RAGING TORRENT OUTLASTS STRONGHOLD IN MALIBU

Returning Kentucky Derby Winner Mystik Dan Never A Factor



Raging Torrent is the first Grade I winner for Maximus Mischief | Benoit

Firming into 13-5 favoritism in the final few clicks of the tote, Raging Torrent (Maximus Mischief) found his best stride well off the inside entering the final eighth of a mile and staved off a late challenge from 2024 GI Santa Anita Derby winner Stronghold (Ghostzapper) to win Thursday's GI Malibu Stakes, the traditional opening-day feature at the Great Race Place.

Drawn widest in a field reduced to six with the early scratchings of **Senior Officer** (Into Mischief) and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint runner-up **Bentornato** (Valiant Minister) due to a sore foot, Raging Torrent was a half-step slowly into stride, but recovered nicely and ultimately settled in second as **Pilot Commander** (Justify) shot through at the inside to take up the running not long after the start. The latter took the field into the turn having gone the opening half-mile in a snappy :44.29, and Frankie Dettori was scrubbing on Raging Torrent to keep pace.

Pilot Commander was first to face the judge, but Dettori and Raging Torrent came to tackle with a furlong and a half to travel and was kept to his task to the wire. Stronghold was beaten a tight length into second, while **Imagination** (Into Mischief) lasted inside for third.

SHE FEELS PRETTY A TOWERING WINNER OF THE AMERICAN OAKS by Alan Carasso

A victory in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup can lead even the most disciplined connections to call an audible, deviating from a more conservative approach in favor of a start in a race as alluring as the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf just weeks later.

But trainer Cherie DeVaux and the Lael Stables of Roy and Gretchen stuck to their guns and sent the enormously talented **She Feels Pretty** (Karakontie {Jpn}) to California for the American Oaks, another chance at age-restricted Grade I glory while putting loftier objectives on the back-burner, until this time next year, for example. The \$240,000 Keeneland September yearling ensured that the team would be sufficiently pleased with the course they elected to chart, as she stormed down the Santa Anita stretch to stamp her authority on the race while touting herself as one to tab closely in the distaff turf division in 2025.

Off as the 3-5 jolly, the \$240,000 Keeneland September yearling broke cleanly, but she clearly attempted to hurdle the lip of the dirt crossing and tugged fiercely against John Velazquez from an early midfield berth to be fourth in the slipstream of 58-1 Valence (Violence) as they reached the first turn. Thursday dawned disappointing for Spendthrift Farm when trainer Richard Mandella notified them that 'TDN Rising Star' Tamara (Bolt d'Oro) was scratching from the GI La Brea Stakes. Kopion (Omaha Beach) eased that disappointment with a 37-1 upset Thursday afternoon.

"We knew this is a perfect distance, so we were so optimistic," said trainer Doug O'Neill, winning the Malibu for the first time in his career. "But in this sport, a lot of times you're optimistic and you go home with a flat balloon...but he ran a race that we had dreamed of and just so happy and proud.

"We really thought going into it, we were the best horse, the best distance. And just watching him day in, day out, he was training out of this world. So, yeah, he ran great."

The disappointment of the race was the comebacking **Mystik Dan** (Goldencents), who was unsurprisingly outrun through the fast early sectionals, but never picked up the bit in the lane and finished well back as the 3-1 third choice.

"He broke good, but it just seemed like we were always chasing," jockey Brian Hernandez, Jr. said of Mystik Dan. "I think shortening up took away from him. After running a mile and a quarter, it is tough to go back to seven-eighths. The horse is fine."

Third in the GIII Best Pal Stakes at two, Raging Torrent blew the doors off a field of entry-level allowance foes one race after Mystik Dan won the Derby at Churchill May 4 and followed up with a victory in the June 30 Maxfield Stakes over that same track and distance. The bay lowered the colors of Cal-bred champion The Chosen Vron (Vronsky) in the seven-furlong GII Pat O'Brien Stakes at Del Mar Aug. 24, but he never truly factored from inside stall in the Sprint, retreating to finish seventh. **Cont. p4**

Pedigree Notes:

Previously the lone graded winner and now the first top-level winner for his Spendthrift-based son of Into Mischief, Raging Torrent is the lone starter from his dam, a half-sister to GSW The Nth Degree (Distorted Humor), who was offered with the colt in utero at the 2021 Keeneland January Sale, but was led out unsold on a bid of \$27,000. Raging Torrent was himself bought back for the same price by breeders Rodney Winkler and Alfoso Mazzetti at Keeneland September in 2022, and it was Mark Davis's name on the ticket when the colt fetched \$75,000 at the 2023 OBS April Sale.

