



LOCKED & LOADED IN THE CIGAR MILE



'TDN Rising Star' Locked wins the Cigar Mile | Sarah Andrew

Making just his second start of the season, Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and Walmac Farm's 'TDN Rising Star' **Locked** (Gun Runner) made up for lost time with a powerful performance against older horses in a loaded renewal of Saturday's GII Cigar Mile Handicap at the Big A.

It was 1 1/2 lengths back to GI Forego Stakes winner and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint third Mullikin (Violence) in second. The overachieving Maryland-bred Post Time (Frosted), runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, rallied from the back for third.

One of the early-book favorites for the GI Kentucky Derby following a victory in Keeneland's GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity and third-place finish as the favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last fall, Locked missed a pair of intended starts earlier this spring, including the GII Coolmore Fountain of Youth Stakes at Gulfstream Park Mar. 2. He was subsequently taken out of training by Hall of Famer Todd Pletcher due to a knee injury.

Pletcher extended his all-time lead with his seventh Cigar Mile victory. He has won this race in three of the last four editions.

"He came into the year with high hopes and unfortunately, we got sidelined for a little while, but he came back and finished up the year the way he did and proved that very good 2-year-olds turn into really good 3-year-olds as well," Pletcher said.







"We had a physical setback that we had to give him some time for. It was unfortunate timing because I think that the way some of the Triple Crown races set up this year would have suited him really well, but that's the way it goes sometimes."

Off as the 2-1 favorite after returning from the shelf with an impressive 7 1/2-length victory-good for a career-high 97 Beyer Speed Figure-going seven furlongs at the Big A Oct. 19, Locked

was ridden along in an outside sixth beneath Hall of Famer John Velazquez through fractions of :22.87 and :45.30. He hit the gas rounding the far turn, revved up three deep approaching the quarter pole and came rolling down the center to win with authority.

The Cigar Mile field of 10 also included GI Woody Stephens Stakes winner **Book'em Danno** (Bucchero) (fifth) and G1 Saudi Cup winner **Senor Buscador** (Mineshaft), who finished ninth after stumbling at the break. Both were backed at 5-1 odds.

"He showed up today and delivered at a distance that--he's shown he's very versatile, but I think his real strength is going to be getting him back around two turns," Pletcher said. "He needed the start to get under his belt from the layoff and to set him up for a big performance like this."

On a potential start in the GI Pegasus World Cup Jan. 25 at Gulfstream Park, Pletcher said, "I'll talk to Aron (Wellman of Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners) and the guys. That's one of the things we talked about. Of course, you've got Saudi a month after that, so we've got some options."

Wellman added, "I'd be lying to you if I said we weren't devastated when we had to take him off the Derby trail this spring because we really believed he was a bonafide Classic horse. That being said, looking back on the nature of his injury and the uniqueness of it, we just feel really fortunate to be in

this position to showcase him again. Even his allowance win here, six weeks ago, was brilliant, he ran fast and now to win a race like the Cigar as a 3-year-old, it just puts an exclamation point on what has been, unfortunately, a brief but brilliant career. It is also unfortunate that the Cigar is not a Grade I. I think we'd all agree that in prestige, this is a Grade I race, and this was a Grade I field today, without question."

Locked was featured in our 'Second Chances' series following a debut third at Saratoga last summer.

Pedigree Notes:

Hailing from the third crop of leading young sire Gun Runner, Locked was produced by a winning half-sister to MGISW Gabby's Golden Gal (Medaglia d'Oro) and MGSW & GISP Always a Princess (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}). Locked is one of 10 Grade I winners for Gun Runner.

The Gun Runner/Malibu Moon cross is already responsible for GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Sierra Leone and GSWs Shotgun Hottie and Runninsonofagun. Locked, a \$425,000 Keeneland September yearling, is also bred similarly to MGISW and 'TDN Rising Star' Taiba (Gun Runner), who is out of a Flatter mare.

Luna Rosa, also responsible for the unraced, Japanese based 2-year-old colt Ask At Bat (Caravaggio) (\$170,000 OBS April purchase by T B Bloodstock), had a filly by Tiz the Law in 2023 and a colt by Early Voting this year. She was bred back to Gun Runner.

