



BARNES ROMPS IN SAN VICENTE

Zedan Racing Stable's **Barnes** (Into Mischief), a \$3.2-million Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling, made it a perfect two-for-two for Bob Baffert with a jaw-dropping performance in Saturday's GII San Vicente Stakes at Santa Anita.

The even-money favorite was placed in a tracking second by Juan Hernandez, gained command approaching the quarter pole and leveled off beautifully in the stretch to win with authority by 5 1/2 lengths. His Baffert-trained stablemate Romanesque (Practical Joke), a debut winner over freshly minted 'TDN Rising Star' Rodriguez (Authentic), rounded out the exacta. Narrow second-choice 'TDN Rising Star' Bullard (Gun Runner), a last-out winner of the GIII Bob Hope Stakes, was third.

Barnes, named after Baffert's longtime right-hand man Jimmy Barnes, made the Hall of Famer's return to Churchill Downs a winning one with a hard-fought debut win going 5 1/2 furlongs beneath the Twin Spires Nov. 27.

Barnes was the first starter for Baffert at the Louisville track since Churchill Downs, Inc. (CDI) on July 19, 2024, announced the lifting of a corporation-imposed three-year suspension that had kept the Hall-of-Fame trainer from racing in the GI Kentucky Derby and at any of CDI's tracks nationwide.

"You just keep him healthy, when you get a good horse, you have to keep him healthy and then everything flows," Baffert said after saddling his 14th San Vicente winner.

SOPHOMORE SPOTLIGHT


In addition to impressive GII San Vicente Stakes winner Barnes (Into Mischief), three other sophomores enjoyed the spotlight in listed stakes races across the country Saturday afternoon. The lowa-bred Cyclone State (McKinzie) collected 10 points on the road to the Kentucky Derby with a dominant wire-to-wire win for trainer Chad Summers in the Jerome Stakes at the Big A. Coal Battle (Coal Front) followed up his victory in the Remington Springboard Mile Stakes with a feel-good tally in the Smarty Jones Stakes at Oaklawn Park, good for 10 points on the road to the Kentucky Derby. He is trained by Lonnie Briley. 'TDN Rising Star' Guns Loaded (Gun Runner), meanwhile, held on to score by a neck for trainer Jose D'Angelo in Gulfstream's Mucho Macho Man Stakes.



"I'm happy for Amr (Zedan), he had to really stretch to get this horse. When you have clientele like that it is everything. This horse looked like that as a yearling, he looks like (broodmare sire) American Pharoah body wise. He has a lot of American Pharoah in him and it worked out."

Baffert continued, "I knew he would run well. I was watching Juan, he knows the horse well and he said he was a little green. But everyone who has worked him says he has another gear in him. They were all a little green and the second out is the most important for all these horses."

Barnes added, "They surprised me and I was honored. I was a little nervous, but it is working out well so far. I had a little bit of a knot in my stomach, but it will only get better after this."

Pedigree Notes:

Barnes becomes the 80th graded winner worldwide for his all-conquering sire Into Mischief. The Kinsman Farm-bred All American Dream (American Pharoah), a maiden of two career starts for Jeffrey Drown and Don Rachel, is also represented by an Essential Quality colt of 2023 and a Flightline filly of 2024. She was bred back to Into Mischief. Barnes's third dam is the classy MGISW Dream Supreme (Seeking the Gold), who produced GISW Majestic Warrior (A.P. Indy). Barnes is bred similarly as promoted GI Kentucky Derby winner Mandaloun (Into Mischief) and G1 Dubai World Cup winner Laurel River (Into Mischief), who are both out of Empire Maker mares.

Chilean import Richi (Chi) (Practical Joke), second while making her North American debut in the Desert Stormer Stakes June 2, went one better off the bench to upset 1-5 favorite and her Bob Baffert-trained stablemate Pleasant (Munnings) in Saturday's GIII Las Flores Stakes at Santa Anita.

Off at odds of 3-1 with the blinkers coming off here, Richi sat a tracking trip in an inside third, shot through an opening along the rail at the top of the stretch and blasted off from there to defeat the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint third-place finisher by 1 1/2 lengths.

