racing landscape hadn't seen Thoroughbred racing since 1973, an era in which racetrack attendance in the province was at its zenith.

One of three daughters of Greek immigrant parents, I simply did not have the access to horses or racing like many others in the sport. Somewhat tangentially, I was introduced to racing pigeons (yes, as in the feathered variety) very early on, and I look back now and think that may have kindled my interest in racing competition, the propagation of sire lines and the development of female families, etc. Cont.

Of course, like many teenage girls, I was attracted to the beauty and majesty of the horse (The Black Stallion series was definitely a gateway drug) and I tried to get my hands on anything Thoroughbred related and watch anything that might appear on network television, which admittedly was slim pickings in those days before the advent of online streaming and satellite TV (we didn't even have TVG yet!).

In retrospect, a few key things triggered my deeper fascination with the sport. First, in the '80s, ABC carried racing, covering many of the sport's most important racing events. In my humble opinion, the network did a truly fantastic job in capturing the pageantry and excitement of the game, not to mention creating a cohesive and compelling storyline for many of the era's most notable racing figures.

Alysheba's Triple Crown run and the 1987 Breeders' Cup at Hollywood Park were among my earliest forays as a fan, and without a doubt, piqued my interest. The following season, a strapping filly by the name of Winning Colors, trained by none other than D. Wayne Lukas, won the Kentucky Derby, which propelled me into what would turn out to be a 30-year (and counting) love affair with the sport.

Speaking of D. Wayne Lukas--where do I begin? I have written about my introduction to the subsequent Hall of Famer in our co-authored book, Sermon on the Mount, but for those that may have missed it. I'll offer a brief flashback.

In 1994, I made my first visit to historic Saratoga Racecourse and by that time, I was a full-fledged racing nut. Already a bonafide Wayne Lukas fan, I had the chance for a brief meet-and-greet with him following a win by Chimes Band in that summer's GII King's Bishop. Since I didn't have the access I enjoy nowadays, it was left to my determined cousin to smooth talk the security guard into letting us into the winner's circle.

What transpired has been forever burned into my brain (there also is a picture of said impromptu autograph encounter in the book). To this day, I maintain that the respectful, eloquent and gracious behavior of someone I so looked up to and revered cemented my long-term involvement in the industry. I think it goes without saying, I was a HUGE Wayne Lukas fan prior to our initial meeting. However, I believe the encounter really helped underscore a stark counterpoint, not every celebrity is as charitable or welcoming as Wayne was that day. The truth is that a response of disregard or disinterest might have been the first drop that could have ultimately precipitated a change in the direction of my life.

Starting off as a young girl with virtually no ties nor reason to embrace horse racing, I now understand how vitally important showcasing and celebrating our sport's stars and champions is in drawing, nurturing and retaining future generations of fans. It certainly got me on my way.

NYRA INCREASES 10 BIG A WINTER MEET STAKES PURSES BY \$25,000

The New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) has increased the purses of 10 Aqueduct winter meet stakes by \$25,000 as the 49-day schedule features a total of 20 either black-type or graded races worth \$3.1 million, the track said in a press release on Wednesday.

The meet, which opens Wednesday, Jan. 1 and continues through Sunday, Mar. 30, includes \$25,000 purse increases for the Busanda, Ruthless, Damon Runyon (NYB), East View (NYB), Say Florida Sandy (NYB), Broadway (NYB), Correction, Gander (NYB), Maddie May (NYB) and the Jimmy Winkfield. Each will be offered with a purse of \$125,000.

A trio of races previously offered at the 2024 winter meet--the Haynesfield (NYB), Excelsior, and Biogio's Rose (NYB)--will be run during the 2025 Aqueduct spring meet. The Franklin Square (NYB), Rego Park (NYB), and Cicada, which were previously held during the winter meet, will not be run in 2025.

With the exception of Opening Week, live racing will be conducted Thursday-Sunday from the week of Jan. 9 through the week of Feb. 27. Aqueduct will host a Presidents' Day card on Monday, Feb. 17. The winter meet will offer three-day race weeks Friday through Sunday throughout the month of March.

NEWMARKET, UK — The Wednesday of the December Mares Sale may have become a quieter session than was once the case but there are still plenty of enticing broodmare prospects, not least from the Godolphin draft. It provided five of the day's top ten lots, including the session-topper Bridestones (Ire), a listed-placed filly by Teofilo (Ire) out of the G1 Fillies' Mile winner White Moonstone (Dynaformer).