Muhimma stopped the clock for 1 1/8 miles in 1:49.84, besting the 1:50.37 final time of her male counterparts in the Remsen.

It's an embarassment of riches for winning conditioner Brad Cox where it comes to the 2-year-old filly division. He also trains the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner and soon-to-be crowned champion 2-year-old filly Immersive (Nyquist) as well as last weekend's GII Golden Rod Stakes winner Good Cheer (Medaglia d'Oro). The unbeaten Godolphin homebreds are currently in first and second place on the Kentucky Oaks leaderboard with 40 and 20 points, respectively.

"I'm proud of what our team has been able to do with these horses and I'm proud of the horses," Cox said. "We've been put in a good position with fillies that have responded and now our job is to turn the page on this year and try to execute next year."

He continued, "I'm thinking we'll probably send her to Payson to kind of chill out over the next month and then come up with a game plan moving forward. We have Fair Grounds and Oaklawn as our main focus with where we run, and we'll see. There's options up here as well. We are lucky with these fillies, and we're hoping to have some that will pick up black type here."

Far from a secret off as the 2-5 favorite while facing nine rivals, the stunning gray was off a step slow beneath Florent Geroux from her rail draw, but still led the way heading into the clubhouse turn. Muhimma held a narrow advantage through fractions of :23.94 and :48.24 and kicked for home as the one to catch. Ballerina d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro), off at odds of 9-1 while adding blinkers and trying dirt for the first time here, made a run at Muhimma in the stretch, but the heavy favorite was never in any serious dangerous and had a length over that rival at the wire.

Muhimma earned a field-best 83 Beyer Speed Figure while winning by 7 1/2 lengths as the 4-5 chalk on debut Sept. 20, then scored by a geared-down 5 1/2 lengths going seven furlongs in an optional claimer Nov. 1. Both wins were registered in press-and-pounce fashion.

"First time 2-year-olds going that far, I thought (the fractions) were quick enough and she fended off a horse making a run at her down the lane, so she showed some determination and she showed she could handle the mile and an eighth," Cox said.

"She's big. She's by a very good sire, very good broodmare sire, and the mare herself was good going long. We felt confident she would handle the distance and right now she just needs to handle the mile and an eighth. I'm happy with the performance today."







stakes winner worldwide for Munnings. She was the co-second most expensive of 85 yearlings by Munnings to switch hands in 2023, bringing \$700,000 at Keeneland September.

Bred in Kentucky by Three Chimneys Farm, Muhimma is the second foal out of Princesa Carolina (Tapit), a winner of the Dueling Grounds Oaks going 1 5/16 miles over the lawn at Kentucky Downs. Muhimma's very talented and versatile second dam Pure Clan (Pure Prize) won the GI American Oaks and GI Flower Bowl Invitational Stakes, both on grass. She also won a pair of graded races on dirt and was third in the 2008 Kentucky Oaks.

Princesa Carolina produced colts by Gun Runner in 2023-24 and was bred back to the leading sire for 2025. Her yearling colt by Gun Runner brought \$2.2 million from Whisper Hill Farm at Keeneland September, the second-highest price of the entire sale.

POSTER SWITCHES TO DIRT, STAYS PERFECT IN REMSEN WHILE PRAT SETS STAKES

RECORD by Steve Sherack

After upsetting last weekend's GII Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes at Churchill Downs with First Resort (Uncle Mo), Godolphin and trainer Eoin Harty doubled up in dramatic fashion with fellow 2-year-old homebred **Poster** (Munnings) in Saturday's GII Remsen Stakes at Aqueduct.

The victory, good for 10 points on the road to the GI Kentucky Derby, also provided jockey Flavien Prat with his record-setting 80th stakes win of the season and his 55th graded stakes win of the year, tying Hall of Famer Jerry Bailey.

Making his dirt and stakes debut after beginning his career with a pair of grass wins going one mile at Ellis Park Aug. 19 and

Keeneland Oct. 12, the unbeaten Poster, off at odds of 9-2, was last of six as the Bill Mott-trained debut winner **Tux** (**Tapit**) was pressed by big-figure, second-out maiden winner and 4-5 favorite **Keewaydin** (**Instagrand**) through an opening quarter in :23.95.