Richi made nine starts in her native land, led by wins in the 2023 G1 Alberto Solari Magnasco and G1 Tanteo de Potrancas. She was named champion 2-year-old filly that season.

"She's completely changed since she has been here," Baffert said. "She was really light, and they ran her really long distances. Maybe that was all they had there. Since coming here, I took the blinkers off and she has filled out and changed a lot since August--since Del Mar we freshened her up. She was training really well and I think she will settle and she should be able to go

Practical Joke is responsible for 11 winners at the top level worldwide. Four of them, including Richi, were produced by Scat Daddy mares.



DOWNGRADED SANTA YNEZ STILL OFFERS OAKS POINTS ON SUNDAY

Last year, the Santa Ynez Stakes was issued a downgrade from its Grade III status and tabbed as a listed race for 3-year-old fillies in 2025. However, Kentucky Oaks points remain on the table--10 will be deposited in the winner's account--when the bell rings at Santa Anita on Sunday. The Santa Ynez is now part of 1/ST Racing's 3-Year-Old Filly Series, which is sponsored by Fasig-Tipton.

Made the morning-line favorite at 5-2 is Hronis Racing's **A.Z. Wildcat** (Munnings). The chestnut stalked the pace nicely and ended up breaking her maiden by 1 3/4 lengths at Los Alamitos June 30. Back to work in October, the John Sadler trainee gets the services of jockey Flavien Prat, who incidently has won the Santa Ynez four times over the last six years. The top rider seems poised to take home the Eclipse Award after a banner 2024.

BREED TRUE

Standing in A.Z. Wildcat's way is Reddam Racing's **Look** Forward (Bolt d'Oro). Winning on debut at Del Mar Nov. 8, the filly was in trainer Ben Cecil's care before he sadly passed away. Cecil's one-time protégé Michael McCarthy took over and Look Forward was the runner-up in the GII Starlet Stakes at Los Alamitos Dec. 7.

Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert brings a trio of hopefuls into the Santa Ynez, including \$550,000 Keeneland September grad Howin (Gun Runner). In her first start, the Baoma Corp buy graduated by 3 3/4 lengths on debut at Santa Anita in mid-October. Howin's stablemate Mawu (Blame), who is also owned by the same outfit, is looking to get back on track as she returns to one turn.

The more accomplished Baffert horse is Silent Law (Tiz the Law). Turning in a pair of strong starts in a maiden special weight where she won by 10 lengths at Los Al in late September and in the Anoakia Stakes by 3 1/2 lengths at Santa Anita a month later, the dark bay finished as the runner-up in the Desi Arnaz Stakes at Del Mar Nov. 16.

The runner who wired the Desi Arnaz field that afternoon, Practical Dream (Practical Joke), is drawn in here for trainer Tim Yakteen after she was well-beaten in the Starlet.



RODRIGUEZ A FIRST 'TDN RISING STAR' FOR AUTHENTIC

Newly-turned second season sire Authentic was represented by his first 'TDN Rising Star' Saturday when Rodriguez (c, 3, Authentic--Cayala, by Cherokee Run) opened up on a maiden special weight field at Santa Anita to graduate at second asking.

While only second best behind stablemate Romanesque (Practical Joke) in his debut going 6 1/2 furlongs at Del Mar Nov. 23, the 1-5 favorite clearly relished the stretch out to the mile Saturday. Drawn against the rail, he was ridden for the lead by jockey Juan Hernandez and allowed to dictate terms up front with company from Rank (Honor A.P.) who never let the pacesetter get too comfortable up the backstretch.

By midway around the far turn, it was clear Rodriguez had plenty more to offer as he began to shake off that pressure and, when he swung past the quarter pole, the race was only for second. Under a hands and heels ride, he cruised home a decisive winner to graduate second time out. A strong stretch run got fellow second-time starter Baeza (McKinzie), the younger half-brother to full-siblings Mage (Good Magic) and Dornoch, up for second.

