



MUFASA UPSETS WHITE ABARRIO IN MR. PROSPECTOR

Billed as a showdown between the classy Mufasa (Chi) (Practical Joke) and the 2023 GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner White Abarrio (Race Day), Gulfstream Park's Saturday feature, the GIII Mr. Prospector Stakes at seven furlongs, didn't disappoint. Mufasa got a perfect stalking trip which turned into a resounding win, while White Abarrio was slow out of the gate and trailed early before making a late run that couldn't quite catch Mufasa in the stretch. Little Vic (Practical Joke), the 2023 GIII Tom Fool Handicap winner, was third.

Winner of the GIII Vosburgh Stakes over the same distance Sept 28, Carlos Saavedra and Stud Vendaval's Mufasa was exiting a flubbed effort in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile won by Full Serrano (Arg) (Full Mast). Rank early that day, he was never a factor after weakening late.

The Mr. Prospector marked his return to seven panels, a distance the dark bay has tried five times in his career and in which he's never been beaten. Prior to the Vosburgh, Mufasa had taken an optional allowance at Colonial Downs at the distance--setting a new track record of 1:19.86 while getting a 99 Beyer Speed Figure--and he has also won twice at seven furlongs in his native Chile.

Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Del Mar Nov. 1, were among several notables to record timed workouts Saturday morning at Santa Anita.


A contender for the Eclipse Award as the top 2-year-old colt, Citizen Bull drilled alongside stablemate Richi (Chi) (Practical Joke) going five furlongs in :59.40, which was the second fastest of 59 works at the distance. Gaming worked five furlongs in 1:02.60.

For Citizen Bull, this was his third work since besting his stablemate by 1 1/2 lengths in the Juvenile. Gaming followed his performance at the seaside oval with a third-place finish in the GII Los Alamitos Futurity Dec. 14. He returned to the tab with a five-furlong move in 1:02.60. Cont. p7

In the early stages of the Saturday opener at Gulfstream Park, when Roscoe Village (Kantharos) unseated jockey Jorge Ruiz, the siren was prompted which caused several riders to pull up their mounts and the race to be declared a no contest.

In addition to his pair of graded wins in the U.S. under the tutelage of Ignacio Correas IV, Mufasa also won a Group 3 in Chile for Ximeno Francisco Urenda Pastene while going 1 1/8 miles.

Mufasa broke cleanly in the Mr. Prospector while White Abarrio stuttered slightly, just enough to immediately find himself a half step behind. A joint last early, White Abarrio was forced to play catch up while Mufasa settled kindly into the second spot behind a pacesetting MGISW in **Super Chow** (Lord Nelson). The latter covered a first quarter in :22.77 and a half in :45.41 with Mufasa glued to his flank as White Abarrio, who captured a Nov. 22

Gulfstream by 10 1/4 lengths after unplaced efforts in the G1 Saudi Cup and GI Met Mile earlier this year, unfurled his stride on the turn, but Mufasa already had command at the top of the


lane and was kept on task and in the clear by Tyler Gaffalione. White Abarrio swung wide into the stretch and despite being willing, had too much to do and couldn't catch Mufasa after linking up with Little Vic for the final strides. Mufasa's margin of

victory was 1 1/4 lengths, with White Abarrio a neck in front of Little Vic.

Pleased with Mufasa's win,
Correas was eager to cross a line
through the Dirt Mile. "I saw the
horse [Saturday] that I saw in
the Vosburgh and I saw in the
race at Colonial Downs," he said.
"I thought that was probably my
mistake [in the Breeders' Cup]
thinking it was better to go two
turns than stay sprinting. We
talked with the owners and that
was the decision we made,
probably not the right one.
We're going to try to keep him

sprinting and see where he takes us."

"He's a tremendously talented colt," said Gaffalione of Mufasa. *Cont.*

"He put me in the game, put me where I needed to be, traveled great throughout, gave me a ton of confidence coming into the stretch, and finished the job well."