Up a spot into fifth through a half mile in :48.59, Poster launched while four wide approaching the quarter pole and struck the front as they straightened for home.

Poster enjoyed a two-length advantage at the stretch call and looked long gone, but began to idle late. Keewaydin's Chad Brown-trained stablemate **Aviator Gui** (Uncle Mo), back on dirt after a fourth-place finish in the grassy Awad Stakes Oct. 19, was caught in traffic on the far turn and raced a bit green down the lane, but leveled off beautifully to mount a serious late rally.

Those two hit the wire together with Poster hanging on to win

it by a nose in a bobber. It was another three lengths back to the well-named Tux in third.

"He's got a dirt pedigree, and it wasn't actually his first, well it was his first run on dirt, but he trained on dirt prior to coming to me," Harty said. "Considering his pedigree, I know the family's ins and outs, and I didn't think he'd have a problem with it and I'm glad to be proven right."

Harty continued, "(Prat) said he made a premature move, he

saw the second horse in some trouble and decided to exploit the moment. He said he felt he moved a bit too soon, but if he didn't make the move then, it might be a little too late. That is why you employ guys like Prat."

Poster was ridden by Prat for the first time after being steered by Rafael Bejarano in his previous two career starts in Kentucky.

"When I turned for home, I figured it was going to be a long way by myself," Prat said. "He got to the eighth pole and started looking around and felt like the job was done. He regrouped nicely when that horse came."

As for his milestone victory, Prat added, "I'm very thankful. There's a lot of people behind me who supported me all year long, and Godolphin is a big part of it. They've been very supportive of me, and my agent has done a great job as well. Just very thankful."

It was another tough Remsen defeat for Brown, who saddled both Zandon and Sierra Leone to near misses in 2021 and 2023, respectively.

"(Aviator Gui) ran really well," Brown said. "I continue to be a little unlucky in this race myself now. I won it years back (in 2014 with Leave the Light On)--lately it's just been a lot of close seconds."

Brown added, "(Keewaydin) just didn't fire today. I don't have any immediate excuse for him."

Pedigree Notes:

Poster becomes the 29th graded/group winner and 80th stakes winner worldwide for Munnings, who was also responsible for Saturday's GII Demoiselle Stakes heroine and 'TDN Rising Star' Muhimma in the card's following race.

Poster and Muhimma were both produced by Tapit mares. The Munnings x Tapit cross has also yielded graded winners Bonny South and Finite.

Pin Up, a maiden of four career starts, produced a colt by Nyquist this year and was bred back to Maclean's Music. Pin Up brought \$130,000 from Imagine earlier this year at the Keeneland January sale.

Poster's second dam Cara Rafaela won the 1995 GI Hollywood Starlet Stakes and was also runner-up in that term's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. The 2006 Broodmare of the Year went on to produce the brilliant Bernardini (A.P. Indy).

NYQUIST'S TENMA BACK ON TOP IN

STARLET by Christina Bossinakis



Tenma besting Look Forward in Saturday's GII Starlet | Benoit

Getting blinkers off following an uninspired third in her most recent start in the GII Oak Leaf at Santa Anita in October, Baoma

Corp.'s **Tenma** (Nyquist) went to the front and never looked back, rolling to a confident victory in Saturday's GII Starlet Stakes at Los Alamitos.

Hustled to the front by the new-on-board Juan Hernandez, the 5-2 second choice quickly encountered **Look Forward** (Bolt d'Oro), a debut winner at Del Mar last month, who pressed her from the inside through an opening quarter in :23.41. With the pair continuing to exchange blows through a reasonable :48.25 half, the leaders kept each other close rounding the home turn. Remaining in lockstep with their noses pointed to the wire, Look Forward gained a brief advantage in the lane but it was a stubborn Tenma who regained the winning thread late to best her rival by 1 3/4 lengths. 8-5 favorite **Vodka With a Twist** (Thousand Words), who finished runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies last out, rounded out the trifecta, nine lengths behind the top two. GSW **Nooni** (Win Win Win), herself the \$1.8 million OBS March topper, was fourth.

"I worked her before her first race and then again last week [Dec. 2 at Santa Anita, 4f:47 3/5, 7/62] and she went really good," said Hernandez. "With the blinkers off she relaxed perfectly and was really enjoying herself out there."