The first daughter of Violence to produce a Grade I winner, Violent Wave is also the dam of the 2-year-old colt Contra Mundum (Honor A.P.), a \$55,000 RNA at KEESEP in 2023, and the mare was not mated when failing to find a new home at \$145,000 at Keeneland November last fall. Subsequent to Raging Torrent's victory in the Pat O'Brien, Violent Wave was entered for this year's KEENOV, but was bought back on a bid of \$575,000 in foal to Up to the Mark.



Velazquez edged out one path to his right and raced three deep and punching the breeze with fully six furlongs to travel, and the rider had two fists full of rein as he did his level best to get the strapping filly to settle down the back.

Left in a bit of a tricky spot when Frankie Dettori went for an early move astride **Kathynmarissa** (American Pharoah) with less than a half-mile to race, She Feels Pretty was deftly steered off that one's heels and four wide into the clear midway on the second bend. When Velazquez finally acquiesced and finally allowed She Feels Pretty to have her head nearing the quarter pole, the response was both immediate and devastating, as she sprinted her final two furlongs in a very slick :22.63 to win by a comfortable margin.

Medoro (Honor Code) finished a distant third to round out a trifecta that returned less than 13-1.

"She got a little keen, broke a little slow and then when she passed the dirt she took like a weird step and then she got up and started running up," Velazquez said. "I wanted to keep her covered up, she is much better covered up, but today she was really keen. I put her right behind the horse in front of me and I held her the best I could." **Cont. p6**

The result was considerably more satisfying for team She Feels Pretty than her last trip to the Great Race Place, when the GI Natalma Stakes heroine just failed to overcome a horror draw when third, beaten a half-length, in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf nearly 14 months ago.

Highly impressive in annexing the May 17 Hilltop Stakes on seasonal return, she was narrowly defeated by the classy Cinderella's Dream (GB) (Shamardal) in the July 6 GI Belmont Oaks--a race that now roughly occupies the spot on the racing calendar once held by the original iteration of the American Oaks--and was beaten a frustrating neck in the GII Lake Placid Stakes at Saratoga Aug. 17. Whatever lingering disappointment there may have been was well and truly washed away when She Feels Pretty bolted up by a half-dozen lengths in Lexington 75 days ago and from here, the sky appears to be the limit.



The winner's dam, a \$550,000 purchase by Payson Stud as an early 2-year-old at Keeneland January in 2016, is a daughter of French listed winner Summer Solstice, the dam of SW Summer Breezing (Langfuhr), SW & GSP Adirondack Summer (Thunder Gulch) and Belmont Oaks third Summer Solo (Arch), herself responsible for GSW Solo Album (Curlin) and SW & GSP Maedean (Tapit).

Summer Sweet is also the dam of the 2-year-old colt Summer Vibes (Good Magic), who fetched \$600,000 from Boardshorts Stables at the 2023 KEESEP sale two days before She Feels Pretty took the Natalma and is currently in training at Palm Meadows. The current yearling out of Summer Sweet, a filly named She Feels Stunning (American Pharoah), was hammered down to Lael for \$650,000 at Keeneland this past September, and She Feels Pretty's year-older half-sister Lakeside Music (Super Saver) was acquired by Whisper Hill Farm for \$400,000 in foal to Munnings at KEENOV last month. Summer Sweet claims a weanling filly by Olympiad and was most recently covered by Justify.



KOPION DOMINATES IN LA BREA


Spendthrift Farm, forced to scratch Grade I winner Tamara (Bolt d'Oro) with an elevated temperature Thursday morning, had a more than suitable understudy in the afternoon's GI La Brea Stakes when Kopion (Omaha Beach) romped home a geared-down 2 3/4-length winner at Santa Anita. Returning from nine months on the sidelines and dismissed at 35-1, the chestnut filly chased pacesetting **Sandy Bottom** (Omaha Beach) through an opening quarter in :22.17. Kopion easily moved up to engage the pacesetter as the half went up in :44.32 and she grabbed command out of the turn, quickly opening up a two-length advantage. She skipped further clear in upper stretch and sailed under the wire unchallenged.

Fellow longshot Splendora (Audible), at 26-1, was second and Sugar Fish (Accelerate) closed strongly along the rail for third. The time for the seven furlongs was 1:22.08.