The four-year-old was selected by agent Alex Elliott, who assisted the Amo Racing team in the purchase of the overall sale-topper, the 4.8 million gns You Got To Me (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}), and it was the former part-owner of the Irish Oaks winner, Anthony Ramsden's Valmont, in the chair to buy Bridestones. Elliott, was aided in the bidding by Ramsden's nephew Charlie Spencer, the son of former champion jockey Jamie.

"She will go back to Whatton Manor [Stud] to be looked after by the Players," Elliott said. "Teofilo is a very good broodmare sire and he works very well with Lope De Vega, one of Anthony's favourite stallions."

Elliott also signed for Instinction (GB) (Brazen Beau {Aus}), a five-year-old half-sister to the G3 Prix Eclipse winner Eddie's Boy (GB) (Havana Grey {GB}), sold from Houghton Bloodstock at 120,000gns. Cont. p3

The dual juvenile winner was in foal for the second time to Havana Grey's stud-mate Sergei Prokofiev and is from the strong black-type family of Swiss Lake (Indian Ridge).

"She made a lot sense – it's that old Lordship Stud family, a very fast family," he said Elliott. "She is perfect for Havana Grey and, if we can take a good-looking Sergei out of her, that will go a good way to paying us back for today. She is for myself and a few others."

In keeping with the earlier days of the sale, figures were up year-on-year during this third and penultimate session – notably an improvement in the clearance rate from 79% to 86%. That brought about an uplift in aggregate to 4,618,000gns (+25%), while the average was up by 29% at 24,962gns and the median improved to 16,000gns (+14%).

With one smaller session still to come on Thursday morning, the December Mares Sale is already in record territory. Turnover from the first three days stands at 82,742,000gns, surpassing the bumper year of 2022.





The unraced mare was bought for 10,000gns from Cheveley Park Stud and is by their emerging broodmare sire Dutch Art (GB).

Admittedly, she has not has a straightforward run at stud just yet as she has been barren in two of her five seasons and is yet to produce a winner. There are grounds for hope, however, as she has a yearling filly Korbut (GB), by Study Of Man (Ire), to race for her and was offered in foal to Ulysses (Ire).

Frolova is a half-sister to the G1 Prix Jean Prat winner Good Guess (GB), who now stands alongside his sire Zodiac (GB) at Tally-Ho Stud and her second dam is the great Russian Rhythm.

SF: Basically, what you're doing is becoming a bank for breeders. Can you tell me how this idea came about?

OD: The idea came very naturally to us after talking with some breeders, particularly Eric Puerari from Haras des Capucines. We are all aware that sire power is a key success driver in any select

sale, and we were thinking about how we could help breeders to increase the depth of the top profiles in our yearling sales based on the fact that Deauville attracts the top buyers every year. We're pretty sure that those people would be happy to buy a bit more at home if they find a bit more of the high-profile yearlings they are looking for.

SF: I have the impression that sales companies might have done this quietly in the past by extending credit and not asking for payment until the horse actually sells. Are you the first people to do it formally in this way?

OD: That's a good question. I don't know enough about what sales companies did in terms of initiatives of that kind in recent years, but yes, it's quite unusual to market it as a financial product. It's really aimed at letting breeders know that there is something for them, and if they think that they have a really good mare, they can go the extra step in terms of a covering sire to produce one of those really, really sought-after yearlings. And we can help.

SF: Just to be clear, this applies to international sires, correct? You could breed to Dubawi, for example. Cont. p8

OD: It's open to the best stallions, and of course if we are talking about Europe, you have some in France, but there is obviously a bigger number in the UK and in Ireland. It's open to French breeders or non-French breeders, but we'd rather focus, at least for the first year, on people breeding in France. You can be living in the UK or in Ireland or in the US, but if you have some nice mares standing in France and you really want to offer them the best stallion and maybe a better stallion that you had in mind initially, then that's where SirePower+ comes in.

SF: How has it been received by stallion owners?