A neck winner under Kazushi Kimura in her career bow at Del Mar in August, the \$850,000 OBSAPR grad followed up with a nose score ahead of Vodka With a Twist in the Sept. 7 GI Del Mar Debutante Stakes before her initial lifetime defeat last time out.

The victory represented the eighth for her Hall of Fame trainer, who also conditioned Dream Tree (2017), Chasing Yesterday (2018), Bast (2019), Varda (2020), Eda (2021), Faiza (2022) and Nothing Like You last year. He won the race three times when it was known as the Hollywood Starlet at Hollywood Park with Excellent Meeting (1998), Habibti (2001) and Streaming (2013).

"It's great to win the Starlet again," said Baffert. "She had been training really well. She took a step back after Del Mar, so that's why we decided to pass the Breeders' Cup [Juvenile Fillies]. She was back to her old self and I thought she would bring her A game today and Juan (Hernandez) is riding with such confidence."

Pedigree Notes:

Bred by TV celebrity chef Bobby Flay, the \$200,000 Keeneland September yearling flourished into an \$850,000 OBS April juvenile after Donato Lanni secured the flashy filly for Boama Corp. Tenma is the second foal for Amaganssett, purchased for \$875,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale in 2018.

Second dam Twirl is a full-sister to Irish Group 1 winner Misty For Me (Ire), herself responsible for MG1SWs U S Navy Flag and Roly Poly, both by War Front. Additionally, Misty For Me is also the dam of Group 1 scorer Ballydoyle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who in turn produced a pair of black-type winners. Unraced Amagansett, who produced a colt by Munnings in 2023, was expatiated to Japan after selling for \$400,000 at last season's Fasig-Tipton November Sale.



The runner-up in the GIII Go for Wand Stakes a year ago, Tizzy in the Sky was well-prepared this time around as she netted her first graded stakes score at the Big A on Saturday.

The dark bay finished off the board in the GIII Royal Delta Stakes at Gulfstream Park back in February, but won the Top Flight Invitational Stakes at Aqueduct in mid-April. Tizzy in the Sky ran sixth in the GI Ogden Phipps Stakes at the Spa in June.

Coming off the bench after a rest and sent off as a 3-1 shot here, the 5-year-old tracked to the outside of a longshot up the backstretch. Gunning her engine around the far turn, Tizzy in the Sky collared her rival at the quarter pole and staved off a late challenge from Occult and Movie Moxie to secure a career high. Securing his 79th stakes win of the year--equaling Irad Ortiz's

single-season record set in 2022--Flavien Prat is now at 54 graded stakes wins, which is one shy of Jerry Bailey's 2003 record of 55.

"That was a huge effort," winning trainer Todd Pletcher said. "We sent her out to Stowe Burke's for a little freshening in Saratoga and kind of had this in mind if everything went well. We had to rush a little bit to have her ready, but she is such a willing horse. She trains very well, and her breezes are strong with good gallop-outs. I was worried inside the eighth pole after those fractions that she could hold off some of the late closers, and to her credit, that was a big effort."

"We wanted her to be forward," he added. "I thought Flavien [Prat] made the right call when he opted to pop outside and stalk instead of continuing to press the pedal, that was a smart move."

Pedigree Notes:

Tizzy in the Sky is the first graded stakes winner for her sire (by Empire Maker). The winner's dam is responsible for a yearling filly by Instagrand and she foaled a filly by War of Will Apr. 11. Tiz the Tide was entered in Mandaloun's book for next term. Under Tizzy in the Sky's third dam we find MGISW Colonel John (Tiznow).

After over two months off, the gelding rolled into Toronto and faced snowy conditions. As a 5-1 shot here, the chestnut effectively used his gate speed and promptly made the lead. Get Smokin slushed through the snow and turned the race into a carousel. Entering the lane with more to give, the Mark Casse trainee stole the show like the Grinch in Whoville.

Pedigree Notes:

Get Smokin adds another graded trophy on behalf of his sire (by Stormy Atlantic), who produced high level winners like Got Stormy, Fifty Five and Storm the Hill. The winner's dam is responsible for unraced 2-year-old filly Smoldering Ash (Get Stormy) and a yearling colt by Classic Empire. Hookah Lady foaled a filly by Practical Joke Mar. 25 and was bred to Golden Pal for 2025. Champion grass mare Dayatthespa (City Zip) is part of Get Smokin's extended female family.