"We are high as a kite right now," said Spendthrift's Eric Gustavson. "We had a bunch of friends and family come in for the race. It was such a crazy day because we had Tamara and she scratched. We got the text from Richard this morning, so we were all down. Now this. This is racing. It is great. This is such a



big deal. A Grade I winner on the dirt for Omaha Beach. All glory to God, we are over the moon."

Kopion, a first-out winner at Del Mar last November, went wire-to-wire to earn a 5 3/4-length victory in the Jan. 7 GIII Santa Ynez Stakes. She suffered her first loss when second stretched to one mile in the Feb. 10 GIII Las Virgenes Stakes and had not been out since tiring to a well-beaten fourth in the Apr. 6 GII Santa Anita Oaks.

"I thought about putting her in the Las Flores, but there is only one Grade I," said winning trainer Richard Mandella. "She has been getting better and better. I told [jockey] Kaz [Kimura] that she is quick and you don't need to rush her."

One Magic Philly (Good Magic), the 7-5 favorite who was exiting the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint, tracked the pacesetter in third through the opening half mile before fading to sixth in an eight-horse field.

"We broke good and I had a nice spot," jockey Flavien Prat said. "When it was time to get going, I asked her and there was no reaction."

Pedigree Notes:

One of four graded winners for Spendthrift's Omaha Beach, Kopion is the stallion's second winner at the top level. She follows GI Natalma Stakes winner And One More Time.

Out of 2016 Outstanding Broodmare in Canada Galloping Ami, Kopion is a half-sister to that year's Canadian champion 3-year-old Amis Gizmo (Giant Gizmo). The mare has a yearling filly by Essential Quality who RNA'd for \$275,000 at this year's Keeneland September sale. With no reported foal this year, she was bred back to Curlin.

JOHANNES TOO CLASSY IN THE SAN

Trying nine furlongs for just the second time in his career and looking to protect a perfect mark over the Santa Anita turf course, Cuyathy LLC's Johannes was given a supremely confident steer by Umberto Rispoli and was really only asked to finish up to post a soft victory in Thursday's GII San Gabriel Stakes.

Crunched into long odds-on favoritism to improve on his hardnosed runner-up effort behind More Than Looks (More Than
Ready) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile down at Del Mar on Nov. 2,
the homebred raced in close attendance to whatever pace was
on as Cabo Spirit (Pioneerof the Nile) ambled them along
through the early exchanges beneath Frankie Dettori. Johannes
enjoyed the run of the race from just in behind, but was
hemmed in along the rail for the trip around the second turn
and was held together by a very patient Rispoli nearing the
stretch.

Eased out into the four-wide line, Johannes came with his typically strong finish to easily account for last-out GII Seabiscuit Handicap hero Mi Hermano Ramon, fortifying his bid for an Eclipse Award next month. Seal Team, three wide the majority of the trip, held for third.

Johannes is likely to make his next appearance in the GI Pegasus World Cup Turf at Gulfstream Park on Jan. 25.

"We originally thought about giving the horse a breather," said winning trainer Tim Yakteen. "He had such a strong campaign and he came out of the Breeders' Cup so well. Everything was near perfect in his last outing, so we came to the San Gabriel and now we will head to the Pegasus. In my heart, he is a true champion. I hope others view it that way."

Added Rispoli, "You know, with a horse like him, it's not possible to panic. You press the button and in three strides, you're right up there. You just have to manage how to get the

wire because once you get the lead, you try to wait for other horses. But, you know, you never panic with him. Once you see the daylight, he goes. It doesn't matter."

Winner of three of his first four starts on the grass, Johannes returned from an 11-month absence to take out this track's GIII American Stakes going a mile Apr. 4 before breaking through for a maiden Grade I in the May 27 Shoemaker Mile Stakes. The dark bay tried this distance for the first time in the GII Eddie Read Stakes July 28, easily defeating Dicey Mo Chara (GB) (Adaay {Ire}), and was a comfortable winner of the local GII City of Hope Mile Stakes Sept. 28. The 22-5 second choice in the Mile, he came with a run from midpack to loom a threat in the final furlong, only to be outfinished by a flying More Than Looks.