GI Kentucky Derby winner Authentic, a son of Into Mischief, had 24 winners in his first crop--led by stakes-winning Power Connection--while the \$485,000 paid for Rodriguez at Keeneland September in 2023 helped elevate Authentic to leading freshman yearling sire that year. First dam Cayala, though not much of a race mare, has outdone herself in her second career--producing seven foals with all seven seeing the winner's circle led by GIII Southwest Stakes winner One Liner (Into Mischief) and MSW/GISP Provocateur (Into Mischief).

This is the family of GISW Albertus Maximus (Albert the Great) and late sire GISW Daredevil (More Than Ready). Rodriguez is his dam's youngest reported offspring as a return cover to Authentic failed to yield a live foal in 2023 and she also failed to produce when bred to both Practical Joke and Life Is Good for 2024. Hope springs eternal however as she is due back to Authentic for a 2025 full-sibling to Rodriguez.

Already a two-time stakes winner with 10 points on the Road to the Kentucky Derby in his possession, Coal Battle doubled that total Saturday and made it three in a row with a strong win in Saturday's Smarty Jones Stakes at Oaklawn Park.

Clearly a horse that can take his track with him (he's now made six starts over six different surfaces and on slop, mud, grass and fast going), the son of MGSW Coal Front jumped up last time out to upset the Remington Springboard Mile Dec. 13 at odds of 6-1 and secure himself his first 10 points towards Churchill.

Wheeled back here as the 9-2 third choice in his longest distance to date, Coal Battle broke sharply from the far outside gate and was clearly keen to go on with it outside of Mo Quality.

That pair showed the way through moderate fractions with the opening half going in :49.03 as race favorite Kale's Angel joined the fray into the far turn. Shaken up at the quarter pole, Coal Battle responded in kind and came home nicely, padding his advantage to win going away as Mo Quality just edged Kale's Angel for the minor placings. Coal Battle now sits second on the Road the Kentucky Derby leaderboard behind only GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Citizen Bull (Into Mischief).

"Today, he went to the front and was pricking his ears. When he stayed up there, I'm thinking: 'I'm going to steal it, jockey.' He ran big, big," said winning trainer Lonnie Briley. "Every time we run him, he just seems to surprise us. He's a neat little horse. I don't know if it's set in yet [having a Kentucky Derby candidate]. No, it's crazy for the little guy."

One of five stakes winners for Coal Front, Coal Battle is the first foal out of a stakes-placed first dam who has since produced a now 2-year-old Goldencents colt named Golden Mane. Out the fastest and never giving his rivals a chance, Cyclone State picked up an easy 10 points on the Road to the Kentucky Derby with an eye-catching gate-to-wire win in the Jerome Stakes.

Sent to the lead early under Luis Rivera, Jr. despite acting up in the gate, the 3-1 shot never seemed anything but a winner as he posted fractions of :23.43, :47.25, and 1:13.20 as he coasted into the lane with an eight-length advantage.

Kept to business as Omaha Omaha slowly cut into the margin, it was too much too late, and Cyclone State came in 3 1/2 lengths best. Ican got the best of the photo for third.

The victor came into this contest on a two-race win streak which started Nov. 3 over this track when he graduated from the maiden ranks in his fifth try by 2 1/2 lengths. His margin over optional claimers last out Dec. 6 was a similar margin, but with Ican claiming runner-up honors there.

"He's just a special horse. He's a horse we've always been high on," said winning trainer Chad Summers. "He reared up a little bit at the start, but we've learned with him. Nobody goes in the gate with him--he's got a little bit of a funny mouth, he doesn't like that."

"Luis Rivera has worked with him a lot, getting on him in the morning and in the afternoon. He just continues to get better. Obviously, a deep, tiring, heavy track today. The rail didn't look like it was that great. We wanted to get off the rail but kind of got stuck there."

Cyclone State's connections have some discussions in their future as the GIII Withers Stakes with Kentucky Derby qualifying points runs Feb. 1, and the one-turn mile G3 Saudi Derby at King Abdulaziz Racecourse runs Feb. 22 with their horse nominated to the latter.

"He's nominated to Saudi. The '[nominations]' come out on the eighth and I think this will get us an invitation. There's a lot of things to take into consideration at this point. We're going to get him down to Florida [for now]."