HOW I GOT HOOKED ON RACING: ROCCO LANDESMAN

How did we get hooked on this sport? We all have stories about how our love affair developed and blossomed. The TDN reached out to numerous notable people in the industry to get their stories to find out how they got hooked and stayed hooked on the sport.

Rocco Landesman, Broadway Producer and former chairman of the National Endowment for the Arts

I've always been an excitement junkie. I love the risk, love the adrenaline you get from that. I've had a career in the Broadway Theater and there's nothing riskier than that.

I was in high school in St. Louis. There was no pari-mutuel wagering in Missouri, but there was in Illinois. East St. Louis had



two tracks, Cahokia Downs and Fairmount Park. A friend of mine in high school loved going over there and playing the horses. I guess when you're 16, 17, they can't call you a degenerate horseplayer. You're not old enough. He brought me one day. Of course, the worst thing that could happen, happened. I won.

I'm sure everybody begins with the same story. They go to the track for the first time and win money and you think to yourself 'they're giving away money here, this is the greatest.'

We started going to Cahokia Downs fairly regularly. The racetrack is an ecosystem of its own; it's a world unto itself. The colorful silks, the backstretch life, the characters. You enter a whole world when you go to the racetrack and the whole thing was magical for me. I later became a horse owner and have had a lifelong love affair with horse racing.

I never lost that when I went to college in Madison, Wisconsin. Very often I would drive down to Chicago to go to Arlington, Sportsman's or Hawthorne. I went to a conference for writers once in Vermont, so I would drive to Pownal to go to Green Mountain.

Wherever I was, I'd find a racetrack and we would go. I love not only the excitement of it, but the entire world of racing, a world unto itself. I've always been entranced and seduced by that world and I still am.

One of the down sides of having digital access is that I don't go to the track nearly as much as I used to. Today, I am going to play the Fair Grounds on my computer. With the advent of slots and with places like Gulfstream being part of retail developments, a lot has changed, but not for the better. I still enjoy it. I still enjoy going to Saratoga, Monmouth, the racetracks that have kept a lot of their character. I'm doing to it more casually now. It's hard to find the time to do the handicapping work and following all the trips and all the details of the past performances.

I use the Ragozin sheets, which are useful, but so many people use Ragozin and Thoro-Graph now that it's hard to find much of an advantage in that. When the Ragozin sheets first came out, I had friends who were early adopters of the sheets and they had an advantage. Now with everybody having the same data, it's much harder to have an edge. So these days, I do it much more as a recreation without much expectation of it being any kind of a business.

I should add that contributing to the excitement of those early days at Cahokia was that there was a fantastic race caller there who added a lot of excitement. His name is Dave Johnson. I feel like I've spent my whole life with Dave Johnson because when I moved east to New York I feel like Dave came with me. That's when he became the race caller at the NYRA tracks. I feel like my life at the races has been pretty much parallel to Dave. That's's been a fun part of it. We've had a lifelong friendship and he's been an investor in some of my shows. It's been a great friendship.

CRAIG BANDOROFF TO RECEIVE THE 2024 JOCKEYS AND JEANS UPHILL PUSH AWARD

Noted Kentucky horseman Craig Bandoroff will receive the Uphill Push Award and speak at the 10th annual fundraiser for the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund (PDJF) to be held at Gulfstream Park Jan. 11, according to a press release from the Jockeys and Jeans organization.

Each year the award is given to the person who provides the

most meaningful help to the 60 jockeys who suffered career-ending injuries.

In December of 1974, Bandoroff was the leading apprentice jockey at Monmouth Park and Garden State Park. In a race his mount bolted towards the inside rail shortly after the start and his right arm was paralyzed. Despite adversity, Bandoroff's passion for Thoroughbreds and racing remained intact.

A graduate of the University of Virginia and University of Kentucky, Bandoroff and his wife Holly founded Denali Stud in 1990 on leased land and with a handful of mares. Today, the property includes 800 acres as Denali is one of the nation's leading consigners. In 2023, Bandoroff turned over the day-to-day operations to his son, Conrad.