White Abarrio's connections weren't unhappy with his effort. "You always want to win," said trainer Saffie Joseph, Jr. "Did we think we were going to win before the race? Yes. But considering the circumstances, he ran hard. I looked back at a certain point and I was, like, 'Whoa.' I couldn't believe how far back he was. He's never been that far back in his life. As much dirt as he took, I was happy to see him run through that. He looked like he was finishing as good as you can finish."

Pedigree Notes:

Coolmore America's Practical Joke is the sire of 29 graded winners from his 43 black-type winners. In addition to his North American success, where his winners this year at the highest level include H. Allen Jerkens Memorial Stakes victor Domestic Product and Test Stakes victress Ways and Means, he's had a number of Group 1 winners in Chile, including champions El Oriente (Chi), Soqui (Chi), and Richi (Chi). The latter has been imported to the U.S. and served as the workmate to Gl Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Citizen Bull (Into Mischief) Saturday. Those three champions, like Mufasa and four other graded Practical Joke winners, are all out of daughters of Coolmore's late Scat Daddy. Practical Joke was also represented by a new 'TDN Rising Star' Saturday at Aqueduct in Captain Cook.

Miscanti's five reported foals have all been by Coolmore sires, with her most recent being a yearling colt by Tiz the Law named Millelche (Chi). In addition to Mufasa, she has also produced a black-type performer in Mistela (Chi) (Classic Empire). The mare is a great-granddaughter of Mi Quimera (Arg), Argentina's champion 2-year-old filly of 1980. Despite Mufasa's second dam being foaled in Florida, the female family has been in South America since being imported from England in the late 1800s.

Fresh off a second-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, Anthony Fanticola's Motorious (GB) (Muhaarar {GB}) got the job done in Saturday's GII Joe Hernandez Stakes down the hill at Santa Anita. After bobbling slightly out of the gate, Motorious settled kindly midpack behind a :21.71 and :43.78 pace set by 60-1 Code Duello (Honor Code). Extremely wide after crossing the dirt, he stayed on his wrong lead for several beats before hooking up with two-back Lure Stakes winner Sumter (War Front) in the lane. Sumter was slightly quicker as the two mowed down the leader and pulled clear of the rest in a battle to the wire. Finally on even terms just a few jumps before the finish, the two surged to the line with Motorious prevailing by a head. The hard-trying Irideo (Arg) (Easing Along), a Group 1 winner in Argentina and Grade I-placed in North America, got up for third.

"[Motorious has] proved to be a very good horse sprinting and going down the hill," said winning rider Antonio Fresu. "Today I tried to give him a really good warm up. He was kind of slow in the beginning and it was kind of hard to get into his rhythm. When I let him loose down the lane he just kept grinding and I thought he finished best."

A winner in England, where he started his career under conditioner Stuart Williams, Motorious has been in the U.S. with

Phil D'Amato since late 2021 after Craig Rounesfell's Boomer Bloodstock picked him up for 220,000gns at the Tattersalls Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale. He's improved every year, taking the GIII San Simeon Stakes and GIII Green Flash Handicap in 2023 before repeating in the Green Flash this summer, getting that second in the Breeders' Cup, and now adding the Joe Hernandez. Saturday's win and the San Simeon were at 6 1/2 furlongs, while the others were at five panels. *Cont.*

"You have to be a really good horse to adapt to the different distances," said D'Amato. "He has a great turn of foot and I think that older disposition that he's had now has helped him in these victories."

D'Amato said Motorious will be freshened before kicking off a 7-year-old campaign in the spring.

Pedigree Notes:

Muhaarar, who stands at France's Haras du Petit Tellier, is the sire of 30 black-type winners and 15 graded winners. The son of Oasis Dream (GB), a triple Group 1 winner during his own career, has also been represented by another 2024 multiple graded U.S. winner in Be Your Best (Ire).