"We'll re-group [at Palm Meadows] and gather ourselves and see where we're at. It's a good position to be in with 10 points, but obviously you need at least 40 to go where you want to go. We'll evaluate the options and make the best plan. Obviously, he likes Aqueduct and we're not going to be afraid to ship back up here."

Cyclone State is the second offspring for Chanel's Legacy to gain black-type behind SP Zatara (Audible), who was visiting the winner's circle at Oaklawn Park after the sixth race Saturday not long after his younger brother claimed Kentucky Derby points. Their dam, herself a staple at Hot Springs during her career as she contested the Kentucky Oaks trail on the circuit, has a 2-year-old filly by Blame and a yearling colt by Volatile in the wings. The formal kick to the Florida series saw Guns Loaded hit his mark in the nick of time to take home the 14th rendition of the Mucho Macho Man Stakes at Gulfstream Park on Saturday.

As a juvenile, the colt debuted as the runner-up last August at Saratoga, but he donned cap and gown 2 1/2 months later with an eye-catching performance under the Twin Spires. For his efforts, he was administered the oath as the latest **'TDN Rising Star'** in town.

Sent to trainer Jose D'Angelo's southern base at Palm Meadows, the dark bay arrived as the 6-5 choice here. Guns Loaded blazed out of the gates like it was the O.K. Corral and proceeded to make every pole a winning one. With the field in hot pursuit, the 'Rising Star' drove towards the wire. However, Treaty of Rome was looking to collect his own reward and the bay almost made high noon, but he came up short by a neck.

"I was pretty sure that he was going to be on the lead," said trainer Jose D'Angelo. "I was just afraid that he would go too fast because it was his first time going the mile and from the number one [post] you have to ask a little bit from the gate, but everything worked perfect." **Cont.**

"I worked a little this week at the gate with him...because you have to go in before everybody, wait, and break sharp, and that's what happened."

"Today he looked green again," D'Angelo said. "He ran the first time out in Saratoga and he tried to go inside, and he did the same today. I asked Luis [Saez] about the gallop out and he said when he saw the other horse he got another gear. So that's good, but we have to train him now going forward."

D'Angelo added that the GIII Holy Bull Stakes at Gulfstream Feb. 1 would be the colt's next target.

The winner's dam is responsible for a yearling colt named Rockin N Roastin (Curlin), who went to Flying Dutchman for \$535,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale, and she foaled a filly by Gun Runner last year. A \$450,000 OBS April 2-year-old buy for Up Up & Away Stables, Sky My Sky was entered in Flameaway's book for this term. Guns Loaded's second dam Dark Sky sold to Summer Wind Farm in 2011 for \$1.5 million during Keeneland November and the family includes French MG1SW Nebraska Tornado (Storm Cat) and MG1SW Westover (GB) (Frankel {GB}). Settled off the pace in fifth early, and largely able to avoid the traffic which shut off Love Cervere on the rail entering the first turn, she was patiently handled until the far bend behind: 23.11, :47.51 and 1:11.65 splits. G W's Girl, who won her Sept. 19 turf sprint debut at Delaware Park and finished fifth in Keeneland's Oct. 6 Indian Summer Stakes on turf last season, made a smooth transition to fast dirt when rallying strongly to claim the Mockingbird Stakes.

Showing she handled the main track here with a solid fourfurlong breeze in :48 3/5 on New Year's Eve day, the 5-1 third choice bided her time in fourth during the early going as 36-1 long shot Lady Crush (Liam's Map) rolled through an opening quarter in :21.60. As Lady Crush retreated, the stalking 2-5 favorite 'TDN Rising Star' Shisospicy took over with the forwardly-placed Chatter in pursuit and went three lengths clear approaching the eighth pole. The four-wide G W's Girl was full of run and gradually gaining, reeling in the daughter of Mitole in the late going to prevail by one length.

"She's a classy filly. She showed it today. Surface doesn't matter," said conditioner Greg Compton. "Hopefully, she can stretch out at the mile and a sixteenth next time."