Pedigree Notes:

In the name of their Cuyathy, Joe and Debby McCloskey purchased Johannes's dam for \$50,000 at the 2014 Keeneland November Sale and raced her to three wins from 20 tries and a third placing in the Kalookan Queen Stakes in 2018. Johannes is the first foal from the mare, who is also responsible for Sea Dancer, recent winner of the Carousel Stakes at Laurel Park, and the juvenile filly Sea Runner (Gun Runner), third in the Del Mar Juvenile Fillies Turf at Del Mar Sept. 7 and fourth in the GIII Jimmy Durante Stakes at Del Mar at the end of November. A half-sister to the multiple graded-placed Join in the Dance (Sky Mesa), Cuyathy is the dam of a yearling filly by Knicks Go named Soaring Angel, missed to Mandaloun for 2024 and is due to Maxfield for her 2025 foal.

KING OF GOSFORD GIVES FLAVIEN PRAT GRADED STAKES RECORD WITH MATHIS MILE WIN

Tied no more. After weeks of sharing the top of the leaderboard, Flavien Prat surpassed Jerry Bailey Thursday to become the new record holder for most graded stakes wins in a single season. His landmark 56th came in the GII Mathis Mile Stakes aboard **King of Gosford (GB)** (Zoustar {Aus}), a 3-year-old imported from Ireland late last year to the barn of Phillip D'Amato.

Cutting back to the flat mile Thursday, King of Gosford never made Prat worry, assuming the lead right from the jump when sent from the rail draw to handle the tempo ahead of **Atitlan** (The Factor) who sat just off in second. Never headed through fractions of :23.24 and :48.04, the favorite turned Atitlan back and kept finding to keep a slim but clear advantage to the wire with familiar rival **Stay Hot** (Summer Front) relegated to second.

"I think there couldn't be a better place to win it than here at Santa Anita," said Prat of his record. "It is definitely worth all the work when something like this happens."

D'Amato added: "He just took advantage of a nice, comfortable pace scenario. Flavien did a great job of nursing him along easily up front, and when it was time to kick on at the top of the lane, showed a big turn of foot. I'm going to give him a 30-day break and then we'll, have him ready to go probably April or so, and hopefully campaign towards maybe a Breeders' Cup Mile."

A 41st graded stakes winner for Australian sire Zoustar, King of Gosford is out of stakes winner Miss Sugars who went through the ring last year at the Tattersalls December Mare Sale for 20,000gns. From her four foals, three have raced and two have won including King of Gosford's year older half-sister, Juju (GB) (Kitten's Joy). This is the family of American GISW's Wigmore Hall (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) and Ocean Road (Ire) (Australia {GB}) who sold for \$1.625m at FTKNOV in 2022. Miss Sugars last produced a Kameko filly last year who sold for 32,000gns at Tattersalls December Foal Sale.

J B STRIKES BACK UPSETS INAUGURAL LAFFIT PINCAY, JR. STAKES

Longshot J B Strikes Back (Goldencents) upset the inaugural running of the GII Laffit Pincay, Jr. Stakes (previously run as the San Antonio Stakes) Thursday in his first try facing stakes company for trainer Doug O'Neill.

The 3-year-old gelding, understandably one of the least experienced runners in the field and the second longest wagering price, broke his maiden in his third start in a \$20,000 claimer at Del Mar and was claimed out of that start from these same connections who promptly bought him right back in a \$25,000 conditioned claimer when he was sixth in his very next start. Off the board in his next two tries over both dirt and turf, J B Strikes Back jumped up to put up a big number in an optional claimer going one mile at Del Mar Nov. 3 and responded with yet another win facing similar company at the same distance Nov. 23. **Cont. p13**

Guided from an inside draw with Antonio Fresu taking over from Juan Hernandez, J B Strikes Back was briefly outrun as the field passed the wire for the first time but quickly got himself into stride to contend for the lead outside of **Ashcroft** (Munnings) around the first turn and into the backstretch. Still two wide and joined by **Tarantino** (Pioneerof the Nile) to his outside nearing the half-mile pole, J B Strikes Back took advantage of Ashcroft fading along the rail to shoot ahead and turned for home with both Tarantino and **Express Train** (Union Rags) looming. But with a safe margin built up, the 16-1 chance turned the tables on the older horses and came home clear with only 20-1 shot **American Admiral** (American Pharoah) making up ground on him late and just missing for the placing.

"It's such an honor to win this race," said O'Neill. "My mom Dixie was really good friends with Laffit Pincay Jr.'s mom and we are really good friends with his brother Alonso, so the Pincay family really means a lot to us. He still looks like he can still ride today, it's amazing and a huge honor. Janie Buss and the whole Buss family they are so generous. She donates all of the earnings of any of her beautiful horses that make any money to different causes. This is really to her because she wanted to take a chance after his last couple of efforts. We took a chance, and it worked out perfect."