Motorious has a 2-year-old unraced half-brother by Sergei Prokofiev who sold in Book 1 of the Tattersalls October sale in 2023, hammering for 220,000gns to SackvilleDonald. His yearling half-sister by Ardad (Ire) sold in Book 2 at Tattersalls October this year, bringing 420,000gns from Amo Racing. Dam Squash, herself multiple group placed, hails from the same extended family of GISW and Claiborne sire Lea.

Also working for the Hall of Fame trainer was **Pleasant** (Munnings), who finished third in the GI PNC Bank Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint when making her second start off a 13-month layoff. The 4-year-old filly, who is nominated to run in Saturday's GIII Las Flores Stakes going six furlongs at Santa Anita, worked five furlongs from the gate in 1:00.00.

Eagles Flight (Curlin), the half-brother to Horse of the Year Flightline, fired a bullet for trainer John Sadler. The colt blitzed five furlongs in :59, which was the fastest of 59 moves at the

distance. In his debut May 27 at Santa Anita, Eagles Flight rolled to a an impressive 2 3/4-length victory going six furlongs and had a 'TDN Rising Star' pinned to his saddle.

GIII Bob Hope winner Bullard (Gun Runner), a perfect two-for-two for trainer Michael McCarthy, worked five furlongs in 1:00.80. The 'TDN Rising Star' is nominated to run in next Saturday's GII San Vicente Stakes going seven furlongs at Santa Anita.

Also working for McCarthy was GI Hollywood Derby winner Formidable Man (City of Light). The 3-year-old colt worked four furlongs on the main track in :47.60, which was the second fastest of 53 moves at the distance.

Trainer Tim Yakteen worked both McKinzie Street (McKinzie) and Practical Dream (Practical Joke). McKinzie Street, who has hit the board in a trio of graded stakes including both the GI Del Mar Futurity and GI American Pharoah Stakes, drilled four furlongs in :51.40. The 2-year-old colt most recently was third in the Bob Hope.

Practical Dream, winner of last month's Desi Arnaz Stakes at Del Mar, worked four furlongs in :47.80. It was the third fastest of 54 moves at the distance. Practical Dream most recently finished sixth in GII Starlet Stakes at Los Alamitos when making her two-turn debut Dec. 7.

Just prior to the cancellation, jockey Francisco Arrieta recorded his 1,000th career win aboard **Eternally Grateful** (American Freedom).

After a significant delay in the start of the first race, Arrieta guided the 4-year-old gelding across the wire for the milestone victory in what was a starter allowance. According to Equibase, the veteran rider earned his first win at the Meadowlands in 2015. Arrieta finished second in the Oaklawn jockey standings last season.

Despite the celebration, the weather became too much of a risk factor and the track made the decision to shelve the remaining nine races on the card. The featured Tinsel Stakes will run Sunday, Jan. 5 with entries taken on Monday, Dec. 30.

Oaklawn said via its X account that, "Due to continuing inclement weather and out of the abundance of caution of our equine athletes and human athletes Oaklawn has decided to cancel today's racing card."

The Sunday post in Hot Springs is set for 1:30 p.m. ET.

FIRST RACE AT GULFSTREAM DECLARED NO CONTEST AFTER RIDER UNSEATED AND SIREN SOUNDS

In the early stages of the Saturday opener at Gulfstream Park, when **Roscoe Village** (Kantharos) unseated jockey Jorge Ruiz, the siren was prompted which caused several riders to pull up their mounts. The race was declared a no contest, according to a press release by the track. All money wagered, including multi-race bets, was refunded.

Scheduled as an optional claimer to go a mile on the turf, the filly in question broke from the 11 hole and appeared to be caught between runners at the rear of the field in the first furlong. Roscoe Village went down, which unseated Ruiz, but she quickly stood up and began to run again. Outriders were able to secure her and she walked off the course.