OD: To date, it has been welcomed very positively, both by stallion owners and breeders as well. We already got some nice applications--applications that are really, really in line with what we had in mind when launching this product, That's good news, and we also had a positive response in the way that it triggered a good discussion among the breeders in France about how to enhance the quality of what is produced in France. I think listening to the breeders can only help us collectively to launch other initiatives in the near future to achieve the same objective.

SF: Do you imagine it mostly being yearlings that are produced under this scheme or could it be weanlings or in-foal mares?

OD: It could be weanlings, but I'd say its primarily aimed at producing yearlings because France remains a real market for yearlings more than weanlings. Still, if someone has it in mind to produce top-class weanlings to sell in December here in Arqana, I would definitely support that plan, too.

SF: What would have to happen, say by the year after next, for you to say, `wow, this was a big success and we're going to build on it?' What would you like to see happen?

OD: I'd like to see an increased number of yearlings by what we know are or will be the stallions most in demand by those buyers that we do very much to attract here in Deauville.

SF: Is it becoming more and more competitive for sales companies to attract those very top yearlings, making initiatives like SirePower+ necessary to remain competitive? Will we see more and more of this type of promotion?

OD: What we really, really have to improve upon here in France is the depth we can offer at the top end of the catalogue. We need more Classic broodmares going to the best stallions. We need to attract more of those good stallions and keep them in France. The stallion ranks have been improving over the last years, but we have still some progress to make. Everything is linked, so you cannot pretend to have the best stallions in France if you don't have the broodmares and vice versa, so we need to work on both sides. That's why we are wondering within Arqana what a sales company can do to help to make the whole French industry stronger.

SF: Do you imagine people buying mares at this sale, thinking,` I'm going to take advantage of this offer?'

OD: Yes, very much so. The very last big show of the year in Deauville is this breeding stock sale, which has made huge progress over the last years, and which features a strong catalogue. On a very exciting Saturday, we are featuring a Classic-winning filly in the name of Sparkling Plenty, top-class mares, the dams of Unquestionable, Tamfana, and Metropolitan to name the most recent Group 1 winners, and a good bunch of very exciting racing prospects like Spanish Eyes, Grand Stars and many others. We also have some weanlings by the most exciting sires like Frankel, Sea The Stars, Lope De Vega, Siyouni and many others. It's a strong catalogue and I think we will have a good crowd coming from all over the world including a lot of Japanese, so we're hoping for a successful sale.

I do think that what we launched is a good incentive to buy a nice broodmare here, keep her in France and if you can have half of the nomination fee financed until the sale of the yearling, it can only help people be a bit bolder to buy some nice mares and leave them in France.

"MONEY WHERE OUR MOUTH IS" -STEWART'S BIG PLANS FOR TATTERSALLS PURCHASES

John Stewart says that he is 'putting his money where his mouth is' after spending 6,265,000gns--close to \$8 million--on five fillies at Tattersalls this week, headed by Group 1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner Vertical Blue (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}) at 3.2 million gns.

Vertical Blue is trained by Francis Graffard, who manages the career of Stewart's most high-profile horse in Europe, Goliath (Ger) (Adlerflug {Ger}). The four-year-old gelding was last seen finishing sixth in the Japan Cup.

That effort was deemed unsatisfactory by the man behind Resolute Racing, who has outlined some lofty ambitions for Graffard and the rest of the trainers on his roster.

He said, "I'm pretty satisfied with the purchases. The auction played out pretty much as I thought it would. I was very targeted in looking for specific horses. Of course, we one hundred per cent wanted to be focussed on the top end of the market and Vertical Blue was the number one horse on my list at the sale."

Stewart added, "She is trained by Francis, who trains Goliath for us. We have developed a really close relationship since we got Goliath and spent time together with him in Japan and got to meet his wife and family in France as well. He could not stop talking about how special this filly is and how he wanted to keep her in the barn.

"I believe in Francis. He's an innovator from a trainer's standpoint in that he wants to compete globally. He's not afraid to go and take risks. When I bring up some of these ideas about what I want to do with these horses, he probably thinks that I'm crazy but he's the kind of person who tries to figure out how we can do it. I can see him genuinely getting excited when he talks about some of the things we want to do." Cont. p10

Along with Vertical Blue, Stewart snapped up Irish 1,000 Guineas runner-up A Lilac Rolla (Ire) (Harry Angel (Ire)) for 1 million gns and Group performer Village Voice (GB) (Zarak (Fr)) at 1.3 million. Speedier types Tales Of The Heart (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}) and It Ain't Two (GB) (Clyx {GB}) completed the spend at 650,000gns and 115,000gns respectively. All of the horses were purchased with Keeneland in mind.