"Actually, what was going through my mind is a just a picture-perfect scenario. We had somebody [Lady Crush] go up and pressure the 7 [Shisospicy] and we were able to sit back and get a nice trip."

Her winning dam is out of El Prado Essence, MGSW-Can, \$890,281 and her dam's half-brother is the Speightstown gelding Essence Hit Man, MGSW-Can & GSP, \$1,414, 689, the champion sprinter in Canada in 2011 and 2012. Essence of Audre, while in foal to Mitole, was hammered to Rancho Monarca for \$10,000 at the recently-completed 2024 OBS Winter Mixed Sale. 

ROSS COAKLEY Q&A: '2024 WASN'T WHAT I HOPED IT WOULD BE - BUT I WILL REGROUP'

We live in a social media era. Be it on Instagram, X or Facebook, nine times out of 10, what people put on the social media platforms is the best version of themselves. That's what made jockey Ross Coakley's post for the new year so refreshing on Facebook.

The Irishman has partnered almost 150 winners since moving to Britain in 2021. But unhappy with last year's tally of 33 wins and 328 rides, which was down from 47 wins and 375 rides in 2023, he spoke openly about how 2024 represented a disappointment on a professional front at least.

Make no mistake, Coakley is not complaining about his lot. Instead, he simply pointed out that not everything has to be perfect on social media, and his post may well have resonated with others who may not have knocked it out of the park last year.

The 30-year-old expands on his reasoning for moving to Britain in the first place, goals for 2025 and much more in this week's Q&A. Cont. p3

MAN CITY OWNER SHEIKH MANSOUR BUYS HARAS DE FRESNAY LE BUFFARD IN €28-MILLION DEAL

Manchester City owner Sheikh Mansour bin Zayed al-Nahyan, through his Al Wathba Stud, purchased Haras de Fresnay le Buffard and surrounding environs for a reported €28 million late last year. The transaction was confirmed by Mansour's lawyer Edouard Vitry on New Year's Eve.

Included in the transaction are approximately 240 hectares of land with over 200 hectares devoted to lush pastures. The primary 16-room chateau was renovated in 2015. Around 12 hectares are parkland, in addition to two more luxury residences--La Haute Cole and La Belle Etoile--also on the property. An additional 23 supplementary dwellings to accommodate staff and visiting guests are also part of the deal.

BS: You were refreshingly honest on Facebook in discussing how your year went. What led to you writing that post as I am sure it resonated with plenty of people?

RC: Sometimes these things cross your mind and more times you don't bother posting. But, do you know what? I decided to post it because I thought it might resonate with some people. Being honest about these things when you can is important. I wrote that Facebook post in about three minutes because it was honest. When you are speaking the truth, you barely have to think about it. We live in an era where everyone is putting the best version of themselves on social media. I wanted to put a post up for the end of the year but, when I looked back on all of my winners, there wasn't anything that jumped out to me. That's why I decided to be honest and say that 2024 wasn't exactly what I had hoped it would be. It was one of those years where the tally of winners was disappointing but all you can do is regroup and put the head down for 2025. I am going to Dubai in a couple of weeks and the hope would be that I would pick up

some rides. I am looking forward to that. When I come back from that, it will be early February and the Flat season proper will almost be upon us at that point.

You said in the post that it wasn't a great year on the track for you. Okay, your numbers took a dip on previous seasons, but 33 winners from 328 rides and over £360,000 in prize-money is not bad by any means.

There are two ways of looking at it. You could be somebody who gets a lot of rides and, while you don't get a lot of winners, you're making an income through the riding fee. But from my point of view, last year represented a drop-off and, as a jockey, you're always hoping to keep building. The fact that it dropped off was disappointing. You want it to go back in an upward curve and can't afford for it to drop again because there is a lot of sacrifice and work involved to keep the show on the road over here. There is a lot of racing and your work-life balance takes a little bit of a hit in Britain compared to Ireland so you need to be getting the results on the track to justify the sacrifices.

It might be a bit of an intrusive question but what sort of numbers would you need to be hitting in order to make a good living riding in Britain? Cont. p4



Ross Coakley Q&A Cont.