A FanDuel post on X said that the jockey's location on the grass caused the track's siren to sound and several riders simply stopped. The stewards ruled the race out even though **Steel Lute** (Midnight Lute) went on to win the optional claimer. No purse money was awarded.

Ruiz, who had use of his extremities before entering the ambulance, but reported having soreness and neck pain, was taken to nearby Aventura Hospital for an evaluation and was declared off his mounts for the afternoon.

"We're very happy that Roscoe Village was uninjured, and Jorge Ruiz was not seriously injured thanks to our stewards, jockeys and outriders."

PRACTICAL JOKE'S CAPTAIN COOK ROMPS FOR 'RISING STAR' HONORS AT THE BIG A

Captain Cook (c, 2, Practical Joke--Pow Wow Wow, by Indian Charlie), an eventful sixth on debut for owner/breeder Marylou Whitney Stables and trainer Norm Casse at Churchill Downs Oct. 27, brought \$410,000 from bloodstock agent Steve Young on behalf of St Elias Stable at the Keeneland November Horses of Racing Age Sale (second-most expensive lot of the sale) and ran to the money as the 1-2 favorite for his new connections with a 'TDN Rising Star' performance in the slop at the Big A Saturday.

Captain Cook chased the early leader from second through fractions of :22.43 and :45.30, hit the front at the top of the stretch and opened daylight from there to graduate by a geared-down 9 1/4 lengths. Longshot **Griffin's Wharf** (Constitution) was up for second.

Captain Cook becomes the fourth 'Rising Star' for Practical Joke. He is the most recent produce out of the graded-placed Pow Wow Wow. His third dam is Whitney's 2003 GI Kentucky Oaks heroine and champion 3-year-old filly Bird Town. He hails from the extended female family of GI Belmont Stakes winner Birdstone.

Captain Cook was consigned to Keeneland November by Gainesway, agent for the Estate of John Hendrickson.

Hendrickson, a philanthropist who was the husband of the late Marylou Whitney, died suddenly over the summer in Saratoga. The sale was topped by the 2-year-old filly Alyeska (Vekoma), an eye-catching, come-from-behind debut winner carrying the famed Whitney silks at Churchill Downs Sept. 20. She brought \$675,000 from Young on behalf of an undisclosed client.

Maximus Meridius has kept strong company in 2024, running competitively behind the likes of MGSW/GISP Deterministic (Liam's Map), GISW Book'em Danno (Bucchero) and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint runner up Bentornato (Valiant Minister). Edged out by Valentine Candy (Justify) last time out in the Steel Valley Sprint Stakes at Mahoning Valley Nov. 25, the 3-year-old took on older rivals Saturday and finally broke through as the 2-1 second choice.

Breaking with speed from the middle of the gate, he pressured Toxic Gray (Verrazano) through fractions of :22.35 and :45.75 while in tight with eventual runner up Full Moon Madness around the far turn. Kept wide for the stretch drive, Maximus Meridius just had enough to keep separation to come home narrowly ahead.

"He's always been a very talented horse, and he really hasn't given us everything," said winning trainer Butch Reid, Jr. "[Jockey] Johnny [Velazquez] was really impressed with him--his gallop out was good and strong, and he doesn't think a little further is out of the question either."



Casalu, three times graded stakes-placed since easily winning her July 21 Del Mar debut and earning 'TDN Rising Star' status, snapped a five-race losing streak en route to claiming the Blue Norther Stakes.

Last time out Nov. 30, her first race without blinkers, she finished second behind Will Then (War of Will) in Del Mar's GIII Jimmy Durante Stakes. That familiar foe was scratched out of this race early Saturday. She was the runner-up in the GIII Surfer Girl back in early October, and ran third on the main track in the GIII Sorrento Stakes in her second lifetime start.

Responding well to urging, Casalu remained clear of the rallying pair of Schilflied and 6-5 favorite Supa Speed to record a 1 1/2-length score.