Stewart continued, "We're going to surprise a lot of people next year with what we do with Goliath in how we turn him into an international success. He's already a European success and he's a success in Japan, even though he got sixth in the Japan Cup. We're not satisfied with that but the trip was very successful. Francis got a taste of that, as my team did as well. We're going to be back next year and we're going to have a different strategy. We're going to win that race. I didn't get into this sport to go to these races and watch other people win them. It's not enough to just watch these horses competing and, if you look at the horses I bought, the majority of them--outside of Vertical Blue--are specifically focussed on Keeneland. The turf tends to be pretty soft and, even our turf horses that we have in our programme, like Didia and Pounce, haven't run well at

Keeneland because they like the firm turf that you see at Saratoga, Gulfstream or Del Mar.

"We targeted buying the horses who like the soft ground. Resolute is going to have multiple horses taking part in these graded stakes races at Keeneland on turf. That's my home track and it's the one track we haven't won races at even though we have won races all over the world. That's not good enough and I'm not one who's going to make excuses. We're putting our money where our mouth is and are buying horses to win on the turf at Keeneland."

The March-foaled bay raced in the front rank early and was steadied to track the leaders in a handy fourth after the initial exchanges. Readied for his bid soon after turning for home, he quickened in style to hit the front just inside the quarter-mile marker and engaged overdrive inside the final furlong to easily outclass Oursin (GB) (Phoenix Of Spain {Ire}) by an impressive 4 1/2 lengths. He becomes Kingman's 36th Rising Star and joins an honour roll which includes sires Calyx (GB), Palace Pier (GB), Persian King (Ire) and Headman (GB).

"He's got a lot of potential and was probably just ready to go," said rider Kieran Shoemark. "It was pretty smooth and he picked up good. He's bred to get a little bit further, but I think he's got plenty of speed at the same time. He's not had an away day, or anything like that, and when I asked him to quicken I was happy how straight he was. He went straight to the line and was very professional."

Bowmark is the fourth foal and scorer produced by Listed Trigo Stakes victrix Bound (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), herself a daughter of G1 Oaks runner-up Remember When (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire)). Remember When's sextet of black-type performers includes G1 Derby hero Serpentine (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)), Group 3-winning G1 Oaks third Bye Bye Baby (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Group 2-winning G1 Nassau Stakes runner-up Wedding Vow (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)). Wedding Vow, in turn, is the dam of G2 Golden Fleece Stakes and G2 Royal Lodge Stakes placegetter Capulet (Justify). The March-foaled homebred bay is half to a yearling colt by Wootton Bassett (GB) and a weanling filly by Baaeed (GB).

RACING RISK MODELS BEING USED TO IMPROVE OUTCOMES FOR RACEHORSES IN BRITAIN

The British racing industry, in partnership with the Royal Veterinary College (RVC), is using data spanning 14 years to identify and help reduce risk in the sport, via the Racing Risk Models (RRM), the British Horseracing Authority (BHA) and Horse Welfare Board (HWB) announced on Wednesday.

Work on the RRM began in 2018 and its development and implementation has been one of the core recommendations of the HWB's 2020 strategy, A Life Well Lived. Academic researchers from the RVC have since been analysing data collected for each race start in Britain, including horse details, racing history, trainer, jockey and racecourse information, combined with details of any adverse outcomes sustained during the race.

Potential risk factors identified by the model span five categories--horse, race, course, trainer and jockey. Experts at the RVC apply multivariable statistical modelling to the data to identify areas of increased risk, and the strength of association. This then allows for predictive models to potentially identify how injury and fatality rates might be affected by any individual factors.

In 2023, the model was expanded to include Flat racing data, alongside the 400,000 jump records already analysed as part of the project.

As new data emerges and future race starts are analysed, the Royal Veterinary College and Equine Safety Group (ESG) will continue to explore risk factors, their associations and potential recommendations for the future. Led by the BHA, the ESG is made up of experts from across British racing including owners, trainers, jockeys, racecourses, veterinary and safety advisors and internal data analysts.