Fresu added: "My trip was great, amazing it was what we had planned. What about this training performance by Doug (O'Neill)? This horse he kept improving and now he is in graded stakes, that was amazing. I feel very excited to see where he goes next. Today, what I was thinking was if the track was fast, to get a nice trip out in front, or be pretty close. I thought the horse had a good chance. He proved to us his ability."

Pedigree Notes:

J B Strikes Back is now the second graded stakes winner under stakes-winning first dam Allanah, joining his talented older half-brother Reincarnate (Good Magic) who took the GIII Sham Stakes and also placed in the GI Arkansas Derby, the GI FanDuel Racing Pacific Classic Stakes and the GI Santa Anita Handicap. Allanah, who last went under the hammer for \$105,000 at Keeneland November in 2018, is a half to MGSP Over Emphasize (Overanalyze) and this is the family of two-time Peruvian champion grass horse Zeide Isaac (Freud). J B Strikes Back, the eighth graded stakes winner for Goldencents, has an unraced 2-year-old half-brother by Liam's Map and a weanling half-sister by Good Magic while Allanah went to Life Is Good for 2025.

OPENING-DAY ATTENDANCE, ALL-SOURCES HANDLE UP AT SANTA ANITA

An announced on-track crowd of 41,562 welcomed the return of live racing to Santa Anita Thursday afternoon, the largest non-weekend or holiday crowd on opening day since 1990 and biggest opening-day crowd in eight years, track officials said late Thursday. Total all-sources handle of more than \$21.4 million was the third-highest in track history for an opening-day program and marked a 17.4% increase over 2023. It was the fourth time in the last seven years that handle exceeded \$20 million.

"Our Racing Office offered an exceptional program, the owners and trainers supported it, and the horseplayers and fans strongly responded to kick off our 90th year," said Nate Newby, Santa Anita's SVP & General Manager. "We are thankful to everyone who worked hard to make it a success, especially those who joined us to not only witness terrific racing but enjoy

the events on track. The Southern California weather could not have been more cooperative, and this was a terrific way to start the celebration at The Great Race Place."

The afternoon featured not only three Grade I races for 3-year-olds and a record-breaking performance from jockey Flavien Prat, but also included the inaugural running of the GII Laffit Pincay, Jr. Stakes, with the hall of famer on hand to make the trophy presentation. Pincay, Jr. turns 78 this coming weekend.

STEWART: "DIDIA NOT RETIRED", BUT WILL MISS DEFENSE OF PEGASUS F/M TURF

Contrary to statements given to the Gulfstream Park press office by trainer Ignacio Correas IV, Merriebelle Stable and Resolute Racing's Grade I winner **Didia (Arg)** (Orpen--Delambre {Brz}, by Rainbow Corner) has not been retired from racing and is currently resting at Resolute Farm, part-owner John Stewart said on X late Thursday. Stewart did indicate that the mare would be forced to miss a defense of her title in the GIII Pegasus World Cup Filly & Mare Turf.

"It has been a rough couple of days for @resracingky," Stewart posted. "There was a press release issued today about DIDIA being retired.

"We have NOT retired DIDIA. DIDIA will not be competing in the Pegasus due to a procedure she had a couple of days ago. "She is currently resting on our farm."

A two-time Group 1 winner and champion 3-year-old filly in her native Argentina, Didia won the first four starts of her U.S. campaign, culminating with a win in the GIII Modesty Stakes at Churchill Downs in May 2023. She was runner-up in the GI New York Stakes that June before returning to the winner's circle in the GII Rodeo Drive Stakes in October. **Cont. p15**

Didia opened 2024 with a win in the Pegasus World Cup F/M Turf and added John Stewart's Resolute Racing to her ownership line after that effort. The 6-year-old mare returned to be third for the new partnership in the Apr. 12 GI Jenny Wiley Stakes and won the New York Stakes at Saratoga in June. She was mostly third in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf. On the board in 15 of 20 starts, Didia has won 11 times and amassed earnings of \$1,754,511.

Looking for his next star for Resolute Racing, Correas will saddle **Tutta La Vita** (The Autumn Sun {Aus}) in her North American debut in Saturday's opener at Gulfstream, an optional claiming allowance for filles and mares, three and up, scheduled for one mile on the turf.

"It's very exciting. She's training very well. It's her first time in America and we hope she runs a good race," Correas said. "She's done well since she's been here; if not, we would have waited longer. We're looking forward to her running."

Stewart purchased Tutta La Vita, a three-time Group 1-placed mare in Australia, for \$2,105,447 from the Inglis Chairman Sale in the spring.