DARK ANGEL DELIVERS FIRST SIRES' CHAMPIONSHIP FOR YEOMANSTOWN STUD



Dark Angel: Britain and Ireland's champion sire of 2024 | ITM

"He's been everything to us," was the sign-off from Gay O'Callaghan in this must-read *TDN* feature from Emma Berry, who had a golden opportunity during the Tattersalls December Sale to sit down with the Yeomanstown Stud patriarch, as well as his sons David, Guy and Robert, to discuss the remarkable story of their homegrown hero, **Dark Angel (Ire)**.

If you're one of the few who haven't read the piece already, then I urge you to correct that misdemeanour before we see in the new year, but first stick with me as we zone in on the most recent chapter in the tale of the 19-year-old Dark Angel, the champion sire of Britain and Ireland for 2024.

The first title for the son of Acclamation (GB) and those who have masterminded his career at Yeomanstown, few would argue that it's not thoroughly deserved. After all, he's now finished on the podium in three of the last five years, having previously finished third behind **Galileo (Ire)** in 2020, before faring best of the rest when **Frankel (GB)** ran away with the spoils in 2023. **Cont. p3**

Slick As Can Be

Little Red Feather Racing, Sterling Stables, and Marsha Naify's **Slick (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) claimed a Santa Anita maiden victory on Dec. 26 (video). Trained by Phil D'Amato, the 2-year-old filly was bred by Newtown Anner Stud in Ireland.

Out of the Dubawi (Ire) mare Shurooq (GB), Slick was sold for €48,000 out of the Goffs Orby Part II Sale as a yearling and ran second on debut at Tipperary for trainer Andy Slattery and Mrs. Rachael Halley. Purchased privately in the interim, the filly was making her fourth lifetime start. Cont. p6

Whilst this maiden championship for Dark Angel wasn't sealed in quite such clear-cut fashion, his healthy advantage today over his closest pursuer is still in stark contrast to the promise of a hard-fought title race we faced back in early October when the top three--**Dubawi (Ire)**, Galileo and Dark Angel in that order--were covered by around £125,000.

Today, the top three remains the same but in a totally different order as Dark Angel sits proudly at the top of the standings, with the earnings of his progeny in Britain and Ireland amounting to over $\mathfrak L4.9$ million, nearly $\mathfrak L500,000$ more than Dubawi who, in turn, is another $\mathfrak L220,000$ clear of Galileo. Whilst there's still a handful of all-weather meetings to be held on these shores, Dark Angel's work for the year is done, allowing him to bask in the glory of a campaign which yielded eight stakes winners in Britain and Ireland.

The undoubted star among them was Charyn (Ire), who turned the tide firmly in his sire's favour when gaining his third Group 1 victory of the campaign in the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes at Ascot. That race was worth £655,709 to the winner and supplemented the £425,325 he'd already pocketed when making the breakthrough at the top level in the Queen Anne Stakes.

Fellow Royal Ascot scorer Khaadem (Ire), who won the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes for the second consecutive year, featured among Dark Angel's other notable performers, along with the G2 York Stakes hero Alflaila (GB) and G3 Summer Stakes winner Flora Of Bermuda (Ire), who later finished third in the G1 Champions Sprint Stakes.

On the international stage, Dark Angel was also represented by the G1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen winner Mad Cool (Ire), while he ended the year ranked fourth on the European sires' table, with Charyn's French exploits, including an emphatic victory in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, giving him another lift in those standings. Incidentally, Charyn has since retired to Sumbe's Haras de Montfort et Preaux and is perhaps Dark Angel's best chance yet of emulating the late Acclamation by making his mark as a sire of sires. Of his other stallion sons, the dual Group 1-winning sprinter Harry Angel (Ire) has made a promising start to his stud career, having found a place among the top 30 in Britain and Ireland for the first time this year, before his fourth crop of

juveniles appear on racecourses in 2025.