"As a young man, all I wanted to be was a jockey," he said. "But as the saying goes, 'God had a different plan.' Any success I have had is a result of many people believing in me. My ability to overcome my accident is because my parents were on my side during a very difficult time. I share this award with Holly and with them."

Bandoroff has been a consistent donor to PDJF, and has helped Jockeys and Jeans raise funds for disabled riders.

"It's obvious Bandoroff shares their same overcoming spirits," said Dr. Eddie Donnally, interim Jockeys and Jeans president. "His story has been an inspiration to many, and I know it will touch the hearts and souls of all who attend, especially our sports fallen riders. All of us at Jockeys and Jeans are pleased to provide him with a platform to share his life's adventure. He looked adversity in the eye and conquered it; something those former jockeys in wheelchairs do every day of their lives."

"I guess we don't stop to think that what we did inspires other people," said Bandoroff. "It's gratifying to know that perhaps I have. I am honored and gratified to receive this award."



The gone-too-soon Arrogate had a total of 325 foals of racing age, and in the current year his runners have made 800 starts and delivered 146 wins (18%). As a sire, the champion only had the chance to claim three crops and the last of them are now finishing up their 3-year-old season.

DEAUVILLE, France--Six months after doing the Hokey Cokey at the Goffs London Sale, Prix de Diane winner Sparkling Plenty (Fr) (Kingman {GB}) found another new owner when Coolmore and Michel Zerolo of Oceanic Bloodstock went to €5 million to secure the top-notcher on behalf of "a new partnership" on the opening day of the December Breeding Stock Sale at Arqana.

Few will forget the drama that unfolded with Sparkling Plenty earlier this summer. Scarcely has there ever been a greater form update, with the Patrice Cottier-trained filly winning the Diane on the eve of the Goffs London Sale.

GUN RUNNER'S LOCKED LANDS THE GII CIGAR MILE AT AQUEDUCT

Making only his second start of the year, Gun Runner's **Locked** claimed the GII Cigar Mile Handicap at Aqueduct on Saturday for Eclipse Thoroughbreds and Walmac Farm.

After she was was vendored at £8.1 million, Al Shaqab Racing hammered out a deal with owner-breeder Jean-Pierre-Joseph Dubois at £5,000,000, with Sparkling Plenty carrying those famous silks to finish third in the Nassau Stakes before ending her season by filling the same placing in the Prix de l'Opera.

Her racing days are far from over, according to MV Magnier, who explained that a visit to Justify is on the cards but that connections would be targeting races at Keeneland in the early parts of next season as well.

He explained, "She's a very nice mare and a very good race filly. The plan is to send her to America and she might compete in some of those races in Keeneland next year. In the meantime, we're going to cover her with Justify. She's been bought for a new partnership. She's a nice filly and Justify deserves to get a mare like her. He's one of the best stallions in the world now so hopefully we can look forward to racing the progeny out of her."

Despite a significant number of scratches, turnover climbed by 9% to \le 41,999,000 while the average was up by 16% to \le 264,145 and the median by \le 35,000 to \le 155,000. Cont. p3



"I'm Just Getting Started" - Stewart Strikes Back

million through Goliath's trainer Francis Graffard [Stamford Bloodstock] and bloodstock agent Ghislain Bozo [Meridian Bloodstock].

It didn't take long for the champagne to be corked after Stewart made his mark on his first visit to the French sale ground with the addition of the highest-rated filly in the entire sale to add to his \$8 million haul at Tattersalls earlier in the week.

He said, "She was number one on my list so she was going home with me, just like Vertical Blue [at Tattersalls]. I'm looking for horses to take to America that will dominate on the turf. I came over here specifically because I've won races all around the world but I haven't won any at Keeneland yet and it's my home track. I'm going to dominate there next year so I came up with this strategy to come over here.