RC: There's no magic number. The truth of it is, I made quite an okay living last year. But your expenses are a lot higher in Britain as you are spending a lot of time on the road so fuel, hotels and all of that kind of stuff adds up. You have to try and cover a much greater area compared to in Ireland. A lot of Flat jockeys are based in Newmarket but I suppose, the way my contacts developed, I am split between Newmarket and Lambourn. I am covering more ground than most people would be. I don't mind that, it just means my expenses will be higher than most people. I cover my bills but, equally, for the sacrifices you make, you'd want to be rewarded to justify it. For me, that's more than 33 winners a year. If you are riding 50 winners and getting in the region of 500 rides in a season, you'll make a very good living. There's probably more of a platform at that level over here than there is in Ireland. It's also interesting that, back in Ireland, a lot of jockeys' income is split between riding out in the mornings and riding in races. Because the volume of racing is much greater over here, there isn't the same scope to ride out in a yard in the mornings, therefore it would be hard to justify earning a wage in a yard where you're required to ride out every morning. So basically, your income is more or less your riding fee and whatever prize-money you manage to earn in a season. Some jockeys get sponsorship deals as well but they are becoming a bit more difficult to secure.

On the whole, the move to Britain has been a good fit for you as the rides did seem to dry up in Ireland.

I suppose my hand was forced a little bit in that if John Oxx didn't retire I probably never would have moved over here. When John Oxx retired, I had invested the previous few years of my career there, so I was left without a base when he called time on his career. The way it is in Ireland, there are only so many seats at every table and, when you are not on the table, it's very hard to get in. That was my reasoning at the time for making the move. When I moved over initially, which was the middle of the summer in 2021, I based myself with Hugo Palmer, who at the time was based in Newmarket. Things were in full flow over here and, as a result, people were into their own rhythm as to what jockeys they were using so it took me a bit of time to get a foothold. Rod Millman was integral in giving me some early opportunities and I spent a lot of time riding at the South Western tracks. That's where I got a bit of momentum and that's where I made some connections in Lambourn as I used to break up my trips to Chepstow and places like that by going in to ride for as many people as I could. Towards the end of my first season here, I got the opportunity to go in and ride work for Simon and Ed Crisford and that gave me a solid base to kick on from. Cont. p5

Ross Coakley Q&A Cont.

BS: You're still relatively young for a Flat jockey at 30 years of age. You said that 33 winners does not necessarily reward the sacrifices that you make. So what is it that you're hoping to get out of the game?

I am sure everyone feels they are not being rewarded for their efforts at certain times in this business. Also, this is a game where, no matter what you achieve, you will always want more. I think that's just the nature of the beast. I don't like setting targets because I don't think it's something you have any great control over. Me riding 10, 40 or 80 winners is not a reflection of my ability. It's more of a reflection of what luck I got along the way, the momentum I built up or what horses I managed to get on at the right time. I'm still the same rider and I feel like I have improved every year. Having served my apprenticeship in Ireland, I have built up plenty of experience and I have plenty of confidence in my ability in that regard. I did come into last season hoping I would hit the 50-winner mark. I have had a few Listed winners since moving over here as well and the hope is that you'd get more opportunities on the Saturdays. You want to be riding at the meetings that are on terrestrial television. That didn't materialise last year but it's a competitive field and there are so many good jockeys over here, nothing is going to be handed to you. You just have to control what you can control. After that, you just hope the results will look after themselves over a period of time.

In terms of mindset, it's all very well when things are going good. But when they are not, how do you keep positive and hungry?

From my point of view, the biggest sacrifice for me is my weight, because I am tall for a Flat jockey. There are very few blank days over here so you have to be very consistent with your weight in order to keep on top of it. If you were to let it slip at all, it would be very hard to get it back because you just don't have the time. Even when you have a quiet week, you just don't know what's around the corner so it's something I try to keep on top of all the time. That's the toughest thing for me.

Three Listed winners and a Group 3 success were added to your CV since you moved to Britain. I know you were disappointed about last year's tally but, you're clearly riding a better calibre of horse since you moved to Britain, and on the whole, I'd say you have no regrets?