WELL-RELATED GOLD ROUND EUTHANIZED AT OLD FRIENDS

Gold Round (Ire) (Caerleon--Born Gold, by Blushing Groom {Fr}), a French Group 3-winning half-sister to three-time GI Breeeders' Cup Mile heroine Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa), was euthanized in her paddock at Old Friends Retirement Facility in Georgetown, Kentucky, on Dec. 19. She was 27 years old and had resided at Old Friends since September 2020, when she was retired by LNJ Foxwoods' Larry, Nanci and Jaime Roth.

Bred by Wertheimer et Frere and trained for the brothers by Criquette Head, Gold Round won her maiden in her fourth career start and by the end of her freshman campaign in 1999, had taken out the Listed Prix des Sablonnets. She posted her career high at three the following season, winning the G3 Prix Cleopatre before retiring with three wins from 10 starts.

Gold Round produced a pair of black-type winners from her first 10 foals before selling to LNJ Foxwoods for €520,000 at the 2012 Arqana December Sale. The Dalakhani (Ire) filly she was carrying at the time of her purchase became LNJ Foxwoods' Group 3 winner Golden Valentine (Fr), who has since gone on to produce Ancient Wisdom (Fr) (Dubawi {Ire}), winner of the 2023 G1 Kameko Futurity Trophy for Godolphin and Charlie Appleby, who was bred in partnership with Ecurie des Monceaux. Gold Round is the dam of four further stakes horses, including GIII Robert J. Frankel Stakes winner and GI Rodeo Drive Stakes runner-up Luck (Kitten's Joy). She was retired from breeding duties in 2020.

The first two mares the Roths sent to Old Friends were Gold Round and Mystery Trip. Shortly after, Hi Dubai (GB) was sent to the farm as well..Gold Round was the last remaining retiree of the three original LNJ mares at Old Friends, as 22-year-old Mystery Trip was euthanized on May 1, 2023 due to chronic foot issues and 24-year old Hi Dubai died earlier this year on Aug. 24.

"I am saddened by the loss of Gold Round," said John Nicholson, President and CEO of Old Friends. "I enjoyed seeing this sweet mare in the LNJ Foxwoods paddock every day from my office window. In addition to being a remarkably successful broodmare, she and her paddock mates served as reminder of the Roth family's devotion to their horses and their partnership with Old Friends. We are consoled that leaving us at 27 years old, she enjoyed rich and happy retirement years with her LNJ Foxwood companions."



Power Squeeze rolled up three wide on the far turn and looked ready to take the lead into the stretch, but Windy Walk kicked away again. Power Squeeze was coming back at her late and Soul of Angel, who had tipped to the center of the track at the top of the lane, was closing rapidly, but the longshot held on gamely to the wire.

"It was just depending on the break," winning rider Tyler Gaffalione said of his pre-race plans. "[Dazzling Move] looked like she had a little bit of speed, but when she stumbled, I just gave my filly her head and we were able to get away with nice easy fractions. I was fairly confident around the turn. She was throwing her ears back and forth and felt like I had a little bit left. I was just hoping we could hold off the late rush, but she gave me everything she had. I'm just so proud of her."

Windy Wind had plied her trade mostly in the claiming ranks in her previous 13 lifetime starts. The chestnut filly broke her maiden versus \$20,000 maiden claimers at Keeneland in April and was a well beaten sixth in her only other stakes start to date in the July 12 Wilton Stakes at Saratoga. She came into the Rampart off three straight starter allowance wins: at Churchill Sept. 29, Keeneland Oct. 26 and Churchill Nov. 20. Making her first start since an off-the-board finish in Churchill's GII Locust Grove Stakes Sept. 14, Hoosier Philly returned to the races and to the winner's circle Thursday in the Joseph E. Spanky Broussand Memorial Stakes at the Fair Grounds. "We did have to stop on her because she had a throat issue that we took care of," said Amoss. "It had probably been lingering a long time but it didn't really show itself. Her training for this race had been brilliant. But she's always been a brilliant horse in the morning. This was a test for the horse to see what she can do. We're very excited about her and looking forward to a 2025 campaign."

Out of a \$750,000 yearling in Tapella, Hoosier Philly herself brought \$510,000 at Keeneland in 2021. The dam has a 2-year-old Justify colt named American Promise who placed for D. Wayne Lukas and a yearling Munnings filly. After taking a year off, Tapella went to Gun Runner for 2025. Click for the Equibase.com chart.