"All of these horses that I'm buying, I'm looking at their pedigrees to bring diversity back to the herd in Kentucky. We just exported, exported, exported for so long and there's really not a lot of people buying horses from Europe and bringing them back to America in large quantities. I think that's very important for all of us because Kentucky is very important to the global industry from a breeding standpoint and so I'm trying to focus on their pedigrees, only looking at horses that I think can win Graded races in America. That's what I'm here to do." Cont. p4



He added, "I think that's a very reasonable price. The thing about this industry is there's a handful of buyers that are buying

these top-of-the market horses so that market has never been stronger. I'm an investor, that's what I do for a living. I own a private equity firm. When you're getting into something, it costs more money but it's less risky to buy higher quality assets. That's what I think of these horses as. And I'm indifferent to price on an individual horse because I buy so many horses. I look at this as a portfolio. Like stocks. I may buy one horse and I may end up paying 500,000 more than I wanted, but then I may buy one



There are plenty of words one could use to describe Stewart, who has blown into the racing game this past year similarly to

the hurricane-like weather that took over the sale ground on Saturday evening. Punchy might well be one of those words.

"I'm just getting started," he said. "I have a really big plan.

Anybody that thinks that I did a lot in 2024 has no idea what I'm

doing in 2025. I'm just trying to bring attention to horse racing globally. I make a lot of statements about what I'm going to do and things like that. It's not being arrogant, I'm just trying to get people to take notice that there's people investing in the industry when a lot of other people are saying that the industry is dying and all those different things and I just don't believe that."


In the past week alone, leading American-based owners Mike Repole and LNJ Foxwoods

expressed their dissatisfaction with Stewart's all-in approach to bloodstock separately. The 55-year-old revealed that those interactions actually spurred him on to spend more this week.

He explained, "When I started my private equity firm, I didn't [and still doesn't] have a finance degree. So everybody told me

that nobody is ever going to invest in you because you don't have a finance degree. I went and had 350 meetings to get 22 people to say yes so I thrive on people telling me no. What has happened in the last 24 hours [with the spat on X], I actually doubled my intentions of what I was going to do.

"Because the way I'm going to do it, I'm going to let my horses speak on the track and I'm going to let them win the races. I got

called out by somebody [Repole] last year. He said I didn't know what I was doing--come on, I'll give you a tour of the winner's circle when I come to the track. He didn't know it but I'd bought Pounce at the Fasig-Tipton Digital Sale. Just 10 days later my horse beat his horse in a Group 3. Then I beat his horse in the New York Stakes in a Grade I. Every time my horses have run

against his horses, I've won."



He added, "I'm not trying to bid him up, but at Saratoga I purposely positioned myself right behind him so I could keep an eye on exactly what he was doing. He was the one making

> statements about bidding me up and you really can't bid me up."

Stewart also spent a combined €1,050,000 through his own Resolute Racing on Flamme Rouge (Fr) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) and Tazara (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}). His 6,265,000gns spend at Tattersalls was headed by 3.2 million gns buy Vertical Blue (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}), with the Group 1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner understood to be staying in training with Graffard.

On plans for his recent additions, he concluded, "I use a variety of trainers. My team will sit down and digest these and then we'll have to take a look at them and see which ones suit them. Village Voice is going to Chad Brown and then Vertical Blue is staying here. Chad Brown wanted that horse bad." Cont. p6

When I'm not there, I'll have someone else looking at the horses and telling me what they think. We're giving them a list and then we have of course the vets and that kind of stuff that help us.


- While Haras de Beaumont failed to secure a sale for dual Group 1-placed Daylight (Fr) (Earthlight {Ire}), who was bought back at €2.1 million, the operation sold Group 2 winner Classic Flower (GB) (Calyx {GB}) to Alex Elliott on behalf of the Coolmore partners for €1.8 million. Elliott said, "She's going to the partnership of Peter Brant and Michael Tabor and she's going to be trained by Chad Brown. Her vetting was great and her running style will suit the States. She was very obvious and hopefully she'll go win a Group 1. She's got all the ability in the world and she's going to one of the best turf trainers in America so she's got all the ingredients."
- German Oaks runner-up Spanish Eyes (Ger) (Zarak {Fr}) was another mare to clear seven figures on Saturday. She was purchased by David Redvers for €1.3 million on behalf of

Qatar Racing from Monceaux. Redvers said, "She's off to the US for Qatar Racing and a partner but no decision has been made about a trainer just yet. It will be one of the Qatar Racing roster over there. She's an extremely impressive physical and racehorse and she looks like she will really suit the American style of racing. Sheikh Fahad was very keen on her."