Absolutely, I don't regret anything about the past three years. I am 30 now and, realistically, we'll see what happens. You never

know what is around the corner and you'd always be looking ahead to see what the next chapter might be. It's something I am not afraid to talk about. You should always be prepared for life after being a jockey because, at the end of the day, an injury could force your hand in the morning. There were times when I was hell-bent on not even thinking about life outside of being a jockey. But there is a certain amount of freedom in accepting that there will be life after my time being a jockey. And that's healthy.

Have you thought about what the next chapter might be?

I would love the idea of training. Whether that's realistic in the current climate is another thing as you need so much capital and it would be hard to do it without a backer. I would also be open to something in the media. There are a lot of different avenues I could go down eventually but, for the time being at least, I am fully concentrated on the riding and we are going to give this year a good crack.

Klaravich Stables' Relative Value (GB) (Blue Point {Ire}) became the latest horse to join the Making Waves ranks with a half-length debut victory at Tampa Bay Downs on Jan. 3 (video). Trained by Chad Brown, the son of Blind Faith (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}) was bred by Ickworth Stud.

Sold by Ballyphilip Stud to Mike Ryan on behalf of Seth Klarman's operation for 310,000gns out of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale Book 1, the colt was originally an 87,000gns weanling buy for that consignor during the 2022 December Foal Sale in that same ring.

The winner is the last reported foal and third winner from three foals for his winning dam, herself a half-sister to dual stakes winner Gabrial (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}), placed in the G2 Celebration Mile, G2 Bet365 Mile and in the G3 Diomed Stakes.

Darley's Blue Point has now sired 50% winners to runners (4/8) in the U.S. with Relative Value his fourth scorer there. Leading the charge for the son of Shamardal is GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint hero Big Evs (Ire), while Raqiya (Ire) won the GIII Goldikova Stakes.

Expert Eye Filly Captures Fair Grounds Affair

Pura Vida Investments' **Out Too Late (GB)** (Expert Eye {GB}) graduated at Fair Grounds on Jan. 4 (video). Trained by Michael Maker, the bay was bred by Genesis Green Stud, and sold for 120,000gns to agent Deuce Greathouse on behalf of Pura Vida 2022 out of Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale from the draft of her breeder.

The daughter of the stakes-placed Miss Atomic Bomb (GB) (Intikhab) is the third foal and first winner for her dam. Out Too Late is followed by a 3-year-old Sea The Moon (Ger) half-brother named Moonlight Bomb (GB) who has yet to race.

Stallion Expert Eye now resides in South Africa, and he has accounted for five winners from eight runners in America (63%). A trio of fillies have been placed at stakes level there anchored by Beautifulnavigator (Ire), Isabel Alexandra (Ire), and Violet Gibson (Ire).

Repeat Winners

The multiple stakes winner **Ozara (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) first featured in Making Waves in 2023 and was back in the winner's circle on Friday (video). Placed at Grade III level, the 4-year-old filly races for Cheyenne Stable and trainer Christophe

Clement.

Gulfstream's Abundantia Stakes was won by Making Waves alum Just A Care (Ire) (Australia {GB}) at the end of December (video). The Brian Lynch trainee races in the silks of Victoriam Farm, LLC.

DEUTSCHES DERBY HERO SISFAHAN SETTLES IN AT HARAS DE LONGECHAUX

German Derby winner **Sisfahan (Fr)** (Isfahan {Ger}) will stand at Haras de Longechaux in France beginning this year. His fee has been set at €2,800. *Jour de Galop* first reported the news.

A rare paternal descendant of Mill Reef (GB), the Darius Racing and Michael Motschmann runner enjoyed his biggest day in the sun in the 2021 G1 Deutches Derby and was also a Group 2 winner in Italy for Henk Grewe. Through five seasons of racing, Sisfahan was placed three more times at the highest level in Germany, and he also ran third in the 2024 G2 Dubai City Of Gold in Dubai. Sisfahan was retired after finishing unplaced in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic behind Rebel's Romance (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) last March. His record stands at 18-3-5-3 and \$848,831 in earnings. Cont. p7