Harry Angel stands at Darley's Dalham Hall Stud alongside the champion sire of 2022, Dubawi, who had more stakes winners in Britain and Ireland this year than any other stallion with 16, two more than **Kingman (GB)** and three more than **Frankel**. They were headed by a pair of British Classic winners in Notable Speech (GB), who won twice at the top level in the 2,000 Guineas and Sussex Stakes, and Oaks heroine Ezeliya (Fr). The Group 1-placed two-year-olds Ancient Truth (Ire) and Delacroix (Ire) also offered plenty of promise for the future as the veteran shows no signs of slowing down, despite being about to turn 23 on January 1.

It's now been nearly three and a half years since we lost the 12-time champion Galileo and his final crop, reported to be 13 in number, has so far produced just one winner from those who made it to the track this year. It was a Flat season in which the former Coolmore colossus still reminded us of what we'll be missing, though, with Kyprios (Ire) starring among his 12 stakes winners in Britain and Ireland as he returned to the top of the staying tree in no uncertain terms. He was ably supported by the Yorkshire Oaks heroine Content (Ire) and Jan Brueghel (Ire), who led home a one-two for the stallion in the St Leger, taking him to the unprecedented tally of 101 individual Group/Grade 1 winners worldwide. Juddmonte's Frankel looked the natural successor to his sire as the one likely to dominate the domestic stallion scene after he was crowned champion for the second time in three years in 2023, with over £7 million in progeny earnings. By contrast, the £3.9 million and change his progeny amassed this year was only good enough for fifth spot, his lowest finishing position since he was 12th in 2020. The bright spot in his season was the emergence of the unbeaten two-year-old Lake Victoria (Ire), who was arguably the most exciting juvenile of either sex after she completed a hat-trick of wins at the top level in the Moyglare Stud Stakes, Cheveley Park Stakes and Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. If there is a horse with the potential to propel Frankel back to the top of the rankings in 2025, then this filly looks as likely as any.

Of course, when Frankel won his first championship in 2021, he ended 31 years of dominance for Coolmore, home to the champion sire in Britain and Ireland every year between 1990 and 2020, before the Newmarket neighbours Frankel and Dubawi combined to ensure that the crown stayed in Britain between 2021 and 2023.

It will be no consolation to the team at Coolmore that the title is returning to Ireland this year, and you can be sure that they won't rest until the prize is back in their possession as the search continues apace for the next Galileo, if there could possibly be such a thing. Without an all-conquering force like that in their ranks, the strength in depth at their Tipperary base was the key to their continued success on the racecourse this year, with seven of the top 20 stallions featuring on the Coolmore roster. They included Ashford Stud resident Justify, the sire of Derby hero City Of Troy, who finished 11th despite having considerably fewer runners than every other stallion around him.

Wootton Bassett (GB) is without doubt the coming force at Coolmore's Fethard operation, having produced four individual Group 1 winners from his first crop of Irish-bred juveniles in 2024. It's easy to see him ranking much higher than this year's 14th in 2025 and beyond, as the increased support given to him since his arrival in Ireland starts to deliver more quantity to go with the undoubted quality of his runners. He will also be joined by two of his sons at stud in Ireland in 2025 when Bucanero Fuerte (GB) and King Of Steel kick off their new careers at Tally-Ho Stud.

Of the more long-standing residents at Coolmore, the multiple Classic winners Camelot (GB) and Gleneagles (Ire) both enjoyed banners years in finishing ninth and 14th, respectively. The G1 July Cup hero Mill Stream (Ire), Derby runner-up Ambiente Friendly (Ire) and G2 King Edward VII Stakes winner Calandagan (Ire) starred among six stakes winners for Gleneagles, who also celebrated a Classic winner in Germany when Palladium (Ger) won the G1 Deutsches Derby.