- Strawberry Lace (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}), the dam of last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Unquestionable (Fr) (Wootton Bassett {GB}), was one of the early show-stoppers at €900,000. Bought by Yulong under the banner of Willingham, she was sold by Guillaume Vitse of Normandie Breeding. All told, Willingham spent €1,870,000 on Saturday.
- Teruya Yoshida was a notable attendee at Tattersalls, where he spent 1,210,000 gns on four mares, and the Shadai Farm boss added two more to the team at Arqana for a combined €590,000.
- Moa Sundstrom's debut draft of foals couldn't have gone any more smoothly. Under the banner of her own Prime Progeny, the daughter of Coulonces boss Anna sold a Too Darn Hot (GB) filly for €220,000 to Haras de Meautry and a Sea The Moon (Ger) filly for €90,000. Cont. p7

Deserved Slice Of Luck For Gestut Etzean

Sometimes you just need a bit of luck. Just ask Ralf Kredel of Gestut Etzean. Before Tamfana (Ger) (Soldier Hollow {Ger}) burst onto the scene, Kredel gave serious consideration to offloading her dam Tres Magnifique (Fr) and few would have argued against the decision given the pedigree had gone cold.

But something told Kredel to sit tight. Tamfana, who the German outfit sold for just €30,000, stormed to Group 1 glory this year in the Sun Chariot Stakes. Shortly afterwards, the Kevin Coleman-trained juvenile The Palace Girl (Ger) (Areion {Ger}) lit up the Sceptre Sessions of the December Mares Sale at Tattersalls when selling for 1.55 million gns.

Tres Magnifique has made a lot of people very happy in recent times. From Tamfana's ownership group, Quantum Leap Racing, to The Palace Girl's young trainer and his burgeoning syndicate Atomic Racing.

But few would argue that Kredel was deserving of his twist out of the family and it came deep into the sale on Saturday when MV Magnier went to 1.4 million to secure broodmare Tres Magnifique carrying a full-sibling to Tamfana.

Kredel said, "I am delighted about the sale, obviously. We don't have mares like this come around very often and we couldn't take the risk of keeping such a valuable mare. We have to keep the stud farm going so that's the reason why we sold her. I am very happy with the sale. I am also very happy that she has gone to a very good home. Hopefully she will get many more Group 1 horses.

"From time to time, you need a mare or a horse like this. We are breeding a lot of horses and, sometimes, a star like Tamfana comes along. It updates the pedigree. We have done well from the family and still have some mares from it at home--not from under the first dam but the second and third dam."

He added, "We were very close to getting rid of this mare to be honest. Before Tamfana came along, nobody wanted her yearlings and they were very cheap. I remember Jeremy Brummit coming back to me after he bought Tamfana. He asked me, 'did I make a mistake because she was so cheap?' I said, 'no, nowadays people don't look at these horses if the pedigree is not very strong'. She was a beautiful model."

Coolmore underbid The Palace Girl--who sold to Woodford Thoroughbreds--at Tattersalls and revealed that her dam would visit City Of Troy next year.

He said, "She's a very good producer and we underbid the filly in Newmarket earlier this week and she was a lovely filly as well. What we plan to do now is send her to City Of Troy. We know she's a very good producer and City Of Troy is an exceptional horse; he's very well-bred and he did everything that we asked him to do.

"If he'd won the Guineas I'd say he'd have been hailed as a horse as good as Frankel. Unfortunately he didn't but he's still an exceptional racehorse. He's going down really well, himself and Auguste Rodin are absolutely flying. The sale has been unbelievable. Well done to Arqana for getting everybody here and attracting a very good bunch of mares."

Buy of the Day

A couple stood out early doors. Given the year that Camelot (GB) has enjoyed, the €200,000 that Atlas Bloodstock parted with to land a quality filly [lot 18] by the stallion could prove to be shrewd when she is re-offered at one of the premier yearling sales next year. Meanwhile, the Irish National Stud could be rewarded for striking early as well, with the 88-rated Blue Point (Ire) filly Word's Out (Ire) [lot 5] looking a pretty safe bet at €45,000 through BBA Ireland.