James Given, director of equine regulation, safety and welfare at the BHA and member of the Horse Welfare Board, said, "The Royal Veterinary College Epidemiological Team have academic expertise and independence that delivers scientifically rigorous evidence that enables recommendations and actions to be based on indisputable data.

"Reduction of risk and injury is one of the core pillars of our welfare strategy and informed, evidence-based decision making is integral to this."

BARZALONA STRIKES FOR FRANCE IN LONGINES IJC by Alan Carasso

On the back of a victory aboard Pour Moi (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) for Coolmore and trainer Andre Fabre in the G1 Investec Epsom Derby in 2011, a then 20-year-old Mickael Barzalona took up a short-term contract to ride in Hong Kong, bringing up a single winner from 42 rides. Now all of 33 years of age, the Frenchman experienced the other end of the spectrum to take out the valuable Longines International Jockeys' Championship (IJC) before a packed house at Happy Valley Racecourse, book-ending the four-race competition with victories en route to amassing 30 points and easily outdistancing 11 other top riders from all over the world.

A 30-1 chance pre-post for the IJC, Barzalona was off to the perfect start in the first leg over the 1000 metres, driving fellow roughie **Sergeant Pepper (Aus)** (I Am Invicible {Aus}) to a victory that was anything but 'lonely,' as **Lean Master (GB)** (Havana Grey {GB}), the mount of William Buick, and **Parents' Love (Aus)** (Deep Field {Aus}), ridden by defending champion Vincent Ho, chimed in late on. In so doing, Barzalona scooped the 12 points for finishing first (video).

Barzalona was alloted the mount on **Forever Glorious (GB)** (Archipenko), who was off at 20-1 in the second leg going 1650 metres, and he looked well on his way to all but sewing up the IJC when he swept in from approaching the final furlong. He was joined shortly thereafter by James McDonald and **Prince Alex** (**Aus**) (Animal Kingdom)--a 6-year-old full-brother to US Grade I winner Oleksandra (Aus)--but went down to a battling defeat when the dust had settled (video). Colin Keane and **Sure Joyful (NZ)** (Tarzino {NZ}) got home well for third.

Hollie Doyle rarely leaves empty-handed on IJC night, having finished a joint-third on her maiden appearance in 2020 and a dead-heat second the following season. Cont. p17

Longines IJC Cont.

Her first-ever victory in the IJC came courtesy of trainer David Hayes on a hot favourite in 2020, and the Lindsay Park maestro was responsible for getting her into the thick of things on Wednesday. Assigned the mount on \$6.30 (5.30-1) gamble Soleil Fighter (GB) (Sea The Moon {Ger}), Doyle was able to settle the 4-year-old on the back of the speed, peeled out and proved narrowly best over Silo (Aus) (National Defense {GB}, Karis Teetan) and Aestheticism (NZ) (Derryn {Aus}), Zac Purton) (video).

Five of the 12 IJC contestants were in with a winning chance heading into the final leg at 1200 metres. Barzalona's mount, Aurora Lady (Aus) (Star Witness {Aus}) was the third choice at just below 6-1, but had a potentially tricky draw to deal with in 12 for trainer Pierre Ng. Away alertly and ridden positively, the bay raced three wide and without the benefit of cover in the first third of the field and put the race away in the straight, comfortably holding Kyrus Dragon (Aus) (Safeguard {Aus}, Keane) and Super Joy N Fun (NZ) (What's The Story {NZ}, Ho) (video). McDonald and Doyle were unable to add to their 12 points and shared runner-up honours.

"Pierre was quite confident in Aurora Lady's chances after he disappointed at Sha Tin last time when things didn't work out," said Barzalona. "He's been unlucky a couple of times recently and given we were drawn wide he told me to try and get forward as long as they didn't go mad early on. I trusted my horse and he didn't let me down.

"It's a hyper-competitive jockeys challenge and when you see the major names up there on the roll of honour, I'm delighted to have mine alongside," Barzalona said.

Barzalona, who takes home the HK\$600,000 first prize, becomes the fourth Frenchman to take out the IJC, joining

Barzalona has the call for Fabre aboard Marquisat (Ire) (Zarak {Fr}) in Sunday's G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase. It will be his final Group 1 ride for Godolphin before he takes up a role as first jockey for the French-trained horses of the Aga Khan Studs in 2025.