As for Camelot, he too had a Classic winner in Los Angeles (Ire), who was third behind City Of Troy and Ambiente Friendly in the Derby at Epsom, before going two places better in the Irish equivalent at the Curragh. He was also third in the Prix de I'Arc de Triomphe won by the poster girl for their sire in 2024, Bluestocking (GB), who gained her third top-level victory of the year with a dominant performance at Longchamp. With nearly €9m in progeny earnings to his name, Camelot topped the European sires' table ahead of Ballylinch Stud's Lope De Vega (Ire) and Gilltown Stud resident Sea The Stars (Ire).

Lope De Vega, who will be joined at Ballylinch in 2025 by his Prix du Jockey Club-winning son Look De Vega (Fr), finished fourth in Britain and Ireland where he was responsible for 11 stakes winners, including the dual Group 1-winning juvenile Shadow Of Light (GB). Cont. p6

and took sixth spot, with his unbeaten two-year-old The Lion Of Winter (Ire)--a late absentee from the Dewhurst Stakes when due to clash with Shadow Of Light--looking a particularly exciting prospect for 2025.

Tally-Ho stalwart **Kodiac (GB)** topped the British and Irish sires' table by number of individual winners in 2024, but the record which was once his for the most two-year-old winners in a calendar year was lost to his stud-mate, **Mehmas (Ire)**. Mehmas, who counted the top-level scorers Magnum Force (Ire), Scorthy Champ (Ire) and Vertical Blue (Ire) among his record-breaking tally of 70, also had bragging rights over Kodiac when it came to the final standings for progeny earnings, with the pair finishing 12th and 13th, respectively.

Meanwhile, Juddmonte's Kingman, the sire of two new Classic winners in Elmalka (GB) (1,000 Guineas) and Sparkling Plenty (Fr) (Prix de Diane), finished seventh for the fourth consecutive year, while the team at Darley's Kildangan Stud were responsible for two new entries to the top 10 in **Night Of Thunder (Ire)** (eighth) and **Blue Point (Ire)** (10th).

The G1 Irish Champion Stakes winner Economics (GB) was the flagbearer for Night Of Thunder, who also came up with a top-class two-year-old filly in the unbeaten Group 1 scorer Desert Flower (Ire), while second-season sire Blue Point picked up where he left off after a sensational start with his first two-year-olds in 2023. The star of that first crop, Rosallion (Ire), took his Group 1 tally to three with wins in the Irish 2,000 Guineas and St James's Palace Stakes, while the sprinters Big Evs (Ire) and Kind Of Blue (GB) looked cut from the same cloth as their sire when winning the G2 King George Stakes and G1 Champions Sprint Stakes, respectively.

In The Holiday Spirit

The D'Amato barn was in the headlines again with Michael Enright homebred **Eternal Reign (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) just one day later. The daughter of Alwaysandforever (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) broke her maiden at Santa Anita on Dec. 27 (video).

Winless in four Irish starts for Enright and trainers Mick Halford and Tracey Collins, the dark bay was making her first start in the U.S. One of four foals for listed-placed Alwaysandforever (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}), the April-foaled filly was a 180,000gns buy out of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale Book 1. Her juvenile half-brother Aroof (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) has placed, and her dam has a weanling half-brother by Blue Point (Ire). Third dam Russian Snows (Ire) (Sadler's Wells)'s biggest claim to fame was her victory in the G2 Prix de Royallieu, and she was also second in the G1 Irish Oaks.

The Irish National Stud's recently pensioned Invincible Spirit is responsible for 29 winners from 66 runners (44%) in the U.S. His seven stakes winners there (10%) are led by Grade I scorers Digital Age (Ire) and Vale Of York (Ire).

Repeat Winners

Motorious (GB) (Muhaarar {GB}) scampered home a winner in the GII Joe Hernandez Stakes at Santa Anita for Phil D'Amato and owner Anthony Fanticola on Saturday (video). The likeable gelding first featured in the GIII San Simeon Stakes down the hill at Santa Anita last March.

Making Waves Cont.

King Of Gosford (GB) (Zoustar {Aus}), who races for the Benowitz Family Trust, CYBT, Saul Gevertz, Michael Nentwig and Jeremy Peskoff, earned the first graded victory of his career in the GII Mathis Mile Stakes at Santa Anita on Boxing Day (video). The Phil D'Amato trainee has now won five times in America.

Mike Ryan's **Be Your Best (Ire)** (Muhaarar {GB}) added another graded victory to her ledger with a score in the GIII Suwannee River Stakes at Gulfstream on Dec. 21 (video). The Saffie Joseph, Jr.-trained filly won the GIII Long Island Stakes at Aqueduct in November.

Another repeat winner for Making Waves is LSU Stables' **La Mehana (Fr)** (Al Wukair {Ire}). The Via Borghese Stakes went her
way at Gulfstream Park on Dec. 26 (video). The Christophe
Clement trainee first appeared in this column after winning the
GIII Waya Stakes in October.

A Fair Grounds contest went to Making Waves alumni Serving Time (GB) (Without Parole {GB}) on Dec. 22 (chart). She had earned her maiden victory for John Gunther, Eurowest Bloodstock, Borders Racing Stable and trainer Cherie DeVaux last month.

CROIX DU NORD REMAINS UNDEFEATED WITH HOPEFUL TALLY by Heather Anderson

Croix Du Nord (Jpn) (Kitasan Black {Jpn}) maintained his unbeaten record with a two-length victory in the G1 Hopeful Stakes at Nakayama on Saturday. The heavy 4-5 favourite defeated Giovanni (Jpn) (Epiphaneia {Jpn}), who was 1 1/4 lengths to the good of 302-1 longshot Faust Rasen (Jpn) (Mozu Ascot).

Fairly keen through the first turn, the dark bay settled in seventh behind **Jun Asahi Sora (Jpn)** (Isla Bonita {Jpn}) and **Jet**

Magnum (Jpn) (Henry Barows {Jpn}), who battled through fractions of :23.70, :48.70, and 1:13.40. Swooping up into third entering the lane, he took over inside the final 200 metres and stormed clear. Giovanni, who was near the eventual winner for most of the contest, gave determined but futile chase.

"I can't say that the race went exactly as planned, but I had complete faith in him and knew that he would make it through whatever situation he would be in during the race," said jockey Yuichi Kitamura. "It was his first time going right-handed and against a full gate of 18 runners, but I totally believed he would handle that too. His physical condition since his last start had improved and his movement was sharp. I wanted him to finish the last of his 2-year-old starts at a good note so that we would be able to focus on his 3-year-old campaign which now will carry much expectation. I am so grateful for everyone who had supported me which is why I am standing here today as a Group 1 winner and I hope to give my best again next season."

A winner on debut among newcomers in June, the colt added the Tokyo Sports Hai Nisai Stakes, also over 1800 metres, at Tokyo on Nov. 16. Croix Du Nord is now the leading candidate to become the JRA Champion 2-Year-Old Colt.

Pedigree Notes

Shadai stallion Kitasan Black is best known as the sire of globetrotting superstar Equinox (Jpn), as well as G1 Satsuki Shohero Sol Oriens (Jpn). Croix Du Nord is his third Group 1 winner.

The late Cape Cross (Ire) is the broodmare sire of 99 stakes winners and 54 graded/group winners. Saturday's Hopeful Stakes hero is the 21st top-level winner for the son of Green Desert in that sphere.

One of 11 foals, 10 runners and seven winners for G2 Park Hill Stakes heroine and dual Oaks-placed Rising Cross (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), the winner is also a full-sibling to a yearling colt, and a half-sibling to a filly foal by Satono Diamond (Jpn). Cont. p11

His elder half-sister Earthrise (Jpn) (Manhattan Café {Jpn}) was placed in a trio of Japanese Group 3s--the Flower Cup, the Aichi Hai, and the Mermaid Stakes. The extended family features the Derby winners Morston (Fr) (Ragusa {GB}) and Blakeney (GB) (Hethersett {GB}).


